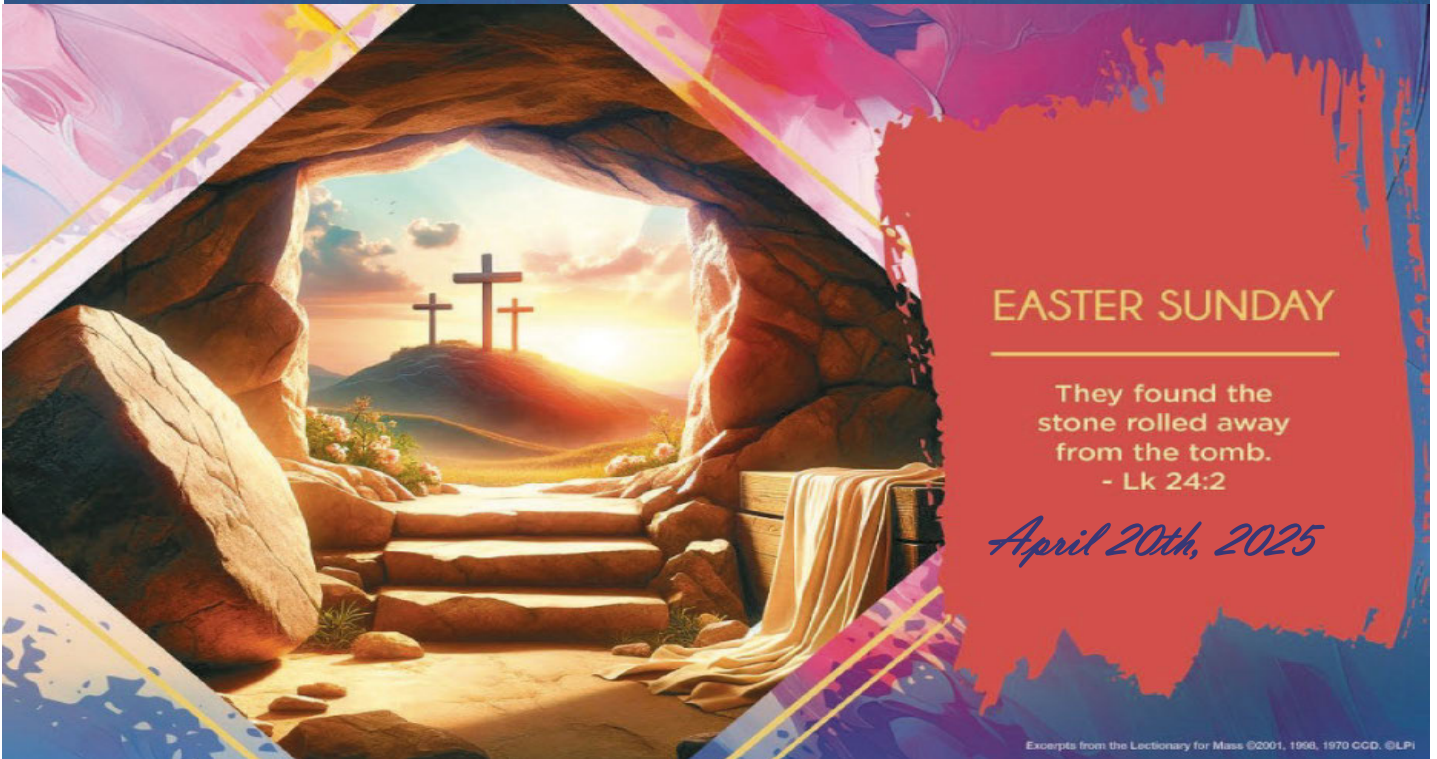

“I Am Here. I Am Life.”

Even in the most dire of circumstances, even in our darkest and most troubling moments, we almost intuitively look for meaning—for something that gives us hope and promise. In a word, we look for **Easter**.

Recall the events of Jesus’ passion, death, and resurrection. Peter had denied him. Jesus stood alone before Pontius Pilate. Soldiers scourged him and crowned him with thorns. The crowd shouted, “Crucify him!” He died, abandoned, on a cross. The flame of hope was nearly extinguished. His followers, gripped by fear, went into hiding.

Then something miraculous happened. Mary of Magdala burst into that room of despair and fear and proclaimed the most astonishing words ever spoken:

“I have seen the Lord!”

And human history has never been the same.

What is even more remarkable is that Mary did not recognize Jesus at first. Through her tears and grief, she thought his body had been taken. Then, in the garden, she heard a question:

“Woman, why are you weeping?”

Two angels asked it first, and then Jesus himself repeated it.

And then came one more word: **“Mary.”**

It was the sound of her name—spoken in that familiar voice—that opened her eyes and heart. This was the moment the **Resurrection** became real. This was when grief turned to joy, and despair into mission.

Jesus told her: **“Go to my brothers.”** And she went. She told the story that has been passed on to us today. It is the same story she discovered in that garden tomb:

“I am here. There is life. Eternal life.”

This is Easter.

Happy Easter!

I extend my heartfelt gratitude to all of you for your prayerful participation in the Holy Week liturgies and for walking the Lenten journey in such a meaningful way. I thank everyone who volunteered their time and talents—whether in decorating the church, assisting in the liturgy, maintaining our parish grounds and buildings, or helping in the parish office with correspondence and coordination. Your generosity and dedication are deeply appreciated.

