Dear Parishioners,

Amazing Family Tradition:

Isaac Ole had heard from his grandmother stories of an incredible tradition in their family. It seems that his father, grandfather, and great-grandfather had all been able to walk on water on their 21st birthdays. On that special day, they would walk across the lake to the boat club for their first legal drink. So when Isaac's 21st birthday arrived, he and his friend Sven took a boat out to the middle of the lake. Ole stepped out of the boat and nearly drowned! Sven barely managed to pull him to safety.

Furious and confused, Ole went to see his grandmother. "Grandma," he asked, "it's my 21st birthday, so why can't I walk across the lake like my father, his father, and his father before him?" Granny looked into Ole's eyes with a broad smile and said, "Because your father, grandfather, and great-grandfather were born in January when the lake is frozen, and you were born in hot July!"

Well, I was born in August, and I certainly won't be trying to walk on water! I want to take this opportunity once again to thank all of you who made my birthday special with your presence and by sharing in the joyous celebration.

Special Days in August and September:

August 26 marks the birthday of Mother Teresa of Kolkata, while her heavenly birthday, noted in the Roman Calendar, falls on September 5. We also look forward to celebrating the Nativity of Our Blessed Mother Mary on September 8, although this year, it coincides with a Sunday, meaning the Sunday liturgy takes precedence.

What is the significance of the Nativity of Mary? It is one of the only three birthdays celebrated on the Church's liturgical calendar: the Nativity of Our Lord (December 25), the Nativity of His Forerunner, John the Baptist (June 24), and the Nativity of His Mother, Mary (September 8).

This celebration is particularly important within the Indian Catholic community. The devotion to the Nativity of Mary has existed since the mid-sixteenth century and is attributed to three miraculous events: the apparition of the Madonna and Child to a shepherd boy, the healing of a handicapped buttermilk vendor, and the rescue of Portuguese sailors from a deadly sea storm.

Pope John XXIII elevated the Marian shrine associated with these events to the status of a minor basilica in 1962, referring to it as "the Lourdes of the East" due to the large influx of pilgrims. What began as a modest chapel built by the Portuguese has grown into a complex of three large churches, one of which can accommodate 15,000 people at a time. The annual novena celebrated here draws nearly 5 million pilgrims each year.

MEDITACION DEL EVANGELIO



Hace un par de domingos, en el capítulo 6 del Evangelio de San Juan, escuchamos el relato sobre la multiplicación de los panes y los peces; y a Jesús que se presenta como Pan de vida que ha bajado del cielo y nos alimenta para nuestra jornada de vida. Hoy, regresamos a Marcos que nos habla sobre la verdadera pureza del alma y del corazón. Y de cómo Jesús les llamaba la atención a los fariseos y maestros de la Ley que lo retaban con preguntas basadas en la ley: "¿Por qué tus discípulos no respetan la tradición de los ancianos, sino que comen con manos impuras?" Jesús, les responde con lo que Isaías profetizaba: "Este pueblo me honra con los labios, pero su corazón está lejos de mí. El culto que me rinden de nada sirve; las doctrinas que enseñan no son más que mandatos de hombres" (Marcos 7:5-7). Enseguida de este mensaje, Jesús advierte que nada que entra de fuera mancha al ser

humano, sino lo que sale del corazón. Es decir, que todo lo malo se planea desde la mente y el corazón. ¿Cómo puedo aplicar a mi vida el Evangelio de hoy? ¿Cuáles son mis intenciones al relacionarme con mi familia? ¿Son sinceras y honestas? Pidamos al Señor en esta Eucaristía que nos dé un corazón con buenas intenciones y que busquemos hacer solo lo que agrada a Dios. El Salmo nos dice: ¿Quién será grato a los ojos del Señor? Miremos a nuestro alrededor; será quien cumple los mandamientos, quien acepta su Palabra y la pone en práctica; quien promueve la paz, y quien cuida la casa común, por mencionar algunos ejemplos.

LA ENSEÑANZA CATOLICA SOBRE EL TRABAJO

Pregunta: Ahora que celebramos el Día del Trabajo, ¿puede hablarme sobre la enseñanza católica sobre el trabajo?

Respuesta: Uno de los principios más importantes de la enseñanza social católica es la dignidad del trabajo y los derechos de los trabajadores. Cuatro encíclicas abordan esta enseñanza social fundamental: Rerum Novarum (1891) de León XIII, Quadragesimo Anno (1931) de Pío XI, Laborem Exercens (1981) y Centesimus Annus (1991) de Juan Pablo II. Abordan tanto la teología como la dignidad del trabajo. En el Génesis, Dios toma la iniciativa en la creación del mundo, llamando a los seres humanos a ser fieles administradores de la

creación. De este modo, estamos formados para participar en la continua actividad creativa de



Dios al asociarnos con Él para terminar el mundo y ayudar a llevarlo a su finalización y cumplimiento. Desde esta perspectiva, el trabajo puede entenderse espiritualmente en términos de participar en la actividad continua de Dios para construir, crear y transformar el mundo. Los seres humanos son cocreadores con Dios. Esta vocación exige autodisciplina. Además de un ejercicio de autodisciplina, el trabajo es también el medio por el cual nos desarrollamos y nos realizamos. En el trabajo, moldeamos el mundo y nuestro entorno. A través del trabajo, también nos moldeamos a nosotros mismos. El Papa Juan Pablo II resumió este punto en Laborem Exercens #6: "el valor del trabajo no es principalmente el tipo de trabajo que se realiza, sino el hecho de que quien lo realiza es una persona". El Día del Trabajo ofrece una excelente oportunidad para reflexionar sobre cómo vemos el trabajo a la luz de nuestra enseñanza social católica.
