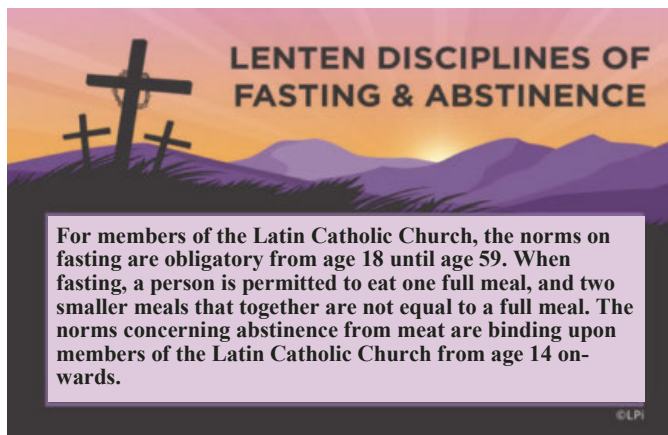

Fifth Sunday of Lent – A Call to True Conversion

Dear Parishioners,

In this sacred season of Lent, we are reminded that conversion is not reserved only for those who have gone astray. Even the “righteous” are called to deeper transformation. St. Paul’s powerful words in today’s second reading invite us to reflect not merely on external righteousness, but on a righteousness rooted in faith in Christ: *“not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ”* (Phil 3:9).

As we reflected in the last Sunday, “The Parable of the Prodigal Son” gives us two striking examples. The younger son needed a conversion of the unrighteous — to return home from his wandering. The elder son, however, represents the harder path: a conversion of the self-righteous — from prideful observance to humble participation in the Father’s mercy.

Jesus consistently showed us that self-righteousness can be more dangerous than outright sin, because it blinds us to our own need for grace. The Pharisees, though externally obedient, lacked compassion and humility. Sinners, however, more readily recognized their need for mercy. As Scripture says, *“all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God”* (Rom 3:23). There is no room for comparison or superiority in the kingdom of God — only the call to ongoing conversion.

Paul’s transformation from a persecutor of Christians to a passionate disciple shows us what this change looks like. Once zealous in condemning others, he became zealous in knowing Christ, even to the point of sharing in His suffering and death. His life teaches us this profound truth: True righteousness is not about being better than others — it is about becoming more like Christ.

So let us ask ourselves: How do I respond to those I perceive as sinners? Do I show mercy, or do I walk away like the elder son? Am I ready to change when I am wrong, and remain humble when I am right?

Let us make this our Lenten prayer, in the words of Peter Marshall:

“Lord, when we are wrong, make us willing to change.

And when we are right, make us easy to live with.”

May this fifth week of Lent bring us closer to the heart of Christ — in humility, in mercy, and in true righteousness.

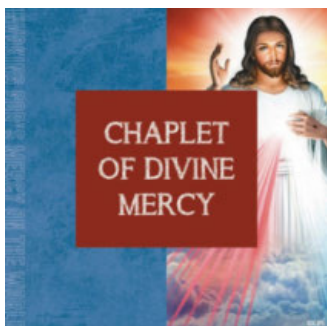

Chaplet of Divine Mercy, Explained!

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is an intercessory prayer invoking God's mercy on the world, utilizing words drawn from the text of The Diary of St. Faustina Maria Kowalska. St. Faustina was a Polish nun who received visions of Christ imploring her to spread the message of his Divine Mercy,

specifically through the recitation of this chaplet.

Prayed with an ordinary five-decade Rosary, the chaplet opens with a recitation of the Our Father, the Hail Mary and the Apostle's Creed. The beads usually used for the Our Father are used to recite this prayer: "Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world," followed by ten Hail Marys and the words "Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world."

Third Scrutiny

The words of the hymn, "I Now Live," echo faintly in churches still decorated for Lent as the Third Scrutiny takes place and those who journey toward Easter hear about the raising of Lazarus. The Gospel story is about more than just the raising of a single man, but about the life that Jesus Christ offers to every one of us. But there are many powers that seek to steal this life from us. In the words of this Scrutiny we pray for those journeying toward Easter, as the presider says: "Free from the grasp of death those who await your life-giving sacraments and deliver them from the spirit of corruption." It is through the sacrament of the Church that Jesus Christ instituted that we receive a new life, but sin stands in our way. But what Jesus did for his friend in this story, he did for us through his cross and resurrection. If we choose life, there is no spirit that can stand against us. May we stand with those before us who will be baptized at Easter and testify to the reality that we now live because we have died and risen with him and death's power is no more.

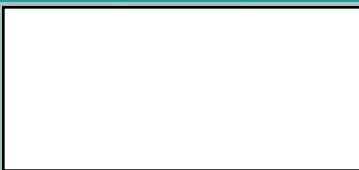

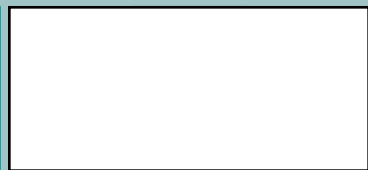
