My Dear Parishioners,

CHEER UP

The Lord is coming to cheer us up and to renew us in his love, provided we are prepared to surrender our lives to him. During the season of Advent, we await the celebration of Christ's birth and his coming again at the end time. Over the four weeks, we prepare our hearts for Christmas in penitential reflection. The third Sunday of Advent is traditionally called "Gaudete" Sunday. Gaudete is the Latin word meaning "rejoice." There is joy in looking forward to the annual celebration of Christmas. There is also joy in recalling the birth of Jesus on the first Christmas. We, the priests at the liturgies during this weekend will wear rose chasuble which symbolizes joy. The delight of children going to see Santa Claus, the buying and wrapping of Christmas gifts, the decorating of Christmas trees, all these advent activities express the great anticipation of something wonderful about to happen. Traditionally we have the practice of making Advent wreaths in the parish Hall, which was done again this year. I was invited to bless the wreaths they made and to bless their families and our parish community. You should have seen the joy of children having made the wreaths and getting the blessing. I was with a family for their Advent wreath prayer. All the children and grandchildren gathered with their parents and grandparents around the Advent wreath to pray. One of the grandchildren lit the candles and all the children joined in blowing out the candles afterwards. Perhaps there were more interested in the candles than in the prayer, but as they grow older, the memory of the Advent wreath will be part of their family tradition of prayer. They are a happy and joyful family.

We are beautiful people, loveable people, but we are also vulnerable people, especially to selfishness and pride. It is said that with age comes a certain wisdom. People I know who are getting older start giving things away and start becoming donors to good causes. They see having so many things as a distraction from the simple pleasures of spending time with family and friends and appreciating the beauty of life. They see that helping others gives them more happiness than having so many things. But on the other hand, in our selfishness and pride, we are all the time receiving and not giving. Then we will be like the Dead Sea, which is dead, because it is all the time receiving, never giving anything out. To make way for joy in the Lord also calls us to surrender ourselves to God in prayer. If we surrender ourselves to the Lord, then he is going to cheer us up and charm it with a smile. One smile in public is worth ten before your mirrors, for it keeps joy in circulation. There are lots of poor people around us not only because they struggle economically, but also because they feel alone, unsupported, isolated, and fearful. We bring good news by our constant joy, a joy that comes from our encounter with Jesus and our mission to bring his joy to others.





PRACTICING CATHOLIC

Asking the Question

I have found in my life that if I am certain of the answer to a big and complicated question — right away, no doubts or hesitations — there is a high likelihood that the answer is actually the wrong one.

Because most of the time the truth is buried beneath a thicket of pride, prejudice, and ignorance. To find our answers, we have to be ready to put the gardening gloves on and pick through the thorns. We have to pray. We have to reflect. We have to question ourselves and others. We have to examine our feelings. And then we have to pray some more.

See, I would be willing to bet that the tax collectors and soldiers knew. Deep in their hearts, they knew.

They knew when they approached John the Baptist and asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" that his reply was not going to be: "Keep doing exactly what you're doing."

They had heard this guy preach. They knew what he was about: repentance. They might not have known exactly what John the Baptist was going to tell them to do, but they knew whatever it was, it was going to be a challenge. It was going to turn their lives upside down.

I give them credit for asking the question. That's a hard thing to do, and I don't do it enough. Too often, I'm afraid to ask the question.

How do I love this person? How do I live out my baptismal call in this particular situation? How do I draw water from the fountain of salvation — and how do I do it with joy, as we are commanded by the Psalms?

Christmas is ten days away. Are we asking the question?

PRAY & REFLECT

December 15, 2024 3rd Sunday of Advent

On a bright Spring morning, a passerby once saw St. Francis of Assisi hoeing a row of beans and asked him, "What would you be doing right now if you knew this was the last day of your earthly life?" The Saint responded, "I'd keep hoeing this row of beans." Preparing for this world to end — whether by our death or by Jesus' glorious coming — invites us to live not in the past or the present, but deeply in the present moment.

This same point is on display in the simple advice given by the wild and eccentric John the Baptist. He speaks of the one who is to come who will baptize "with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Luke 3:16). Despite the bizarre awesomeness of this announcement, he tells his listeners to engage in the present moment with simple acts of justice and love as their preparation for Jesus' coming, sharing their clothes and food, eliminating greedy and underhanded practices, being content with their wages. It's so undramatic. But how many actually did it? We don't know. How many of us will commit ourselves to these types of humble and demanding practices in our lives? That's what we should be doing now in our present moment, not worrying about the future.

Advent challenge: Name one way you are doing the bare minimum towards others in your daily life. Or name something you are doing because you are not content with your financial situation. Pray: "Jesus, if it is your will, help me to stop doing these things this week. Help me prepare for your coming." Then make the appropriate changes.





With Christmas fast approaching, can you give me some practical tips to prepare myself and my family that will help us stay grounded in what this

holiday is really about? With all the commercialism, it's easy to stray.

Answer:

Happy times and events bring fond memories and a renewed sense of love and kinship with others. The anticipation is half the joy of the event itself. The coming of the Lord is that kind of event that people have been looking forward to for generations with fervent hope and desire. It gave them strength and courage as they waited for the coming of the Lord.

We know that Christmas is rushed. Sales begin in August and carols blare long before the season begins. Everyone laments the commercial aspects of the season, but as Advent begins, do something to help you be more mindful of the Lord's coming. Use an Advent wreath, or enthrone the Bible prominently, or read the readings from the Bible assigned to each day. Postpone the tree and decorations until closer to Christmas. Establish new family rituals, customs and prayers that help remind everyone that we are preparing to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Fasting, daily Mass, a special celebration of reconciliation, reaching out to those alienated from family or society, and visiting the homebound manifest the love of the Christ Child and the Holy Family. Resist the temptation to rush the season. In his own time and in his own way, God will come. Our task is simply to be watchful and ready.

Well, if your football team is poised to win this weekend or next, maybe you're really feeling this vibe. But if you've got a long slog at work ahead of you this week and a to-do list that only seems to grow and never shrink, it may make you grumble.

I'll be sure to scribble that phrase on a Post-It and stick it to my dashboard for when some entitled punk inevitably cuts me off on tomorrow's morning commute."

When we feel this way, we know it's time to head back to the well. Think of all the places in Scripture where God compares His love, His mercy, His salvation to water. And not just any water — living water, water that moves. God's strength is not a stagnant puddle sure to evaporate and disappear. It's water you can keep coming back to. It's water that never dries up.

Which is good news for us, because we never stop failing to do what we should, never stop failing to feel the joy and the compassion and the selflessness we are called to. We need a source of living water if we are going to 'rejoice always.' To be everyday stewards, we need a well that never empties.

The fountain of salvation never dries up. There is always more there for us to draw from. It's a sign of His commitment — so let us, in turn, be committed to Him.


