Dear Parishioners,

One old lady went to the court for divorce. She complained that her husband is giving her mental and psychological torture. The judge asked to explain. And she said, "Whatever comes to his mind he speaks to me and I listen and when I start speaking, he takes off his hearing aid."

In today's fast-paced world, our greatest challenge may be that we are too busy to hear Jesus. We become so preoccupied with earning a living that we don't have time to truly live in the homes we work so hard to afford. We are so focused on our jobs that we often miss out on precious moments with our children and families. Life seems to be racing by, and we seldom take the time to slow down and reflect.

In today's Gospel, we witness a profound moment of healing as Jesus encounters a man who is deaf and has a speech impediment. With great compassion, Jesus takes the man aside, away from the crowd, touches his ears, and his tongue, and says, "Ephphatha," meaning "Be opened." Immediately, the man's ears are opened, his speech becomes clear, and he begins to speak plainly.

This miracle is more than just a physical healing; it is a powerful symbol of the spiritual healing that Jesus offers to each of us. The word "Ephphatha" is an invitation to open our hearts and minds to the presence of God in our lives. In a world where we can be overwhelmed by noise, distractions, and the pressures of daily life, we too are called to let Jesus open our ears to hear His voice and our tongues to proclaim His love.

As we reflect on this Gospel, let us ask ourselves: What areas of our lives need to be opened to God's grace? Are there moments where we are spiritually deaf, unable to hear the gentle promptings of the Holy Spirit? Are there times when we hesitate to speak of our faith and the goodness of God?

Let us pray today for the courage to allow Jesus to touch and heal us, so that we may be open to His word and be His witnesses in the world. May we, like the man in the Gospel, experience the transformative power of Christ, and proclaim with joy the wonders He has done for us.

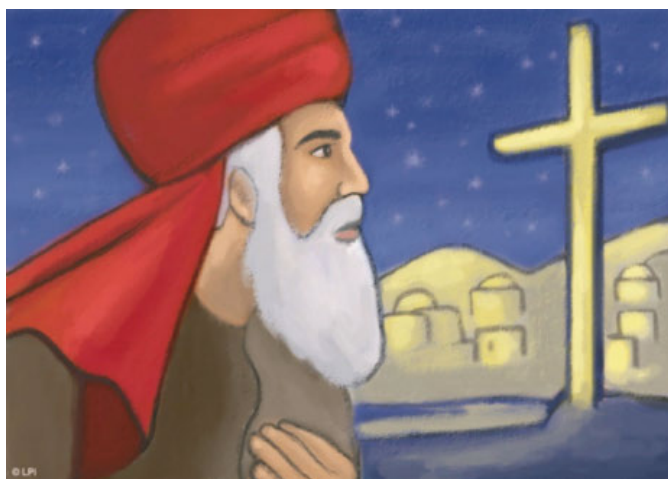

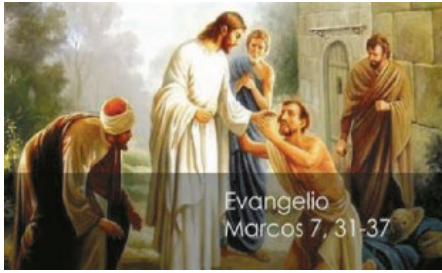

**EXALTACION DE LA SANTA CRUZ**

**Pregunta:** ¿Cuál es la historia detrás de la fiesta de la Exaltación de la Santa Cruz?

**Respuesta:** Se le atribuye a la madre del emperador Constantino, Helena, el descubrimiento de la verdadera cruz alrededor del año 330. Viajó a Tierra Santa y descubrió los lugares asociados con la vida de Jesús. La leyenda dice que Helena descubrió tres cruces, pero no pudo detectar la verdadera cruz hasta que cada una de ellas fue colocada sobre un leproso. Solo una de ellas curó al leproso, lo que demostró que era la verdadera cruz. Se construyó una gran iglesia en el lugar y pronto varias partes de la cruz fueron enviadas a otras iglesias como reliquias para ser veneradas. El día después de la dedicación de la Iglesia del Santo Sepulcro, el 14 de septiembre de 335, la cruz real fue exhibida para veneración. Egeria, una mujer que viajó a Jerusalén alrededor del año 386, mantuvo un diario que ha sobrevivido. En ella se habla de la veneración singular que se le daba al madero de la cruz el Viernes Santo, algo que se mantiene ritualmente hasta nuestros días. La Exaltación de la Santa Cruz se centra en el don de amor que Jesús manifestó con su don total de sí mismo, ofrecido por todos. La cruz, la forma suprema de la pena capital en su época, se ha convertido para nosotros en el símbolo supremo del amor y del triunfo sobre el mal y la muerte.

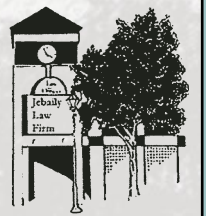
