Catholic Education: A Vital Part of Parish Life

Dear Parishioners,

As we begin the new academic year with the reopening of our school this week, let us take a moment to reflect on the gift of Catholic education and our shared responsibility, as members of the parish, to support and nurture the faith formation of our children.

Catholic education is not merely about academic excellence—it is a profound work of evangelization. The Church teaches that “a true education aims at the formation of the human person in the pursuit of his ultimate end and of the good of the societies of which he is a member” (*Gravissimum Educationis*, 1).

In the life of a parish, Catholic education—through schools, catechism classes, youth ministries, and adult faith formation—is central to forming missionary disciples. As the **Catechism of the Catholic Church** reminds us: “Parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children... But the role of the parish community is indispensable in forming children and young people in the faith” (CCC 2226).

The Second Vatican Council emphasized that: “The parish should be a center of education in the faith for children, young people, and adults” (*General Directory for Catechesis*, 257).

Let us continue to invest our time, resources, and prayers in supporting Catholic education in our parish. Whether through our school, religious education programs, or faith-sharing groups, we are called to nurture a living, growing faith that bears fruit in service, prayer, and witness.

Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

On August 15, we joyfully celebrate the **Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary**, when our Blessed Mother was taken body and soul into the glory of heaven. This feast reminds us of our own destiny and the hope of eternal life. Mary, full of grace, remained faithful to God's will throughout her life. At the end of her earthly journey, God did not allow her body to see corruption but assumed her into heavenly glory.

As the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: “*The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians.*” (CCC 966)

Let us draw inspiration from Mary's humility, obedience, and trust in God. May her intercession help us to live our lives in holiness, looking forward to the glory that awaits us in heaven.

Holy Mary, assumed into heaven, pray for us!

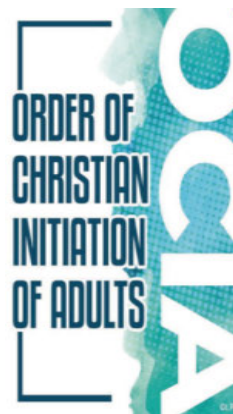

REGISTRO PARROQUIAL

Pregunta: ¿Por qué es tan importante inscribirnos en una parroquia? ¿No basta con ir a misa?

Respuesta: El registro es la forma oficial de unirse a una comunidad parroquial. Mucha gente piensa que, por asistir a una parroquia, pertenece automáticamente. A veces, los jóvenes que se han mudado hace años creen que siguen inscritos bajo la tutela de sus padres. Pero la membresía requiere inscribirse, inscribirse formalmente en una parroquia. El registro es un compromiso con la comunidad, una forma de ser incluido en las actividades religiosas, sociales y ministeriales de la parroquia. Su registro afecta a la parroquia de muchas maneras. Las cifras del censo pueden determinar cuántos sacerdotes están asignados a una iglesia, qué beneficios y obligaciones tiene la comunidad con la diócesis y cómo se planifican y programan las misas, las confesiones y las devociones. El registro demuestra su pertenencia. También es necesario para ciertos beneficios, como programar sacramentos, obtener certificados de padrinos y obtener declaraciones de donaciones para impuestos. Y lo más importante, permite que la parroquia cuente con usted y lo convoque para que colabore en su misión. Registrarse en su parroquia es una declaración de fe y confianza en la vida y el trabajo de su parroquia. ©LPi

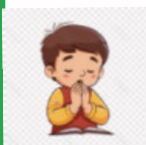
