Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) "You are changed into Me." – St. Augustine

Today we joyfully celebrate the great Feast of **Corpus Christi**, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. It is a day that invites us to reflect deeply on the sacred mystery of the Eucharist—a divine gift that nourishes us not just physically but spiritually, transforming us into the Body of Christ.

Unlike ordinary food that becomes part of our body, the **Eucharist changes us**. As St. Augustine beautifully heard in prayer: *"You will not change me into yourself as you would food of your flesh; but you will be changed into me."* In the Eucharist, Jesus feeds us with His very self so that we may become more like Him—His hands, His heart, and His mission in the world.

But why, then, do many of us not feel transformed by this holy sacrament? Perhaps the problem is not with the Eucharist, but with our **faith and disposition**. As one humorous story suggests: during a joint expedition, an American blamed his broken tooth on hard Russian bread, calling it "lousy Communist bread," to which a Russian replied, "Is not lousy Communist bread. Is rotten capitalist tooth." The Eucharist is not lacking—our **faith might be.

Let us approach the altar today with a renewed reverence, a living faith, and open hearts, and allow Christ to truly transform us from within.


WOMEN'S GUILD AND MEN'S CLUB OF ST. ANTHONY SCHOLARSHIPS

Devotions, Explained!



Marian Consecration, *Explained!*

Marian consecration, the act of consecrating oneself to Jesus through the intercession of his Blessed Mother, is actually rooted in the words of Jesus himself when he beseeched the Apostle John to look upon Mary as his mother (John 19:27) and to "take her into his own home." He was actually instructing us all to

do likewise — to "behold your mother" and take Mary into our hearts, for wherever she is beloved, Christ is known and praised.

St. Maximilian Kolbe described Mary as "the stairway to Heaven." Marian consecration, therefore, could be likened to climbing the stairs. Different formulas exist for spiritual development in preparation for the consecration, based on the writings of saints like St. Louis de Montfort, and there are different prayers for the act of consecration. However, there is no "right" way to consecrate oneself to Jesus through Mary, so long as the ultimate goal is closeness to Christ and the glorification of God.

EL CUERPO Y LA SANGRAE DE CRISTO



Como Jesús nos conoce, él sabía y sabe que nos gusta comer. Jesús, multiplica la comida; él sacia el hambre de aquella gente que lo buscaba por sus enseñanzas y por sus milagros. ¿Por qué buscas a Jesús? ¿Qué tipo de hambre sacia en tu vida? En el sacramento de la Eucaristía, Jesús nos dejó su presencia real para poder alimentarnos espiritualmente.

"El culto que se da a la Eucaristía fuera de la Misa es un valor inestimable en la vida de la Iglesia. Dicho culto está estrechamente unido a la celebración del sacrificio eucarístico. La presencia de Cristo bajo las sagradas especies que se conservan después de la Misa---presencia que dura mientras subsistan las especies del pan y del vino, deriva de la celebración del Sacrificio y tiende a la comunidad sacramental y espiritual. Corresponde a los Pastores animar, incluso con el testimonio

personal, el culto eucarístico, particularmente la exposición del Santísimo sacramento y la adoración de Cristo presente bajo las especies eucarísticas. Es hermoso estar con él y, reclinados sobre su pecho como el discípulo predilecto (ver Juan 13:25), palpar el amor infinito de su corazón" (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, en el número 25, san Juan Pablo II). ¿Cómo es nuestra participación en la Eucaristía? Estamos llamados a ser fuente de vida y pan compartido para los demás. "El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre, permanece en mí y yo en él, dice el Señor" (Juan 6:56). ©LPi

La Eucaristía es el centro de nuestra vida espiritual y tiene enormes efectos en nuestro crecimiento, nuestra santidad y nuestra forma de vida. Los frutos de la sagrada Comunión son los beneficios que uno recibe del sacramento. Estos frutos de la Sagrada Comunión se analizan en el catecismo en el artículo sobre la Eucaristía. El beneficio principal es la unión con Cristo. Nos volvemos uno con él sacramentalmente, así como esperamos ser uno con él por la eternidad. La Eucaristía también nos separa del pecado, tanto pasado como futuro. Perdona los pecados veniales del pasado y, por el amor que recibimos, nos protege del pecado mortal en el futuro. La comunidad eclesial también se unifica y fortalece por la Eucaristía. Nos une a los pobres y ofrece la prenda de la vida eterna. ©LPi
