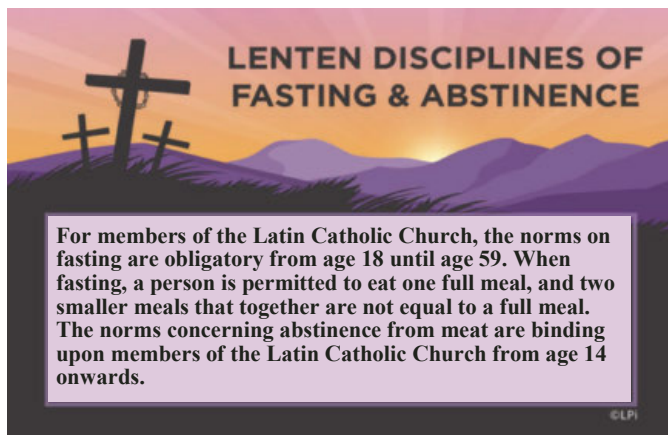

Dear Parishioners

In today’s second reading from Paul’s Letter to the Philippians, we are reminded of our true identity as Christians: “Our citizenship is in heaven” (Philippians 3:20). Just as the Philippians lived as Roman citizens in Macedonia, we, too, are called to live as citizens of heaven in the midst of the world. This means that our first allegiance is to God’s kingdom and His laws, even as we navigate the realities of earthly life.

To live as citizens of heaven is to reject the world’s standards of fortune, fame, power, and pleasure, and instead embrace the way of Christ—the way of the cross. Paul warns against becoming “enemies of the cross of Christ” (Philippians 3:18) by setting our minds on earthly things. Lent is a time to reorient our hearts toward the values of God’s kingdom and stand firm in our faith, resisting the temptation to conform to worldly ways.

This Sunday’s Gospel of the Transfiguration of Jesus (Luke 9:28-36) teaches us profound lessons about transformation and divine glory:

1. The Holy Mass as our source of transfiguration – Just as Jesus was transfigured before Peter, James, and John, the Eucharist transforms the bread and wine into Christ’s Body and Blood, strengthening us in our journey of faith. Each Holy Communion should renew us, helping us to overcome temptations and grow in holiness.
2. The sacraments as moments of transformation – Through baptism, we become children of God; through confirmation, we receive the Holy Spirit’s strength; through reconciliation, we are restored to grace. Each sacrament brings about a change, drawing us closer to our heavenly calling.
3. A message of encouragement and hope – The Transfiguration foreshadows the glory that awaits us in heaven. In times of suffering and doubt, we must remember that our trials will lead to victory in Christ. The Father’s voice at the Transfiguration—“This is my beloved Son, listen to Him”—invites us to trust in Jesus, even in the darkest moments of our lives.

As we continue our Lenten journey, may we seek a true change of heart, embracing our heavenly identity and walking in the way of the cross. Let us offer our sacrifices and prayers with renewed faith, knowing that by sharing in Christ’s sufferings, we will also share in His glory.

May this season of Lent transform us into faithful citizens of heaven, living in the light of Christ’s love.

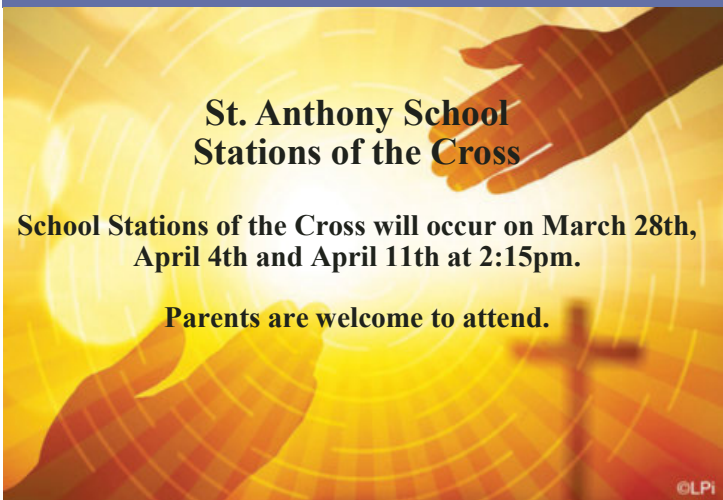

### Taizé, Explained!

Taizé originated in France during World War II. It takes its name from the small town just southeast of Paris where Brother Roger Schutz, a Swiss Protestant, founded the community in the hopes of serving both Christian and Jewish refugees of the German-occupied country.

In the years following World War II, Christian men from various traditions — Catholic and Protestant — came to live at Taizé and participate in Brother Roger’s vision of ecumenism, social justice and peace, eventually forming a community of about 80 brothers from nearly 30 countries.

Today, Taizé continues to be a place of pilgrimage, particularly for young people, who visit the community in the tens of thousands each year.

Taizé has also become well-known for its style of music and prayer, which emphasizes silence, contemplation and stillness. Taizé devotees have carried its music and traditions to Catholic and Christian communities throughout the world.

