"Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." John 8:7

My Dear Parishioners,

This is a powerful line spoken by Jesus. The Pharisees place Jesus in a dilemma in the gospel passage, where a woman was caught in the act of committing adultery. Jesus responds to them by touching their conscience: "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Jesus' approach is not legal like that of the scribes and the Pharisees but is moral and personal. Towards the end of the gospel, He condemns the sin of adultery, but He forgives the sinful adulteress. In other words, He teaches us: "To hate the sin," but love and forgive the sinner because He says: "Has no one condemned you? Neither do I condemn you." He is compassionate because He gives us another chance to repent and sin no more and challenges us to a life of holiness.

First, let us look at this woman. She was humiliated. She had committed sin, was caught, and was publicly presented to all as a sinner. How did she react? She did not resist. She did not remain in denial. She did not get angry. She did not fight back. Instead, she stood there humiliated, awaiting her punishment with a sorrowful heart. Humiliation over one's sins is a powerful experience that has the potential to bring forth true repentance. "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her," Jesus is not justifying her sin. Rather, He is making it clear that no one holds the right of condemnation. No one. Not even the religious leaders. This is hard teaching to practice for many people in our world today. It is commonplace for the headlines in the media to almost present us compulsively with the most sensational sins of others. We are constantly being tempted to be outraged at what this or that person has done. We easily shake our heads, condemn them, and treat them as if they were dirt. In fact, it seems that many people today see it as their duty to act as the "watchdogs" against every sin they can dig up on others.


Let us reflect this week upon whether we are more like the Pharisees or Jesus. Would we have stood there in the crowd wanting this humiliated woman to be stoned? How about today? When we hear about the manifest sins of others, do we find ourselves condemning them? Or do we hope that mercy is shown to them? Let us seek to imitate the compassionate heart of our divine Lord; and when our time of judgment comes, we also will be shown an abundance of compassion.

BENEATH THE SURFACE

Mini Reflection: Too often, we don't care about righteousness or truth. We just care about being right. We have a terrible tendency to see only decisions, and in doing so we dehumanize the people behind them. But when God looks at us, he sees more than the worst decisions we've ever made.

The Allure of Being Right

It wasn't a real question.

"The law of Moses says we should stone her. What do you say?" the Pharisees asked Jesus as they brought the adulterous woman before him. But they weren't really asking. They didn't care what Jesus' answer was. They didn't ask his opinion because they wanted to know. They asked because they wanted to use his words against him.

Righteousness, truth — that wasn't the goal. The goal was being right.

And in the middle of the whole scene, dragged before Jesus, used as a literal prop in this staged drama, is a woman. A real flesh-and-blood woman.

I find myself wanting to know more about her. She had been "caught in the act," they claimed, but I wonder what that even means. With whom was this act committed, and what were the reasons for her participation in it? Was she coerced? Was she scared? Was she confused? Was it really a cut-and-dry, black-and-white situation of adultery, of lust, of making the wrong decision?

We will never know the answers to these questions, and it doesn't matter — it's not our business. God knows the answers. God knows the truth of the matter: what she did, what she chose, what she felt. Because she wasn't a prop to Him. She was a person.

When God looks at us, he sees more than the worst decisions we've ever made.

I worry that we use one another as props even today, when we try like the Pharisees to illustrate "What is Right." We have a terrible tendency to see only decisions, and in doing so we dehumanize the people behind them.

PRAY & REFLECT

April 6, 2025 5th Sunday in Lent John 8:1-11

"The scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle" (John 8:3). Why do they make her stand in the middle? Why not expose her on the periphery? The reason is something that affects us practically every day.

The center is what stabilizes a community's identity. We humans tend to center ourselves around an accused and condemned victim — though we rarely admit it. This renews our fragile communities and our power as those who weaponize the accusation. This is effective because it is often a victim who represents something truly dangerous for the group. In this case, adultery stands for the breakdown of a community and those within it, because it forces questions like: who is my father? Whose child is this? Is this child one of us, or that of an outsider? The accusers place the adulteress in the center because their community, like most, is built around turning an enemy into a victim.

Once you understand this, you'll see it almost anywhere humans group together (families, politics, workplaces, sports, schools, etc.). The good news is Jesus exposes this dynamic by deftly pointing out the sin-infected hearts of everyone besides the woman. They all leave, symbolizing the breakdown of the old order, and she is "left alone before him." A new community has begun, structured around the merciful love of Christ.

What is in your center? What is in the center of our parish and family communities? Strive to center on Christ's forgiveness, and we experience the new, lasting community we call the Church.

Nothing we do is separated from our interior state. Everything we do is the result of our interior state. Our interior state is what drives all of our exterior actions either good or bad. This is what the Catechism means when it teaches that the soul is "the innermost aspect of man" (CCC, ¶363). In his highly influential book, Soul of the Apostolate, Jean-Baptiste Chautard writes that "good works should be the overflow of the interior life" (pg. 52). In short, if our interior life is cultivated, good works will flow from us; if our interior life is neglected, our works will reflect that neglect.






La Salette Laity Reflection for the 5th Sunday of Lent April 6th

In today's Gospel, we begin with a seemingly simple statement that could easily be overlooked: "Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. But early in the morning he arrived again in the temple area." While the Gospel doesn't explicitly say why Jesus went to the Mount of Olives, we might imagine that it was a moment for him to pray, to seek strength and clarity for the challenges ahead in his earthly journey.

Upon returning to the temple, Jesus is immediately confronted by the scribes and Pharisees, who bring a woman caught in adultery, quoting the law which prescribes stoning as the punishment. But Jesus doesn't engage in their trap. Instead, he cuts straight to the heart of the matter. He invites those without sin to cast the first stone. In this moment, Jesus does not condemn the woman, but instead offers her forgiveness.

This Gospel resonates deeply with the message of Mary at La Salette: to pray, turn away from sin, and return to Christ. No sin is too great to be forgiven. With a conversion of heart, we experience the depth and abundance of Christ's love, a love that is always ready to heal and restore.





Question:

If someone is interested in becoming a priest, how does he go about it?

Answer:

Discerning a vocation can happen in any number of ways. It might come as a surprise to the person called or to family or friends. Sometimes it is a gradual process, and other times it is as quick and bright as lightning. Regardless of how it starts, a vocation to the priesthood or religious life requires a process of discerning, testing, and preparing. The best place to begin would be with lots of prayer, receiving the sacraments, and attending daily Mass whenever possible. Then talk to your pastor or a priest you know and trust. Your diocese may have a vocation director who can provide you with guidance and information. The Serra Club is also a great resource for information and contacts to help you discern if indeed God is calling you. Remember that many young Catholic men have considered the priesthood. Some are ordained and others realize this is not their calling. However, we are all called to be of service to others as we practice our faith. These are extraordinary times in which we live, and they require an extraordinary witness to faith and to God's presence in the world. Our work, our ministry as Catholics, is to be the body of Christ with and for others. The Church needs priests. If God calls you to ordained service in the church, He will provide the grace, direction, and support you need. Just listen and respond with all your heart, mind, and soul.
