Saints Peter and Paul, pray for us!

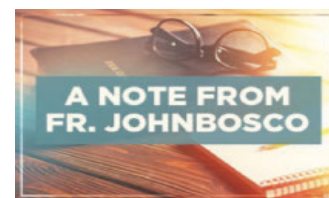
A Note of Thanks from Bishop Paul Prakash Saginala, Bishop of Cuddapah, India.

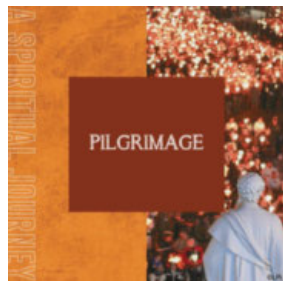
WOMEN'S GUILD AND MEN'S CLUB OF ST. ANTHONY SCHOLARSHIPS

Pilgrimage, Explained!

When the time came for the Transfiguration of Christ, Jesus took three of his disciples to "a high mountain by themselves," indicating that the sacred mysteriousness of this moment was something best experienced apart from the routine of ordinary life. This is the principle behind the act of pilgrimage: a journey to a place of spiritual significance, undertaken by one who is seeking closeness to Heaven while still on Earth.

Christian pilgrimages really began in the fourth century, when churches in the Holy Land were constructed in locations associated with the life of Christ. Throughout the centuries, pilgrims have likewise flocked to sites of Marian apparitions, miracles, and to places connected with the lives of saints. Some of the most iconic pilgrimage destinations include Fatima, Lourdes, and the Santiago de Compostela in Spain.

St. Elizabeth of Portugal | July 5



St. Elizabeth was born to Peter III of Aragon and his queen Constantia in 1271. Like most royal girls of the time, she was betrothed at an early age, and was married to King Diniz (or Dinis, English: Denis) at the age of

12. Although her husband's infidelities and life of sin caused much scandal, Elizabeth was a good and pious queen. She attended Mass daily and dedicated her life to helping the poor. She established orphanages and shelters for the homeless. She also founded a convent of Poor Clares at Coimbra, Portugal.

Often called Peacemaker, Elizabeth was from her birth a reconciler of conflict. Her birth brought her father and his estranged father James to peace. Later when her own son and husband came to war out of jealousy, she rode between armies and reconciled the two men.

After King Diniz died in 1325, she went to live as a lay member at the convent of Poor Clares that she had founded. But her fight for peace was not over, she undertook a long ride to keep the army of her son Afonso IV, from fighting that of Alfonso XI of Castile. Although she was successful, she died shortly after from a fever.

Saint Elizabeth was canonized on May 25th, 1625, by Pope Urban VIII. In the United States her memorial has been transferred to July 5th since July 4th is Independence Day, a national holiday.

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO SOLEMNIDAD DE SAN PEDRO Y SAN PABLO



Celebramos hoy, al mismo tiempo, la fiesta de san Pedro y san Pablo. Ellos colaboraron para la construcción del Reino de Dios. Dieron testimonio del Evangelio con su propia vida. Todos sabemos que, en las horas de la pasión, San Pedro negó a Cristo. Por su parte, san Pablo,

antes de ser llamado a ser apóstol, fue perseguidor de los cristianos. Pedro se arrepintió y llegó a ser el primer Papa, murió mártir. Pablo, convertido al cristianismo, fue fiel seguidor y propagador del Evangelio y también fue mártir. ¿En qué imitas a estos grandes seguidores de Jesucristo? “Jesús asigna a Simón este nuevo nombre: ‘Pedro’, que en la lengua de Jesús suena Kefa, una palabra que significa roca. En la Biblia, este término, roca, se refiere a Dios. Jesús asigna a Simón no por sus cualidades o sus méritos humanos, sino por su fe genuina y firme. La gloriosa herencia de Pedro y Pablo es una llamada a vivir las virtudes cristianas, de modo particular la fe y la caridad. La fe en Jesús: como Mesías e Hijo de Dios, que Pedro profesó primero y que Pablo anunció a la gente. La historia de estos apóstoles no fue fácil; tuvieron muchas dificultades. Sin embargo, son los cimientos de nuestra Iglesia. Cada uno de ellos fue único y se dejó tocar por Jesús. Pidamos hoy ser rocas firmes en nuestra fe, y caminemos con esperanza a pesar de las dificultades, teniendo la seguridad de que Jesús va con nosotros.

CONVERSIÓN DE SAN PABLO

Pregunta: El 25 de enero se conmemora la Conversión de San Pablo y culmina la Semana de Oración por la Unidad Cristiana. ¿Qué relación hay entre una y otra?

Respuesta: La Semana de Oración por la Unidad Cristiana consta de ocho días, comenzando el 18 de enero (en aquel entonces, la festividad de la Cátedra de San Pedro) y terminando el 25 de enero, festividad de la Conversión de San Pablo. Los Frailes Franciscanos de la Expiación, fundados a principios del siglo XX en Graymoor, Nueva York, buscaban promover la unidad entre anglicanos y católicos romanos. Paul James Wattson, exsacerdote episcopal, fundó la comunidad, que fue aceptada formalmente en la comunión católica.

La idea de la unidad cristiana pronto empezó a popularizarse, y para la década de 1930, cada vez más cristianos acogieron este enfoque. Cada año se distribuyen sugerencias para la oración y la educación, con énfasis en un tema elegido conjuntamente. El documento del Vaticano II de 1964 sobre el ecumenismo, Unitatis Redintegratio, impulsó enormemente el octavario, de modo que hoy en día muchos cristianos de todo el mundo promueven y participan en su tiempo de oración.

El énfasis en Pedro y Pablo encaja a la perfección con la lógica del octavario. Pedro es visto como la fuente de unidad dentro de la tradición cristiana. Pablo se destaca por su visión de llevar a todos a Cristo. La Semana de Oración por la Unidad de los Cristianos es una oportunidad ideal para orar y promover el respeto, la comprensión y, con suerte, la futura unidad entre los cristianos. 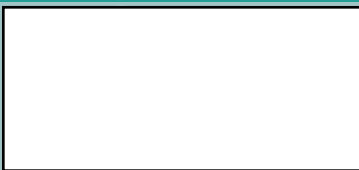

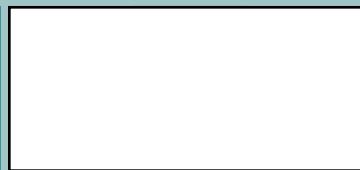
