Ordinary Time and the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

Dear Parishioners,

This week marks a significant transition in the liturgical calendar as we begin Ordinary Time on Monday, 13 January. This season will continue until Tuesday, 4 March, the day before Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. Ordinary Time will resume after the Easter season on Monday, 9 June, following Pentecost. During this period, the weekday readings follow Cycle I in the Lectionary.

Additionally, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity begins on Saturday, 18 January, inviting us to join in prayer and reflection for unity among all Christians.

Today, on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we reflect on the grace of our own baptism. The second reading from the Letter to Titus reminds us of God's saving grace: "When the goodness and loving kindness of God our Saviour appeared, he saved us, not because of any works of righteousness that we had done, but according to his mercy, through the water of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit" (Titus 3:4-5).

This highlights the meaning of grace—G-R-A-C-E: God's Riches At Christ's Expense. Salvation is a gift freely given by God, not earned through our deeds. Through baptism, God forgives our sins and welcomes us as His beloved children. The word **BAPTISM** can be understood through the acronym **RICE**, illustrating its profound significance:

- R for Rebirth: Through baptism, we are cleansed of original sin and reborn as children of God by water and the Holy Spirit.
- I for **Initiation**: Baptism initiates us into full membership in the Church, the community of God's children.
- C for Consecration: Baptism consecrates us to live as God's servants, dedicating ourselves to His will and the mission of spreading His kingdom.
- E for Empowerment: The Holy Spirit strengthens and equips us with the grace to reject evil and live as faithful followers of Christ.

As we celebrate this feast, may we renew our gratitude for the gift of baptism and strive to live out its call to holiness, service, and unity. Let us also pray for all who will receive this sacrament, that they may fully embrace their new life in Christ.

"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:17). May these words inspire us to live as beloved sons and daughters of God.





(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC – BENEATH THE SURFACE

When I was seventeen, I wasn't sure that I wanted to be confirmed. It was a rough period in my life, and I was having some intense questions and doubts. It upset my mother, understandably. She knew that, at such a pivotal and difficult moment, I needed the grace of the sacrament more than ever. So, she called our priest and asked him to talk to me.

After that meeting, I made the decision to be confirmed.

To be honest, I can't remember anything he said to me. All I remember is that he sat with me. He listened to me. He let me talk and talk and talk (and cry). And when he said whatever he said, whatever it is that I cannot remember, it was obvious that he had listened to me.

Reading today's Gospel, it makes perfect sense that everyone thought John the Baptist was the Messiah. He was the guy pouring the water. Of course it seemed natural that he would be "the one." The one they were all waiting for.

But instead, the Messiah was the man who came to be baptized. He was the one who descended into the waters, submerging himself in our experience of death and pain and sorrow — and in doing so, he sanctified it. He made it a means of redemption.

Jesus is our Savior, yes. When we dig ourselves a hole of sin and confusion and we can't climb out, he is the one who brings us back to the surface. But he doesn't pull us out; he lifts us. He jumps down into the pit. He looks around. He offers his hand, gives us a leg up, and by his strength and not our own, we are brought back into the light.