May the Risen Lord bless you abundantly, and may you live in the new life and grace that Christ has won for us. Stay safe, be healthy, and keep the Easter joy alive in your hearts.

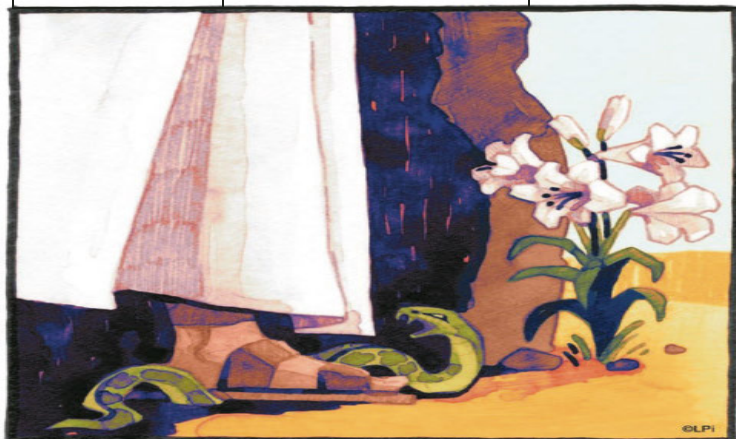

MEDITACION DEL EVANGELIO

Domingo de Pascua

El Señor Jesús vive y de ello damos testimonio porque hemos sido testigos de su Resurrección. La presencia del resucitado llena de alegría todas las cosas y al mundo entero. ¡Ha cumplido su palabra; está vivo! “Entonces entró también el otro discípulo, el que había llegado primero, vio y creyó. Pues no habían entendido todavía la Escritura: él debía resucitar de entre los muertos” (Juan 20:8-10). Jesús ya nunca volverá a morir, ¡Cristo Resucitó! ¡Verdaderamente Resucitó! ¿Crees esto? Es el saludo de este gozo pascual de este Domingo de Pascua.

Todos los bautizados debemos de estar alegres porque, por el hecho de ser bautizados, somos hijos e hijas de Dios, herederos del cielo, miembros de la Iglesia y por lo tanto estamos llamados a resucitar con él. Sin embargo, debemos estar conscientes que esto no ocurrirá de modo rápido y como apretar un botón mágico. Hay que trabajar en ello; debemos de poner nuestro esfuerzo en mejorar cada día.

Hay que acercarnos a la intimidad de Dios por medio de una relación personal con él y a través de la oración y los sacramentos. La salvación ya está realizada; solo nos toca a nosotros aceptarla y seguir caminando con fe y gozo. Este es el gran regalo que Jesús nos da: salvación, gracia y amor. ¡Aleluya! ¡Felices Pascuas de Resurrección! Dejemos que Jesús nos acompañe en el camino y que su presencia en la Eucaristía nos consuele cada vez que lo recibimos.

DISCERNIMIENTO

Pregunta: ¿Cómo puedo discernir si un llamado a hacer algo grande proviene realmente de Dios?

Respuesta: Cada día enfrentamos muchas decisiones sobre cómo seguir a Dios: si orar o no, cómo tratar a los demás y cómo priorizar nuestro tiempo. A veces, discernimos algo mucho más significativo: un llamado vocacional, un ascenso laboral que requiere un cambio de residencia o un nuevo puesto ministerial en la iglesia. Además de una lista de pros y contras o un análisis de costo-beneficio, aquí hay algunos aspectos que podemos considerar en oración y conversar con personas de confianza.

¿Se ajusta a la voluntad de Dios revelada en la Iglesia? Dios no nos llama a hacer algo que contradiga la ley moral. ¿Fomentará el crecimiento espiritual? A veces debemos elegir entre varias buenas opciones. Considere el impacto personal en usted y en las personas de quienes es responsable, como su familia. Otras veces, podríamos ser invitados a hacer el bien a los demás, pero al evaluar nuestros otros compromisos de vida, vemos que aceptar esto, a la larga, obstaculizaría nuestras responsabilidades previas. ¿Te parece coherente el llamado? Esto no significa que Dios no vaya a hacer algo nuevo. Aun así, considera si el llamado es coherente con tus dones y habilidades. ¿Ves una línea conductora, por así decirlo, de cómo tus experiencias te han llevado hasta aquí? ¿Lo confirman otros? Comparte tus reflexiones con personas de confianza y perspicaces. ¿Han visto lo mismo que tú o te plantean nuevos puntos a considerar? Con humildad, añade sus puntos relevantes a tus reflexiones. No olvides tu intuición. Después de haber considerado todo cuidadosamente en tu mente, no descuides tus instintos. ¿Tu corazón dice sí o no? ©LPi

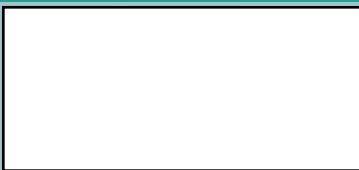

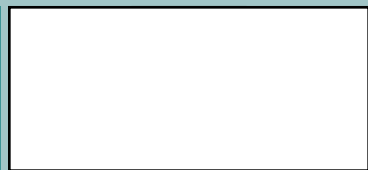
