Dear Parishioners,

My heartfelt thanks to all of you for coming together to celebrate my birthday on the evening of August 24th in the Family Center. Last week was truly a beautiful expression of solidarity and love, shared as one parish family. I am certain that everyone had their share of joy, as so many worked generously to make the evening enjoyable and to provide us with the gift of tasting foods from different cultures.

God bless you for the warmth, joy, and unity you brought to this celebration. I am deeply proud of this community and the way our parish family gathers with such enthusiasm and generosity for so many occasions. May we continue to grow together in faith, friendship, and service.

This week we also recall the death anniversary of **Mother Teresa of Kolkata** on September 5th, whose life of total dedication to the poorest of the poor continues to challenge us to live the Gospel radically. Long before the Church articulated the “preferential option for the poor” as a pillar of her social teaching, saints like **Mother Teresa** and **St. Damien of Molokai** lived it out with courage and love, committing their whole lives to the outcast, the sick, and the abandoned.

Today’s Gospel reminds us that the Christian community must embody this same spirit. Some may think Jesus is simply teaching table etiquette when He speaks about choosing seats at a banquet. But when viewed in the light of the early Christian assembly, where believers gathered around the Lord’s Table, His words reach much deeper. The Eucharist is the place where every human distinction fades—employer and employee, master and servant, rich and poor—here we stand together as brothers and sisters, equal before the Lord, united in calling God “Our Father.”

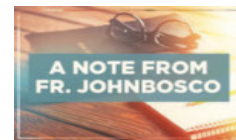
Yet, Jesus takes us even further. Not only are we equal before God, but we are commanded to give **special preference to the poor, the weak, and the disabled**. As He says, “When you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind.” This is not just social courtesy—it is Gospel truth. A community is only as strong as its weakest member. To give attention, love, and resources to the weakest is to strengthen the whole Body of Christ.

As we reflect on today’s Gospel, let us ask: **Does our parish community measure up to the call of Christ to make a preferential option for the poor?** Do our choices, ministries, and resources reflect the compassion of the Lord for those most in need?

May the examples of Mother Teresa and St. Damien inspire us to live with **humility, solidarity, and generosity**, so that in every Eucharist we celebrate, we may also become what we receive—the Body of Christ for the life of the world.

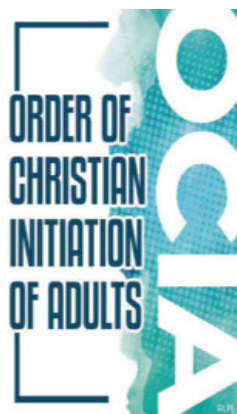

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO:**“NO ESCOJAS EL PRIMER LUGAR”**

El Reino de Dios se construye en la vida de cada día, donde cada uno de nosotros somos los protagonistas. Se debe trabajar duro y se exige perfección; sin embargo, al mismo tiempo se nos pide no aparentar, no presumir, sino, por el contrario, ser humildes y servir al que lo necesite. Porque tu Reino, Señor, se construye con dedicación, esfuerzo y amor. No se trata de prestigio ni de comodidad. “No debemos buscar por nuestra propia iniciativa la atención y consideración de los demás, sino más bien dejar que otros nos la presten. Jesús siempre nos muestra el camino de la humildad. ¡Debemos aprender el camino de la humildad! Porque es el más auténtico, lo que también nos permite tener relaciones auténticas” (Papa Francisco). Los pri-

meros asientos en las fiestas deben tomarse con humildad, no con protagonismo. Jesús, este domingo, nos da una lección de lo que es la humildad en los banquetes o fiestas a las que somos invitados. “Cuando alguien te invite a un banquete de bodas, no escojas el mejor lugar. Puede ocurrir que haya sido invitado otro más importante que tú, y el que los invitó a los dos venga y te diga: ‘Deja tu lugar a esta persona’ Y, con gran vergüenza, tendrás que ir a ocupar el último lugar” (Lucas 14:8-9). Todos los servidores del Señor debemos ocupar su lugar en el servicio que realizamos, ya sea en la familia, en el trabajo o en la comunidad. Servir implica siempre ocupar el último lugar. ©LPi

Me encanta el versículo del Sirácida que dice: «Hijo mío, conduce tus asuntos con humildad, y serás amado más que quien da regalos». Este es un concepto interesante para quienes pensamos que una vida de corresponsabilidad se trata solo de dar regalos. Cuando empezamos a pensar que solo estamos llamados a dar por el simple hecho de dar, no hemos entendido el punto.

Estamos llamados a ser dadores generosos. Estamos llamados a permitir que el Jesús en nosotros se encuentre con el Jesús en los demás. La humildad no significa que nos escondamos después de dar, sino que damos de una manera que tiene menos que ver con nosotros y más con aquel en cuyo nombre damos. Nuestro mundo necesita filantropía y generosidad, pero necesita aún más a Jesús. Queremos ser buenos ejemplos para los demás de cómo ser generosos, no porque queramos que sean como nosotros, sino como Jesús.

Da todo con un corazón y una disposición generosos. No te atribuyas el mérito de esa generosidad, sino que, en cambio, permítas que ella nos guíe hacia Jesús. Después de todo, es Jesús quien nos llama a una fe madura donde respondemos a su llamado cada día, sin importar el costo. Sin esa madurez y sin responder al llamado, ¿realmente nos sentiríamos impulsados a ser generosos? Saber que, abandonados a nuestra suerte, probablemente no tendríamos mucho éxito como donantes debería, de todos modos, hacernos muy humildes.

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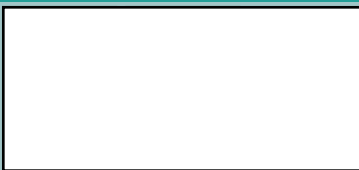
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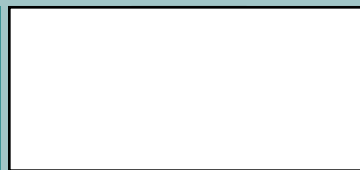
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
