Mission Appeal for the Diocese of Cuddapah June 14-15

Prayerful greetings from Bishop Saginala Paul Prakash, Bishop of Diocese of Cuddapah in India.

The Mission Diocese of Cuddapah covers four civil districts-Cuddapah, Chittoor, Annamaiah and Tirupati-spanning 31,029 square miles in Andhra Pradesh State. Among a population of five million, approximately 200,000 are Christians, and Catholics number about 130,000. Despite the challenges, we are blessed with a dedicated team of 139 priests, along with committed religious and lay leaders, serving across 59 parishes, schools, health clinics, and social service ministries.

As many of you may know, India is a land of vast economic diversity. In the Diocese of Cuddapah, most of our Catholic communities belong to lower castes and are economically disadvantaged, struggling daily for the basic necessities of life. The climate is harsh, with temperatures soaring up to 130°F during the long, dry summers, often leading to drought and famine.

Pastoral Work among the Poor, in our 69 parishes, priests minister to communities spread across 5 to 25 villages each. Most villages lack proper churches for worship. Our faithful, primarily agricultural laborers earning around \$3 a day, are unable to fund church construction but generously offer their manual labor. With your support, we can provide these communities with a worthy place to worship God.

Education for Poor and Low Caste Children is also our priority in our ministry. 80% of our Catholics are from low-caste backgrounds, converted from Hinduism, and face social oppression. Due to illiteracy and poverty, many children are forced into labor rather than school. Through grade schools, high schools, and boarding homes, we are educating over 2,050 children under the care of committed priests, religious sisters, and teachers. Special preference is given to educating girls, who are often the most marginalized. The Diocese has identified 158 children in need of special care as there are victims of HIV/AIDS. These children face stigma and exclusion from schools and health services. With your help, we provide them with education, spiritual counseling, nutritional supplements, medical treatment, and school supplies, offering them hope and a future.

Amidst many other challenges, our priests and volunteers have brought God's mercy to prisoners, offering prayers, counseling, and hope. We also support the education of prisoners' children, helping them with scholarships, books, backpacks, and school uniforms to build a better future.

This brief description portrays the real and pressing needs of our Mission in the Diocese of Cuddapah. I humbly appeal for your generous support to help uplift the poor, educate the marginalized, shelter the rejected, and offer hope to the suffering.

Every penny you contribute through the Mission Cooperative Plan will be used with heartfelt gratitude and great responsibility to make a difference in the lives of our brothers and sisters. I sincerely thank your Pastor for being open to welcome the missionaries and I express my gratitude to the Director of Propagation of Faith for assigning this parish for us to make this appeal. Please be assured of my prayers for you and your families. May God bless you abundantly for your generosity

Devotions, Explained!



Prayer Before Meals, Explained!

Anyone who has ever dined in a Catholic home has probably heard the prayer before meals that begins with the famous words: "Bless us, O Lord, and these thy gifts." These words in

particular are first found in the Galesian Sacramentary, a book of Christian liturgy that dates to the seventh or eighth century, but the practice of praying before meals is Biblical, harkening back to the Jewish ritual washing of hands before eating. In the Gospels, Jesus is shown praying before the Last Supper and other meals, setting an example followed by Paul in Acts 27:35.

In his 2015 encyclical Laudato SI', Pope Francis urged the faithful "to return to this beautiful and meaningful custom."

"That moment of blessing," he wrote, "reminds us of our dependence on God for life; it strengthens our feeling of gratitude for the gifts of creation...(and) reaffirms our solidarity with those in greatest need."



MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

DOMINGO DE PENTECOSTÉS



Este día de Pentecostés tenemos la oportunidad de pedir al Espíritu Santo que abra las puertas de nuestro corazón, nos regale la paz, y que seamos portadores de ella a dondequiera que nos presentemos. Hoy en día, el mundo, más que nunca, necesita la paz. Hay guerra y destrucción en varios países, dando como resultado vivir deseando la paz. La gente sufre atrapada en la incertidumbre y el miedo. Ojalá que hoy escuchemos este mensaje y se hagan realidad para muchas personas estas palabras: "Jesús les volvió a decir: ¡La paz esté con ustedes!" (Juan 20:21). El Espíritu Santo se manifiesta para el bien común, es decir, no es para unos cuantos, es para todos. En una de sus catequesis sobre el Espíritu Santo, San Cirilo de Alejandría explicaba lo siguiente: "De igual modo el Espíritu Santo, siendo uno solo y siempre el mismo e indivisible,

distribuye a cada uno sus gracias según su beneplácito. Al igual que un árbol seco, al recibir agua germina, de una manera semejante el alma pecadora al recibir al Espíritu Santo, el don del arrepentimiento produce frutos de justicia. Siendo siempre igual y el mismo, produce diversos efectos según su beneplácito de Dios y en el nombre de Cristo. De hecho, se sirve de la lengua de alguno para comunicar sabiduría. A otro le ilumina la mente con el don de profecía. A otro le da el poder de arrojar demonios. A aquel le da el don de interpretar las Escrituras". ¡Ven Espíritu Santo, y llena nuestros corazones de amor!

¿POR QUE CELEBRAMOS PENTECOSTÉS?

Pregunta: ¿Por qué celebramos Pentecostés cuando lo hacemos?

Respuesta: El libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles describe los acontecimientos inmediatamente posteriores a la ascensión de Jesús al cielo. A los apóstoles y a los demás discípulos se les dijo que oraran en Jerusalén y esperaran otro derramamiento del Espíritu Santo. Con el paso de las semanas, se acercaba la Fiesta de las Semanas judía. Esta fiesta tenía lugar 50 días después de la Pascua y celebraba la entrega de la ley en el Monte Sinaí. La Fiesta de las Semanas (o "Pentecostés" en griego) era una gran fiesta de peregrinación, en la que judíos de todo el mundo antiguo se reunían en Jerusalén para la celebración.

Fue en Pentecostés que Dios decidió enviar al Espíritu Santo. Allí, la nueva ley del amor quedó grabada en los corazones de los discípulos. Al salir al balcón, por encima de la multitud multinacional, Pedro proclamó el mensaje de la resurrección, y el Espíritu Santo permitió que cada oyente lo escuchara en su lengua materna. ¡Ese día se bautizaron 3000 personas! Los discípulos —y cada persona bautizada— reciben los dones y el celo necesarios para llevar un nuevo mensaje de salvación al pueblo de Dios. ©LPi
