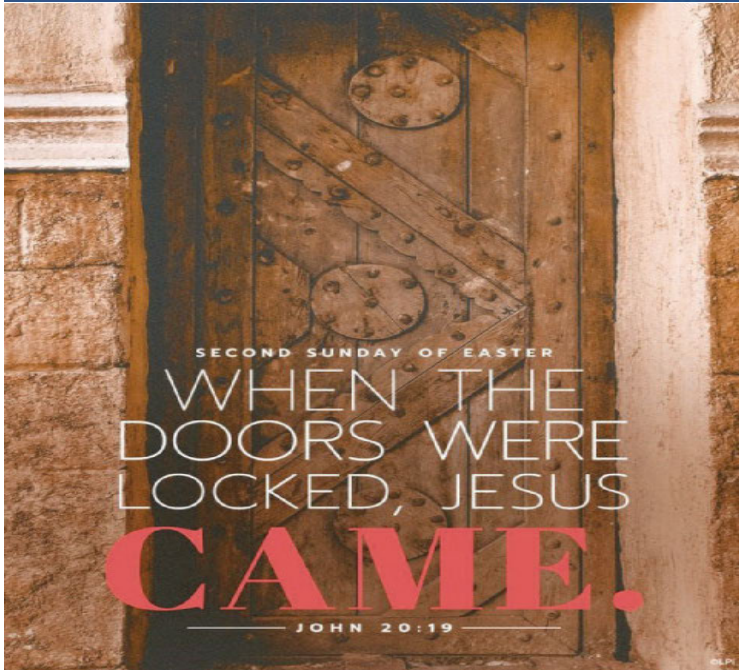

Divine Mercy Sunday: The Wounds that Heal

On this Second Sunday of Easter—known as **Divine Mercy Sunday**—we are drawn into the heart of the Gospel: the overwhelming, healing, and inexhaustible **mercy of God**.

When Jesus appears to His disciples in the Upper Room (John 20:19–31), He greets them not with rebuke, but with peace. These were men who had abandoned Him, denied Him, and fled in fear. Yet the Risen Christ enters into their fear and breathes on them the Holy Spirit, saying, *“Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them.”*

This moment is no mere greeting—it is the **birth of the Sacrament of Reconciliation**. Bishop Robert Barron calls this a crucial moment of divine mercy, where Jesus entrusts the apostles with the authority to forgive sins in His name. The Church is thus born from the **wounded side of Christ**—a Church not of perfect people, but of sinners who are forgiven and sent to proclaim forgiveness.

We then turn to Thomas, often called the “doubter,” who demands proof. Jesus, in His mercy, does not scold Thomas. Instead, He invites him to touch His wounds. **The wounds remain as signs of mercy**. In touching them, Thomas touches the very heart of God.

Divine Mercy Sunday reminds us that **we are all Thomas**—wounded, skeptical, hesitant. And yet, the Lord meets us not with judgment, but with mercy. He shows us His wounds so that we may find healing in ours.

Let us not keep this mercy to ourselves. Bishop Barron often says that those who have experienced the mercy of Christ are called to become “**missionaries of mercy**” in a world starving for grace. Forgive generously. Speak gently. Serve the poor. Visit the sick. Lift up the discouraged. This is the true fruit of Easter.

As we gaze upon the image of Divine Mercy—Jesus with rays of red and white flowing from His heart—let us echo the prayer that was given to St. Faustina and has become the anthem of today’s feast:

“Jesus, I trust in You.”

