FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Parishioners,

It was a Spiritual Feast in Mary Queen this past weekend that started with the First Saturday Mass at 8:30 am. It was truly an amazing weekend filled with grace and blessings. Immediately after the Mass we had the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in St. Joseph Chapel which concluded with the Benediction at 3:30 pm. Many came to adore Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament on Saturday after reading about the 54 Eucharistic Miracles from around the world that was displayed in 67 posters at St. Charbel Youth Center. Even though as per the original schedule, the Exhibition was supposed to open at 9:30 am, we started earlier due to a large crowd waiting to visit the exhibits after the Mass.

More than 1000 people visited the Eucharistic Miracles Exhibition this past weekend. I was moved by the reverence of those who visited the Eucharistic Miracles Exhibits and their eagerness to read about some of these beautiful witnesses of our faith, collected and designed by Blessed Carlo Acutis. Mary Queen's OCIA and Youth received it very well as I heard from them that the "Scientific Evidence" in these Miracles really helped them to understand and firmly believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

During all the weekend Masses after the closing prayer we also made the Parish-wide Eucharistic Consecration. The "33 Days to Eucharistic Glory" Christmas gift book really helped Mary Queen as a community to form Eucharistic centered small groups to prepare for this Consecration! Many small groups and family units spent time in prayer and reflection through the month of January preparing for this moment. We especially consecrated our parish and our families to the Eucharistic Presence of Jesus.

There was wide participation within the archdiocese and 38 parishes represented! The non-Mary Queen parishioners composed of 15% of all attendees. Our neighboring parishes of St. Helen Church and St. Bernadette church represented the most. We had people that came from faraway places like Katy and Bay Town. It was truly an inspiration to see hundreds of people that participated, and I was so impressed by seeing their faith and longing for Jesus in the Eucharist.

I along with the National Eucharistic Congress Pilgrims – Sheri Barber, Steve and Evelyn Elsner, Matt and Barb Henderson, Leslie Karam, Becky Adam, Cindy Crosson, Erin Decuir, Marilyn Bullard and Eby Kurian planned and organized this Eucharistic Miracles Exhibition after months of careful planning since our return from the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. Almost 50 Volunteers served as monitors who helped to keep the sacredness of the space, protect the displays, and directed people in the St. Charbel Youth Center. Awesome team effort! I am more than grateful for this wonderful team, for their passion, dedication, and commitment to our parish.

God's timing and hands was very clearly seen in all of this during this past weekend as we celebrated the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord and the World Sunday of the Consecrated Life! What a great way to inaugurate the 'Jubilee 2025 – Pilgrims of Hope'!

God has more in store for us here in Mary Queen. Stay Tuned!

PRACTICING CATHOLIC

The Catch

Mini Reflection: What does it mean to lower your net? It means to listen to God, even when you don't understand Him. It means to keep trying the hard thing that you know is the right thing. It means to keep loving the person who is making life hard on you.

The Catch

I love today's Gospel passage, and not just because I love a good fish fry.

I love it because I am Peter. Over and over again, I am Peter, standing here exhausted because I relied on my own abilities, and it got me nowhere. I'm ready to call it quits. I'm ready to say it's too hard. And here comes Jesus, asking me to lower my net. To keep trying.

And I try to talk sense into him. "It's not going to work, God," I insist. "I've been trying."

"You've been trying," Jesus agrees. "But you haven't asked for my help yet."

What does it mean to lower your net? It sounds so simple and so easy, but it takes a great deal of humility and trust. I think I'm the expert on my own life, the captain of my own ship. Peter probably thought so, too — he was the fisherman, after all. Why would a fisherman listen to a carpenter on matters of fishing?

Lowering your net means giving God control and letting yourself be changed by what He chooses to show you.

It means to listen to God's instructions, even when you don't understand them, even when you find them frustrating. It means to keep trying the hard thing that you know is the right thing, even when it hasn't born much fruit. It means to keep loving the person who is making life hard on you, even when all you want to do is give into feelings of bitterness and distrust.

If we would only lower our nets, the catch would astound us.

PRAY & REFLECT

February 9, 2025 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 5:1-11

My parents' garage is full of old junk that no longer serves any purpose in my life. As a 46-year-old man, I admit that's pretty lame. Either due to my sentimentality or laziness (or both, probably), I just couldn't get myself to throw things away. But a few days ago, by a grace of God, I thought: "I'll hire my nephew Ryan to throw a bunch of my stuff away — he couldn't care less about my junk!" And you know what? It worked. In one day, Ryan chucked the majority of his uncle's useless stuff. I feel so free, ready for a new junk-free chapter in my life.

This kind of thing happens in this Sunday's Gospel. Peter's net is full of useless junk. Luke says he and the others are cleaning their nets after catching no fish. Imagine them dejectedly and impatiently removing a nasty assortment of seaweed, sticks and muck. The Lord teaches and calls them once their nets are cleared out. So it goes with us. Spiritual life begins by removing that which is useless and merely taking up space in our hearts, minds and lives. Then Jesus teaches and acts in a marvelous way in our lives, too.

So what's junking up your net? What habits, attachments, possessions, preoccupations? If, like me, you struggle to clean your nets by yourself, ask the Lord to send you someone like my nephew to be your "Peter" and help you clean it out. It is well worth it. Once Peter's net is clean, he is free to make a wonderful catch.






Archdiocesan Rite of Election - Volunteers Needed on Sunday, March 9, 2025



Priest Shortage

Question: Would optional celibacy help the priest shortage?

Answer:

This is a hotly debated topic. There are good arguments on both sides, and there is no clear answer that emerges. However, the shortage of clergy in denominations that do allow marriage would seem to indicate that optional celibacy is not the quick answer that some might think.

No one solution is perfect. Each one has its flaws and problems that are not easily solved. While optional celibacy would open ordination to some great men who are married, it also brings the problems of family, financial support, marital problems, and issues—good and bad—of childrearing. So it would not seem that optional celibacy is a realistic solution to the shortage of clergy.

With all of the varied challenges and problems facing the Church, it is easy to forget that the Holy Spirit leads us. Openness, dialogue, and education are second to our prayers and petitions to the Holy Spirit to make clear the path the Church should follow. A response that is rooted in a culture of political correctness is almost certainly doomed; a response that is rooted in prayer and in God cannot fail.

Everyday Stewardship

The Gift of the Mission

Early on in my work in parish ministry, I had to deal with a tough human resources situation, letting some staff members go and stepping into a role that demanded more of my time and energy.



In moments like this, stewardship can feel burdensome. Things take a turn we didn't evenest, perhaps in anits of our best

didn't expect, perhaps in spite of our best efforts. Maybe more is asked of us than we want or feel prepared to give.

But that's when we need to remember that stewardship isn't a job that we apply for. It's a gift bestowed directly from God, the Creator of all, and that can be scary all on its own, if we are preoccupied with our own unworthiness. What we might want to do is fall on our knees like Simon Peter and announce, "Depart from me, Lord — I am sinful."

But what if we stop looking in the mirror and look instead to God?

All those years ago, when I was faced with that ministerial challenge, I asked my wife to join me. What started as a tough situation turned into a decade of shared ministry with her — an experience I wouldn't trade for anything. It was a burden that became a gift.

We must remember that God knows what He is about. In His mercy, He gives us what we need as everyday stewards. When God calls out, "Whom shall we send?" we — in all our sinfulness — are allowed to cry out "Send me, Lord!" And He sends us out and behold — our nets tear with the bounty we harvest in His name.
