## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Parishioners,

By granting a special dispensation for the feast day of the Immaculate Conception, Daniel Cardinal DiNardo wrote:

"As you know, this year December 8th, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, occurs on the Second Sunday of Advent. Therefore, the liturgical celebration of the Immaculate Conception is transferred to Monday, December 9th.

In the past, it was understood that when this situation occurred the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception was not a Holy Day of Obligation due to its proximity to the obligation of Sunday. A recent clarification, however, from the Holy See stated that the obligation for the faithful to attend Mass for Solemnity always remains in force.

As we are quickly approaching the end of the liturgical year, I am aware that many parishes and families already have in place the schedules for Advent and Christmas, and that this will cause confusion due to the short notice of this change. Thus, taking this into account, I have decided to grant a dispensation from this obligation in the Archdiocese this year.

Therefore, in accord with canon 87 §1, I hereby grant a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on December 9, 2024, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, to all the faithful of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston. [Please note that in the future the obligation to participate at Mass for this Solemnity will be maintained beginning in 2025.]"


What does the feast of Immaculate Conception say? It says that from the first moment of conception, when Mary was conceived in the womb of her mother St. Anne, she was completely free from original sin. The feast of Immaculate Conception means that Mary was prevented from any stain of sin from the first moment of her conception. Why was Mary delivered from original sin? It is because the Father wanted to have a perfect and pure instrument, a stainless container to contain the body of Christ for nine months. Mary was immaculately conceived not because of her but because of Jesus.

Why do we celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception? Mary is a human being like all of us. Mary is not a goddess. We do not worship or adore Mary. We do not adore Mary because adoration belongs to God. We do not kneel before Mary to worship her. But we are grateful, and we are proud of a beautiful sinless woman like Mary because she is one of us. Mary was chosen sinless and stainless. Her obedience made her more beautiful before God. We who are sinful, who have so many bruises, so many scars of sins can still be made beautiful if we follow the obedience of Mary to the will of the Father.

As we admire our Blessed Lady, God's most favored one, filled with grace, on the feast of her conception, let us thank God for His love and mercy which embraces us right from the moment of our own conception. Though it is not a holiday of obligation, I encourage you to attend Mass on December 9th, Monday morning. Happy Feast Day to all.

## PRACTICING CATHOLIC

#### The Straight Path

Ten to fifteen years ago the Department of Transportation decided that it would be fun to give everyone in my zip code something to complain about and replaced most of our major intersections with roundabouts.

This wouldn't be so irksome, I suppose, if I understood how to navigate a roundabout. In theory I do, I've read all the rules and I've watched those cute little YouTube videos where they show you which car is supposed to go at what time. But theory and practice are rather different. And the bottom line is, I never approach a roundabout without taking a deep, anxious breath and tightening my grip on the steering wheel, not entirely sure what my next move should be.

I think of roundabouts every time I hear today's Gospel reading, where John the Baptist echoes Isaiah in beseeching us to make straight the paths of the Lord. See, I always think I've made a straight path between me and God. I go to Mass. I go to Confession. I say my prayers.

He can get to me if He wants, I tell myself.

But without realizing it, I put up roundabouts. I make rules. You go here, God, and then I go here. I'll do this, God, but first You do this. You stay in your lane, and I stay in mine. Eventually I find myself taking a different route altogether; the road that stretches between me and Him is too daunting. I start avoiding it.

Sometimes I think God wants the path to be straight not for Himself but for us. He can handle a roundabout. But He knows that when we must run to Him, we have to do it without thinking. In the dark. In fear, in anxiety.

So, this Advent, beware the roundabouts. Make straight the path

## PRAY & REFLECT

#### December 8, 2024 2nd Sunday of Advent

In the year 1995, in the seventeenth year of my life, when Fife Symington was governor of Arizona, Bill Clinton was president of the United States, Chuck Keiffer was pastor of St. Theresa parish in Phoenix, Arizona, and Ron and Mary were my parents, the word of God came to my youth minister Eric and through him I started to see the salvation of God. Soon, Christ came into my life never to leave. I'm thankful beyond words.

Why am I being so specific, you ask? Because in the Gospel this week we hear the specific names of people holding civic and religious authority in first century Palestine when "the word of God came to John the Baptist:" Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate, Herod, Philip, Lysanias, Annas, Caiaphas, and Zechariah. All this is meant to help us see that God breaks into our history, into real human events. Jesus is no mere myth. He is the Word-which-breaks-in, in concrete moments, you might say. And now we anticipate his coming once again in our specific situations.

Advent challenge: Name as many civic and religious leaders who are in authority currently in your life. Now, name who the potential John the Baptists may be. A spouse? A friend? A podcaster? A work colleague who brings God's word to you? Spend a moment considering that this comprises the concrete, historical setting into which Christ wishes to come. Then, with these specifics in mind, pray: "Come, Lord Jesus. Come."



















#### Journey through Advent with Fr. John Burns

This is the **8th Year** of TMIY program in Our Parish, and this year's theme is **'The Light of Men'** 





# Q&A

#### Las Posadas

#### Question:

What is the Hispanic Advent custom of "Las Posadas"?

#### Answer:

"Posada" is the Spanish word for inn or lodging. "Las Posadas" refers to a traditional Advent custom in preparation for the birth of Jesus, beginning on December 16. For nine successive evenings, groups reenact the search of Mary and Joseph for shelter in Bethlehem.

Two children dress as Mary and Joseph, sometimes with Mary riding on an actual donkey. They are usually accompanied by children dressed as angels and shepherds along with the Wise Men. Adults accompany them as they process to designated homes where they sing Christmas songs and request lodging. Part of the group enters the home and becomes the chorus that responds to the request for lodging. In the beginning the request is rebuffed. They move to several more homes where the ritual is repeated. Eventually, at the last home, their need is recognized, and they all enter the home where a party ensues. This is repeated in different neighborhoods and homes each of the nine days.

While this custom teaches children an important aspect of the Christmas story, it also emphasizes the need for hospitality to strangers and the continual need we all have to make room for Jesus in our "posada." As we struggle to arrive at a fair and just immigration policy, it would be good to recall the fact that Mary, Joseph, and Jesus were also immigrants looking for a hospitable place to dwell

#### **Everyday Stewardship**

I remember growing up in Catholic school and having to make construction paper Advent wreaths every single year! The little yellow flames would be cut out and held until each new candle was lit. Great idea, except for the fact that the chance you could find the flames greatly diminished as each week passed. I will bet over 50% of the wreaths never received a 4th flame! Of course by then, most kids in elementary school had moved on to Christmas. Christmas was not a day. It was an entire experience of vacation from school.

You may or may not have an Advent wreath in your home or office, but those flames are rather insignificant to the flame that should be burning in our hearts during this season. How are you finding ways to light your fire? How are you preparing the way for Christ to come into your life and the lives of those around you in a more profound way?

The ritual of an Advent wreath is a good idea for anyone. But don't think that your preparations are done simply because you have one. You are called to be a flame to others during this season, reminding them of why we celebrate this time at all. Each person is a candle to be lit, and you have the gifts, given to you by God, to light them. At Christmas, you want God to look at you and see all the light generated by those He lit through you. Now is the time. Don't wait until Advent is almost over. You might not be able to find your own flames if you wait too long.


