

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, the central mystery of our Christian faith. It is a profound truth: that the one eternal God exists as three distinct persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—equal in divinity, united in essence, and bound in an eternal relationship of love.

While the word "Trinity" is not explicitly found in Scripture, the early Church came to understand this mystery through deep reflection on the words of Jesus and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Jesus revealed the Father who sent Him, and the Spirit whom He would send in His name. From this, we recognize that God is not a solitary being, but a perfect communion of love.

The Trinity reveals two important truths for our Christian life:

- 1. God is a community of love. We do not worship a God of isolation but a God of relationship. To be godly, then, is to live in communion with others—in family, parish, and society—shunning selfish individualism.
- 2. True love is dynamic and inclusive. The love of the Trinity shows us that relationships flourish not just in pairs but in communities. It is the fullness of love.

On this special Sunday, we are also blessed to welcome Bishop Saginala Paul Prakash, the Bishop of the Diocese of Cuddapah, India—my home diocese. His presence among us is a gift and a blessing to have him as the main celebrant to officiate the festive Mass of St. Anthony. He makes an appeal for the diocese in this weekend in our Church. I invite you to join me in welcoming him warmly to St. Anthony Church and to generously support the mission of his diocese, where the Church continues to grow and serve the needs of the poor and the marginalized with great zeal and humility.

We also take this opportunity to wish all fathers a very Happy Father's Day! Thank you, dear fathers, grandfathers, godfathers, and spiritual fathers, for your love, sacrifice, and leadership. May God bless you abundantly for the role you play in our lives and in the Church.

Let us strive to imitate the unity, love, and self-giving of the Holy Trinity in our own lives, families, and community.


Welcome Bishop Paul Prakash Saginala

- Professor of Sacred Scripture at St. John's Regional Seminary, Hyderabad (2008–2015)
- Chancellor and Pastor in Masapet, Cuddapah (2015–2022)

Devotions, Explained!



Memorare, *Explained!*

The Memorare is a prayer to the Blessed Mother in which the supplicant calls upon the maternal love and protection of Mary's intercession in an hour of dire need. "I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my mother," reads one section of the prayer, which goes

on to beseech "the Mother of the Word Incarnate" to receive these petitions with love and mercy.

St. Teresa of Calcutta and St. Francis de Sales were two great devotees of this prayer.

Popularized in the 17th century by a French priest named Fr. Claude Bernard, the text is derived from an older and longer prayer entitled "Ad sanctitatis tuae pedes, dulcissima Virgo Maria" ("at your holy feet, most sweet Virgin Mary"). The title "Memorare" is taken from the Latin word for "remember," which begins the prayer. The modern version appears in the 1846 Raccolta, a collection of indulgenced prayers.
