FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Parishioners,

The solemnity of Christ the King is the last Sunday in the liturgical calendar of the year. In the Church, the new year begins with the first Sunday of Advent, which falls on December 1st this year. It was Pope Pius XI who brought the Feast of Christ the King into the liturgy in 1925 to bring Christ as ruler, and Christian values back into lives, into society, and into politics. This feast challenges us to see Christ the King in everyone, especially those whom our society considers the least important, and to treat each person with the same love, mercy, and compassion Jesus showed.

As we approach the end of a liturgical year, the Church through the readings reminds us how the world will be on the last day. Here is what the first reading tells us, "At that time there shall arise Michael, the great prince. It will be a time unsurpassed in distress. Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake." With the same language the Gospel tells us, "In those days after that tribulation the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light... And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory..."

As Bishop Barron explains the scriptural language here "features apocalyptic musings." It is not a weather forecast nor a prophecy, but it means unveiling or revealing a reality. Bishop Barron admits that it sounds strange, but there is a great scriptural belief for us as we are reminded of it. As the scripture tells us, it will be a time of distress and tribulation, many people will wonder how to prepare for it. He further says, "We should not trust in any of the powers of the world to give us security and peace. Such peace will come only with the arrival of the God's Kingdom." We must understand that when the end time comes, no power in the world will be able to withstand it. Then nothing can assure us of any peace and security. We must take refuge in Jesus, who is the king of peace for all nations. This is the theme of our liturgical celebration for Christ the King Sunday. The king of peace invites us to turn to him because he wants us to be at peace. We do not want to wait until the end-time gets a little closer because we do not know when it will happen. Let us live in peace every day.

Jesus is the king of peace. He is gentle and humble of heart, not to sow enmity among us but to bring joy and peace. Jesus is here so that all may be brothers and sisters to one another. Jesus is here to give us hope. Jesus came to bless poverty. Jesus came to bless our pains and aches. He came to make our lives easier and more comfortable. Jesus is here to give meaning and purpose to our crosses, pains, and trials. Jesus is king of the universe, the king of our hearts. As Christians, we should see the blessings and find meaning in our poverty, in our cross and in our pain. If Jesus is king of our hearts every Christian must be a Christian of love and kindness. The solemnity of Christ the King will be an empty day and pass like an ordinary Sunday unless Jesus is first born in our hearts. Is Jesus indeed in our hearts?

Citizens of Another Country

I read an article, years ago, about an American filmmaker who decided to step away from a wildly successful film franchise that had been requiring him and his family to live abroad.

It stuck in my mind because of the tongue-in-cheek reasoning he gave for the surprising decision, "My kids were starting to speak in British accents."

Sometimes, we just want to go home, don't we?

Returning from a recent family vacation, I burst into tears at the airport, overcome with relief when I saw my sister's van pulling into the pickup lane. It didn't matter that I had had fun on this trip and that I was even looking forward to taking another one. In that moment, I was so tired, and all I wanted was my own bed. The smell of my own house. The feeling of not being "away."

If Jesus is our king, and his kingdom is not of this world, then we live our lives as perpetual aliens. This should reassure us in some ways. The world so often feels cold and cruel and strange to us because it is. We were not made for this world. We were made for heaven. We were made to yearn for the face, the presence, the protection of our King.

But this understanding of ourselves as strangers in a foreign land should also be a caution to us.

We can't get too comfortable here. We cannot become too wrapped up in the world and its temptations, its rewards, its comforts. We cannot start speaking in the language, the accent of our adopted homeland. Not if we ever want to return home and belong there.

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

When I was a young boy in Burlington, Vermont, my dad had a good friend named Phil who owned a sporting goods store. I loved sports, so meandering the treasure-filled aisles was an unmitigated joy. One afternoon, we were shopping for a baseball glove. Dad said to me, "Hey Johnny, see that man who just walked into the store? That's Phil." I remember being fascinated and a little terrified. I recall thinking, "That man right there is in charge of everything in this store!" He reigned over every ball, sneaker, jersey, and sweatsuit. Phil became a family friend. And he was a good owner. The store flourished, and I found myself even more at peace every time I went there. I felt a new hope and even responsibility for the store to flourish.

To say that Christ is the King of the Universe means that Jesus has absolute authority over everything in it. It should fill us with awe and fascination. He is in charge. The world and everything in it are finally his. Knowing that he knows and loves us should make us also feel a deep peace at being a part of his universe. This leads us to want his kingdom to flourish, to play some responsible role in it.

We advance his kingdom by promoting the truth. "Everyone who is of the truth hears my voice," Christ the King proclaims. In Phil's store, it was about the truth of athletics. In our world, it's all about the truth of all creation, especially the dignity of the human person, made by and for our loving God. 



Sacramental Seal

Question:

What is a sacramental seal and where did it come from?

Answer:

Leaving more than just a memory, there are some events in our life that are truly transforming, making us different people. The same thing can be said of spiritual things, especially sacraments. A sacramental seal or character is a theological concept to describe the life-changing and permanent effect of three sacraments on the person: baptism, confirmation, and holy orders. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that these sacraments confer a seal "by which the Christian shares in Christ's priesthood and is made a member of the Church according to different states and functions. This configuration to Christ and the Church, brought about by the Spirit, is indelible" (#1121).

Once we receive these sacraments, we are forever changed. It's a spiritual "point of no return" whereby we take a step forward in our faith journey. We are marked as people of faith, as those who have received the Spirit and as those called to serve in ordained ministry. That is why these sacraments are received only once. The direction is set, the choice is made, and we are called by God to be his people. Nothing can change that, not even our own sinfulness.