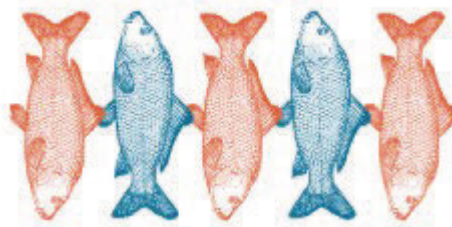

# **“Our Pilgrimage of Hope” Lenten Mission**

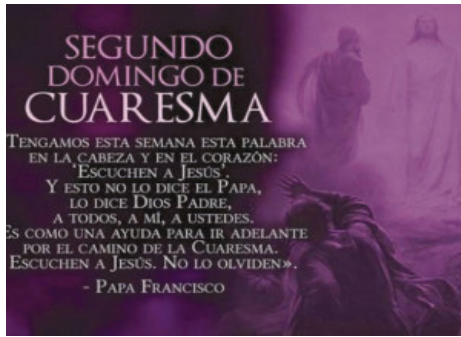

From March 17 through 19, Sister Pamela Smith, SSCM will offer our Lenten Mission. Each evening we will consider aspects of the 2025 jubilee proclaimed by Pope Francis: “Pilgrims of Hope.” We will consider: Pilgrimages, Literal and Spiritual (Monday); Biblical Pilgrims as Models (Tuesday); Resurrection Hope: The Pilgrimage to Our Destiny (Wednesday). After the morning Masses on Tuesday and Wednesday Sister Pam will offer some short reflections.

Sister Pam Smith is familiar to us. She spoke about our patron saint during our celebration of St. Anthony last June. She has been a columnist for the Catholic Miscellany for 10 years and is the author of 17 books, most recently “The History of the Diocese of Charleston: State of Grace” (History Press, 2020) and “How We Can Suffer Our Sorrow” (ACTA Publications, 2023). Sister Pam currently serves our diocese in ecumenical and interfaith ministry and as a teacher of theology for our permanent diaconate formation program, which is directed by Deacon Regi Armstrong.

**MEDITACION DEL EVANGELIO****“LA TRANSFIGURACION”**

¿Dónde está la presencia cercana y misteriosa de Dios en mi vida? ¿Dónde palpo esa relación de Jesús amigo cercano a mí? Estas preguntas nos pueden ayudar a comprender el misterio de la Transfiguración de este segundo Domingo de Cuaresma. Pedro, Santiago y Juan fueron testigos oculares de una presencia de Dios diferente a la que vivían todos los días con Jesús. De alguna manera, con esta experiencia se abren sus ojos y reconocen que con Jesús está presente el mismo Dios. Es por eso, que, Pedro desea quedarse para siempre en ese lugar: “Maestro, ¡qué bueno que estemos aquí! Levantemos tres chozas: una para ti, otra para Moisés y otra para Elías. Pero no sabía lo que decía” (Lucas 9:33).

Hoy es un día para abrir los ojos y dimensionar la grandeza de este gran evento en la vida de los discípulos, y también, en la vida nuestra. Jesús se transfigura para ellos en el monte y para nosotros se transfigura en cada Eucaristía, donde el pan se transforma en el Cuerpo de Jesús y el vino en su Sangre. Sin embargo, sin los ojos de la fe, no nos daremos cuenta de la presencia real de Cristo entre nosotros. Pensemos, en ¿qué otros momentos Jesús se ha transformado ante nosotros y hemos descubierto la presencia misteriosa de Dios? El Papa Francisco nos ayuda con lo siguiente: “El Padre proclama a Jesús su Hijo predilecto, diciendo: Escuchadlo. No podemos olvidarnos de escuchar a Jesús”. ©LPi

**LECTURA DE CUARESMA**

**Pregunta:** ¿Puedes recomendar algunos buenos libros para la lectura espiritual de Cuaresma?

**Respuesta:** En más de una ocasión, a un entrenador que está siendo entrevistado sobre su equipo, exitoso o no, se le preguntará sobre el siguiente paso. La respuesta inevitable incluye algo sobre volver a lo básico. Repasar los fundamentos del deporte fortalece el rendimiento y genera confianza.

La mejor lectura de Cuaresma nos lleva de regreso a lo básico. Si la Cuaresma es el momento en que la Iglesia está de retiro, entonces deberíamos centrarnos en los textos que nos ayudan a profundizar nuestra comprensión de nuestra fe. Dedicar tiempo a leer uno de los Evangelios y utilizar un comentario de las Escrituras para aprender todo lo que puedas sobre la pasión de Jesús. Lee sobre las vidas de los santos, especialmente tu santo patrón y el de tu parroquia. Tal vez haya algún candidato local para la santidad, como el padre Walter Cizek, SJ, que escribió varios libros que inspiran la fe. Finalmente, puedes utilizar el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica para aprender más sobre las enseñanzas y creencias de la iglesia. Las secciones sobre la oración y la misa son reflexiones realmente excelentes. Centrarse en los aspectos básicos realmente nos ayuda a dar otro paso adelante en nuestra fe. No solo tenemos una mejor



comprensión de lo que creemos y practicamos, sino también por qué creemos. Con esa creencia viene la confianza que necesitamos para ser mejores testigos de Cristo, más fieles. ©LPi

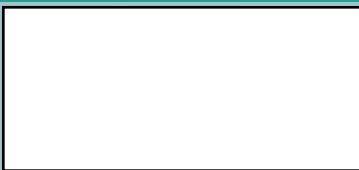

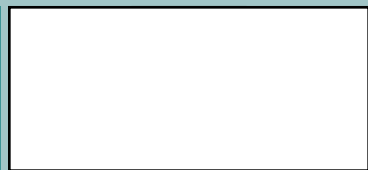
