### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Parishioners,

In last weekend's bulletin I wrote about how soon the season of Lent was approaching. It is already here. It is a season of hope and new life through our Lenten disciplines of PRAYER, FASTING and ALMSGIVING. Let us reflect upon each of these three practices and see how they can help us. First, PRAYING. In the gospel for Ash Wednesday, we heard Jesus teaching his disciples to pray with a humble spirit, not to look for self-righteousness, but in the silence of our heart, connect ourselves to God, who is the source of all grace. God loves the humble of heart because it is only in humility that we know we need Him. In our effort to pray, I would like to recommend the following devotions: daily Mass, confession, the rosary, stations of the cross, and family night prayer together at least two or three times a week. In addition, read the daily gospel passage and reflect how you can apply it in your own personal life. Second, FASTING. When the concept of fasting comes to mind, many people immediately think of eating less than they normally would, but a few years ago Pope Francis introduced a new way of fasting:

Fast from hurting words and say kind words.

Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude.

Fast from anger and be filled with patience.

Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope.

Fast from worries and have trust in God.

Fast from complaints, contemplate simplicity.

Fast from pressures and be prayerful.

Fast from bitterness, fill your heart with joy.

Fast from selfishness and be compassionate.

Fast from grudges and be reconciled.

Fast from words, be silent and listen.

This way of fasting is not extraordinary spirituality, but it is common sense for Christians. It should have already been part of our lives. Third, ALMSGIVING. This spiritual practice acknowledges God's gifts to us and joyfully expresses our gratitude to him by caring for those in need. Not only does God give us enough, but he always gives us in abundance, much more than we need. The gift we share is the grace accumulated for ourselves in heaven. Let us use our gifts to "heal the brokenhearted," who are suffering one way or another. Our gifts to them will help alleviate their pain. Lent is a season of great spirituality if we consciously respond to Jesus' invitation to pray, fast, and give alms. Once again, these practices will help us to prepare ourselves for a newness of life in Jesus' resurrection.

## PRACTICING CATHOLIC

#### WHAT THE DEVIL DOESN'T HAVE

**Mini Reflection:** The devil knows that Jesus is human, so he uses all the best tricks he has for getting humans to break. The devil will try these things with us, too — this Lent, and throughout our lives. But how can we resist? We're only human. What do we have that the devil doesn't have?

#### What the Devil Doesn't Have

The devil knows all the rules. The devil knows all the Bible verses. He probably knows them better than you do (certainly better than I do).

He knows them so well that here, in today's Gospel, he thinks he can outsmart the Son of God. He thinks he can out-argue him.

See, the thing you need to know about the devil is that he could have a master's degree in theology. Maybe even a doctorate. But have you ever met a master's student, or even a doctoral one, who doesn't have a particular passion for what they're studying? I sure have.

The devil didn't rebel against God because he didn't understand God's will. He rebelled because he understood God's will perfectly — and he didn't like it.

The devil knows that Jesus is human, and so in today's Gospel he employs all the very best tricks he has for getting humans to break. Physical hunger. Insecurity and a desire for power. The yearning to appear learned and wise.

The devil will try these things with us, too — this Lent, and throughout our lives.

It doesn't work with Jesus, because, of course, Jesus is not just human. He can feel temptation, but he will not submit to it. But how are we supposed to do the same? We're not divine. We're just human.

Well, here's the thing. We may be only human, but as Christians, we have a secret weapon. (No, it's not a master's degree in theology. Some of you may have that, but it probably doesn't make you holier.)

We have a love of what the devil has renounced — those things belonging solely to God. Truth. Joy. Humility. Sanctifying sacrifice.

Let the love of those things carry you through this Lent, and beyond.

# **PRAY & REFLECT**

March 9, 2025 1st Sunday in Lent Luke 4:1-13

One of the most fascinating moments in American history is when George Washington could have become the king of the newly liberated United States and didn't. At the height of his power and fame, on Dec. 23, 1783, he resigned his commission as Commander-in-Chief, and went home. The astonished King of England remarked that in doing so, Washington was "the greatest man in the world." Greatness is often defined by what we could do but don't. Greatness is measured by the temptations we overcome.

Jesus' greatness is revealed in his victory over temptations, too. The three offered him by the devil contain, we might say, all potential possible temptations: food, power and fame. They correspond to the triple human needs of body, soul and spirit. In overcoming these three, he says "no" in essence to every and even the greatest temptation. We see that every desire of his humanity — body, soul and spirit — is perfectly united to God, to love. This is a power available to each member of his body. It is the path to true greatness. How can we, who so easily fall into even small temptations, find the power to overcome large ones? By entering into the great dynamics of Jesus' temptations.

Lenten challenge: This first week of Lent, list some concrete ways you can overcome temptations that correspond with your desires. For example, you may give up snacks between meals, choose not to participate in an activity of which you are an expert, and decide to reduce social media posting by 50%. It may not seem like much, but by saying "no" to the tyranny of food, power, and fame (in this example), you'll discover true greatness.



On this first Sunday of Lent, and after a period of formation of the Catechumens' and Candidates' minds and hearts, these rites are celebrated - The Rite of Sending and The Rite of Election and the Call of Continuing Conversion. In Sacred Scripture, the Book of Revelation makes reference to a "Book of Life." in which are written the names of those who have chosen to follow the Lord, Jesus and be Baptized. The Rite of Sending, held during the Sunday, March 9th at 11:30 am Holy Mass Youth & Adult Catechumens are invited to come forward and sign a book, which we call the "Book of the Elect," as a sign of their desire to be numbered among the chosen of God. Those who are already Baptized had our names written in the Book of Life at our Baptism. The Adult Candidates are called to Continuing Conversion and state their intention to be fully initiated and share in the Eucharist table. This Rite offers Mary Queen's community an opportunity to acknowledge the spiritual progress the Catechumens and Candidates have made, express approval of their elections or recognition, and send them forth to our Cardinal/Bishop with assurance of our care and support. Across the entire world, Catholic Bishops welcome those sent by the parish to gather together with their Godparents and Sponsors in what is known as the Rite of Election and the Call to Continuing Conversion. The Archdiocesan Rite of Election and the Call of Continuing Conversion, held on Sunday, March 9th at 7:00 pm hosted by us at Mary Queen, celebrates the Lord's choosing of men, women, and children who, with the help of the Church, acknowledge God's election of them for the Sacraments of Initiation - Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist and preparation to be received into Full Communion. These Rites mark the beginning of the final period of intensive Scriptural preparation of the Elect and Candidates prior to celebrating Sacraments at the Easter Vigil and during the Easter Season.





#### Answer:


You've already taken the first step by going on the parish retreat. It is important for us to "tune up" our faith, taking some time to renew ourselves through prayer, meditation and education. By deepening our knowledge and understanding of faith, we are often better attuned to its richness and meaning for our life. Lent is an intense retreat, a forty-day period of reflection and penance that prepares us to celebrate the passion, death and resurrection of Christ. Our communication with God and our awareness of him is the purpose of prayer. Setting aside extra time each day helps intensify the season. Prayer includes daily Mass, Stations of the Cross, communal penance services and private confession. Making restitution for sin as well as disciplining our hearts and minds to focus on God is the purpose of penance. It helps us restore a sense of balance to our souls, thrown off kilter by sin. Penance includes personal sacrifice, self-denial, fasting, almsgiving and charitable works. Finally, spiritual practices help us sharpen our understanding and insight into the meaning and understanding of our faith. When you take your faith seriously, you do what is necessary to follow Jesus more closely, to integrate your life and your faith more carefully.
