## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

### Month of May- Month of Mary!

My Dear Parishioners,

For centuries, the Catholic Church has set aside the entire month of May to honor Mary, Mother of God. It is a special time for Catholics to pay homage to our Blessed Mother. Contrary to misconceptions, we do not worship her, but as Catholics we honor her. There are four Marian dogmas, divinely revealed truths about Mary. They are Mary's Divine Motherhood, the Immaculate Conception, Perpetual Virginity and the Assumption. In spite of what we and who we are, in spite of our woundedness, in spite of our political division, in spite of our economic crisis, in spite of our problems at home, there is always hope and God shows us that hope through Mary.

Looking back on my childhood days, I can undoubtedly say that prayer, especially our family devotion to the Blessed Mother was the centerpiece of growing up in my family, which contributed to my vocation to priesthood. We could never be excused from the daily family prayer, which lasted close to an hour in the evenings, and we never missed praying the rosary. It was literally true for that the "family that prayed together stayed together." We are a happy family together. While I was growing up in India, we went to our parish to pray the rosary every evening in May, followed by a special novena to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Besides this devotion, what I remember most is the custom of sharing a special meal prepared for the season. Traditionally known as "pachoru," a traditional Christian delicacy in Kerala, it is raw rice cooked in coconut milk with jaggery syrup served after the prayer every evening in May.

Here at Mary Queen, we began the month-long celebration with a "May Crowning" on May 2nd at 8:30 am Mass. Although I was away leading a pilgrimage to Italy during this Jubilee Year, I saw children as well as the adults who processed with the celebrant holding flowers in their hands and crowning the beautiful statue of the Blessed Mother placed on a pedestal in the sanctuary of the church. Devotion to Mary is an integral part of Catholic identity. Because of our devotion to her, many people ask for help in the most difficult moments of life as any child would with his or her mother. Mary cares for all of us daily without fail, interceding for us even in the tiniest matters. We have the beautiful practice of praying the rosary after the daily Mass in church every day and on weekend morning Masses, which all of us are welcome to participate in. May the Blessed Mother intercede for us in our journey of faith.

## **PRACTICING CATHOLIC**

### The Witnesses of What Makes No Sense

**Mini Reflection:** Love — again, even when it doesn't make sense. Forgive — again, even when it doesn't make sense. Believe — again, even when it doesn't make sense. To follow the risen Christ, you must be willing to do what makes no sense.

The Witnesses of What Makes No Sense

It never fails to amuse me that the disciples in today's Gospel don't recognize Jesus until he asks them to do something that makes absolutely no logical sense.

He's just some random stranger on the shore — until he gives them an order that, in any other circumstances, would have them rolling their eyes into the backs of their head: Drop the nets again. I know you haven't caught anything all night. I know you're tired. Just do it one more time. Trust me. Again.

That's when they recognize him.

The disciples display such poor recognition of Jesus after the resurrection. I'm sure there's a good, theologically sound reason for it, one I am not smart enough to explain. Whatever that reason is, it's very clear that God was carefully orchestrating these moments of realization. He is trying to tell us something about how we recognize the risen Christ — the one who has conquered sin, the one whose love was stronger than death. The one who never made any sense, and never will, because his kingdom is not of this world, and to understand him — to recognize him — you have to detach from the priorities, the expectations, the limitations of this present world.

You have to be willing to do what makes no sense.

Love — again, even when it doesn't make sense. Forgive — again, even when it doesn't make sense. Believe — again, even when it doesn't make sense.

"We are the witnesses of these things," Peter tells the Sanhedrin (Acts 5:32). Peter, who was so full of joy when he recognized Jesus that he leapt into the sea, fully clothed, desperate to be near him.

It makes no sense, and that's okay. That's kind of our whole thing, as Christians. We are the witnesses of the things that make no sense.

# **PRAY & REFLECT**

### May 4th, 2025 3rd Sunday of Easter John 21:1 - 19

I eat breakfast. If I don't have something substantial, I'm fading by midmorning. Breakfast is my key meal because it sets up my physical wellbeing for the rest of the day.

Spiritually speaking, we need sustenance to get us going. This is true for the Apostles in this Sunday's remarkable Gospel reading. The risen Jesus makes his third appearance to them in the early morning light and calls, "Come, have breakfast" (John 21:12). The exhausted and cold fishermen sit, and he feeds them bread and fish as the dawn breaks. They are overwhelmed by his presence to the point of awestruck silence. As they eat, their bodies and their hearts come alive. Once refreshed by their morning meal, they will be ready to feed others — indeed, the whole world — with the love of the risen Jesus. But first, they need breakfast from him.

Do you realize how essential early morning prayer is? Jesus desires to refresh us every morning with his word of love, with his grace-filled presence. This week, hear Jesus calling to you: "Come, have breakfast!" Embrace some form of spiritual, meditative practice each morning for spiritual strength to get you going.

### **Responding to God**

### Question:

I can't explain it. I feel a nudge from God to something out of the ordinary. How do I respond?

### Answer:

You're in good company! Abraham was asked to leave all he knew and loved for a strange land, with only abstract divine assurance that such a sacrifice would be worth it. Plenty of prophets protested against God's call, whether it was claiming they were too young (Jeremiah) or running away entirely, only to end up in a whale's belly (Jonah). St. Joseph was asked to do something very strange. He was asked to believe — on the word of an angelic appearance in a dream — that his betrothed was pregnant not from another man, but by a miraculous intervention of God. Then he was called to marry her.

Author Flannery O'Connor once wrote, "You shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you odd." Sometimes God's invitation might seem strange or challenging. It might require sacrifices we never expected to make. Our life might look different than we had always imagined. But as we all know, life throws its own curveballs, regardless of whether or not we're listening for God's will. Better, one would think, to be open to the promptings of God and to follow along the strange trails that they lead. We have the assurance that, eventually, we will find green pastures.

### Gifts in Disguise

Have you ever opened a gift and wondered what the giver was thinking?



I won't call out any of my family or friends here, but suffice to say, I think we have all been the confused recipient of a sweater that wasn't our size or a gift card to a store

where we don't shop. But we smiled all the same and said how much it meant to us, because we know that when it comes to gifts, it's all about the gesture.

Suffering is a lot like that — the gift you never asked for, and don't really want to receive. Sometimes we look at suffering and, like the apostles who see Jesus as a stranger on the shore, we don't recognize it for what it can be. We don't appreciate the catalyst suffering can be for change, for growth, for grace.

What was the gift that you received in disguise? Was it a relationship that confounded and frustrated you? Was it a job that tested your spirit? An obstacle that stopped you dead in your tracks? A rejection that threatened to break your spirit?

If I go back and look at the worst gifts I've ever gotten, chances are that I didn't like them because I didn't know what to do with them — they were more fitted for someone else's interests, someone else's life. It's the same with suffering. We're tempted to cast suffering aside when it comes our way because it doesn't fit the person we are. Suffering is made to fit the person God knows we have the ability, with His grace, to become.

Hang onto that suffering. Unlike the misshapen sweater, it really will come in handy.
