Dear Parishioners,

As we enter the month of November, the Church invites all Catholics to remember and pray for our departed brothers and sisters. November is traditionally known as the "Month of the Holy Souls," a time when we pay special attention to praying for those who have gone before us.

This practice is rooted in the Church's deep understanding of the Communion of Saints—the spiritual connection between the faithful on earth, the souls in Purgatory, and the saints in heaven. As members of this great Communion, we are called to support one another through prayer, particularly for those who have died and may still be in need of purification before entering the fullness of God's presence.

The Church encourages us to perform acts of prayer, penance, and charity during this month:

- **Visit Cemeteries:** A visit to a cemetery to pray for the dead is a powerful tradition. The Church grants a plenary indulgence for those who visit a cemetery and pray for the departed during the first eight days of November. This indulgence can be applied to the souls in Purgatory. Please join the Legion of Mary members who have a plan in this month to visit the cemetery to pray for the dead.
- **All Souls' Day:** November 2 is All Souls' Day, a special day of prayer for all the faithful departed. Consider attending Mass and lighting a candle for your loved ones who have passed away.
- **Mass Intentions:** Offering a Mass for the repose of a soul is one of the greatest acts of charity. In our Catholic faith, the Holy Mass holds a central and irreplaceable role when it comes to praying for the deceased. The Church has always emphasized that the greatest and most effective way to pray for our departed loved ones is through the offering of the Holy Mass. You are encouraged to request a Mass intention for your deceased loved ones, asking for God's mercy upon them.
- **Prayers and Devotions:** Simple prayers like the "Eternal Rest" prayer—*"Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen."*—are powerful ways to support the souls in Purgatory. The Rosary and other devotions can also be offered for the deceased.

By praying for the dead, we fulfill a work of mercy and express our faith in the resurrection and eternal life. Let us take this November as an opportunity to renew our commitment to praying for our loved ones and all the souls who await the joy of heaven. May our prayers be a source of comfort and peace, both to those who have passed away and to us who remain, as we trust in God's loving mercy and look forward to the day when we will all be reunited in His eternal embrace. That will be the great family reunion once again in the presence of God our Almighty Father.

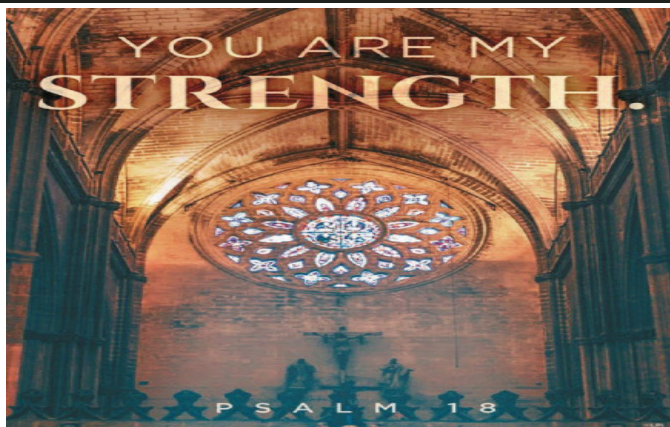

### MEDITACION DEL EVANGELIO:

Los mandamientos del Señor rebosan sabiduría, derraman alegría y eficacia en la vida de la persona al ser cumplidos dignamente. Él nos los ha dado para ser felices en esta vida y a la vez poder llegar a la eternidad: guárdalos, y lo más importante ponlos en práctica, para tener una felicidad y paz interior completa. El libro del Deuteronomio nos dice cómo se le debe de inculcar a los hijos e hijas este mandato de Dios: “Repíteselos a tus hijos, habla de ellos tanto en casa como cuando estés de viaje, cuando te acuestes y cuando te levantes” (Deuteronomio 6:7). ¿Haces eso en familia? ¿Hablas de los mandamientos en casa? ¿Sabes cuántos son y cuál es el más importante? Jesús nos lo recuerda hoy en su Evangelio. Nos dice que el primero de los mandamientos consiste sencillamente en reconocer la fe a un único Dios y de amarlo con todo nuestro ser y corazón. También, recuerda que este mandamiento existe ya desde el Antiguo Testamento, como se escucha en la primera lectura de hoy. Por eso cuando uno de los maestros de ley se adelanta y pregunta a Jesús cual mandamiento es el primero de todos, la respuesta fue la siguiente: “El Señor nuestro Dios es el único Señor. Amarás al Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma, con toda tu inteligencia y con todas tus fuerzas”. Y agrega Jesús, “Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo” (Marcos 12:29-31). Son los mandamientos mayores. Pidamos al Señor que nos dé cómo amar más a nuestro prójimo, que es el más próximo a mí. Es decir, la familia y el vecino.