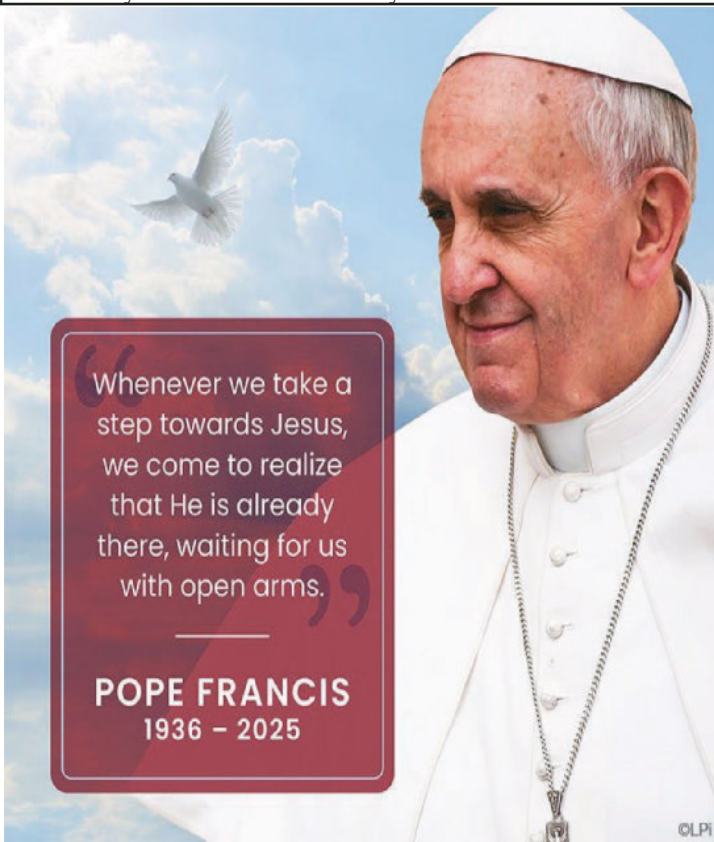

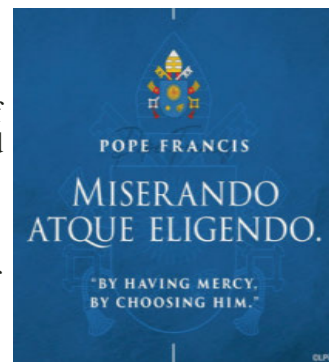
POPE FRANCIS
1936 - 2025

Pope Francis

Pope Francis, born Jorge Mario Bergoglio on December 17, 1936, in Buenos Aires, Argentina, was the first pope from the Americas and the first Jesuit to lead the Catholic Church. Before his election as pope on March 13, 2013, he served as Archbishop of Buenos Aires, where he was known for his humility, simple lifestyle, and dedication to the poor. Raised in a family of Italian immigrants, he studied chemistry before entering the seminary and joining the Jesuits. Ordained a priest in 1969, he later became the Provincial of the Jesuits in Argentina and played a key role in guiding the Church during a period of economic and social crises in the country. When he was appointed bishop in 1992 and archbishop in 1998, he prioritized evangelization, social justice, and pastoral outreach.

As pope, Francis emphasized mercy, care for the marginalized, and environmental stewardship. His papacy was marked by a call for a “poor Church for the poor,” interfaith dialogue, and reform within the Vatican. His teachings focused on compassion, the dignity of every person, and the need for a missionary Church.

On April 21, 2025, Pope Francis passed away, leaving behind a legacy of love, humility, and service.

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO “LA DIVINA MISERICORDIA”

¿Sabías qué? el segundo domingo del Tiempo Pascual fue designado “Domingo de la Divina Misericordia” por el Papa Juan Pablo II, en el año 2,000 durante la canonización de santa Faustina Kowalska. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, en su número 1225, ilumina y catequiza lo que el Papa y santa Faustina nos transmitieron al experimentar la misericordia divina en sus vidas. “En su Pascua, Cristo abrió a todos los hombres las fuentes del Bautismo. En efecto, había hablado ya de su pasión que iba a sufrir en Jerusalén como de un Bautismo con que debía ser bautizado. La sangre y el agua que brotaron del costado traspasado de Jesús crucificado son figuras del Bautismo y de la Eucaristía, sacramentos de la vida nueva: desde entonces, es

posible nacer del agua y del Espíritu para entrar en el Reino de Dios”. Santa Faustina al pintar el retrato del Señor de la Misericordia nos muestra esta imagen de la misericordia de Cristo Crucificado dada a nosotros por el Bautismo y la Eucaristía. El Papa Francisco, también, nos lo explica de la siguiente manera: “La misericordia a la luz de la Pascua se deja percibir como una verdadera forma de conocimiento. Se conoce a través de los sentidos, se conoce a través de la intuición, a través de la razón y aún de otras formas. Bien, se puede conocer también a través de la experiencia de la misericordia, porque la misericordia abre la puerta de la mente para comprender mejor el misterio de Dios y de nuestra experiencia personal (16 de abril del 2023).

FIESTA DE LA DIVINA MISERICORDIA

Pregunta: ¿De dónde surgió la fiesta de la Divina Misericordia?

Respuesta: Si naciste mucho antes del año 2000, sabrás que la fiesta de la Divina Misericordia no siempre se ha celebrado en la Iglesia. A principios del siglo XX, una joven monja polaca comenzó a recibir revelaciones privadas. Jesús se le apareció durante sus momentos de oración, hablándole un mensaje de misericordia y amor para el mundo. Recibió una serie de oraciones, la Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia, y la solicitud de establecer un día festivo para recordar a la Iglesia la misericordia de Dios. Santa Faustina murió en 1938, en el umbral de la guerra y en medio de uno de los siglos más violentos de la historia del mundo. Su historia y sus diarios comenzaron a circular en Polonia y más allá. Rápidamente se hizo evidente que se trataba de una joven santa y se abrió la causa para su canonización. En el año 2000, fue canonizada por el primer Papa polaco, San Juan Pablo II. El día de su canonización, estableció el segundo domingo de Pascua como Domingo de la Divina Misericordia, “una invitación perenne al mundo cristiano a afrontar, con confianza en la benevolencia divina, las dificultades y pruebas que la humanidad experimentará en los años venideros”.

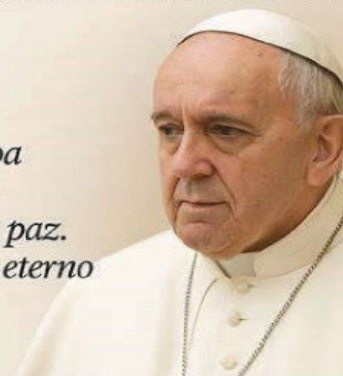

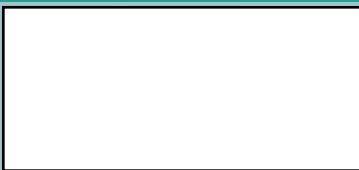

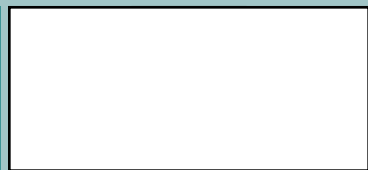
