## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### My Dear Parishioners,

This is a season of holiness. It is holy because our parish had a beautiful celebration of a special Mass for 85 children who received Holy Communion for the first time last Saturday morning. Praise the Lord! Congratulations to them and to their families. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all their parents, grandparents, godparents, and family members who have cared so much for them by taking them to church and classes. This precious investment in their children's faith will certainly produce much fruit in many ways in their children's future. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank all their catechists and the entire Faith Formation team for their great work. Their sacrifice for and contribution to the faith of these young souls is greatly appreciated. You might not know it, but what you teach them now is the faith foundation upon which they will build their life. As a priest for 31 years, the Mass of the First Holy Communion is always very inspiring for me. I feel like I am on cloud nine at the moment seeing the children behaved and dressed very nicely extending their hands to receive Jesus in the form of bread and wine. It is hard to put into words my joy for them and their families. ## From the death of Pope Francis to the election of the new Pope Leo XIV

With heavy yet prayerful hearts, we mourn the passing of our beloved Holy Father, Pope Francis. In this moment of great loss, we give thanks for the life of a shepherd who embodied the Gospel with humility, mercy, and an unwavering faith in God's boundless love. From the very beginning of his papacy, Pope Francis called us to embrace the Lord's command to evangelize, urging us in Evangelii Gaudium (The Joy of the Gospel) to go forth boldly, reaching out to all people and proclaiming the Good News with renewed fervor. His witness has profoundly shaped our own mission, inspiring us to be a Church that is not turned in on itself but one that goes out, serving the poor, welcoming the lost and walking alongside all who seek Christ.

Habemus Papam! Cardinal Robert Prevost was elected as the first USborn pontiff Thursday, May 8th and will be known as Pope Leo XIV. The 69-year-old from Chicago stepped into his role as the 267th pope on the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica on Thursday evening, addressing thousands of cheering Catholics with the words: "Peace be with you all." #### RESEMBLING JESUS

**Mini Reflection**: When we love someone, we want to be associated with them. We want to be recognized as theirs somehow. And if we love Christ, we should want to be known as belonging to him. We should want those who see us to know we are his.

#### **Resembling Jesus**

I once wrote an article about several women residents of a local nursing home. In researching the piece, I discovered that they had grown up in the same neighborhood as my grandmother, and that one of the women was, in fact, my grandmother's dearest childhood friend.

When I visited this woman to take her photograph, she took a long look at my face, and I could see in her eyes that she was reaching back in her memory across the years.

She said: "You resemble her." I wept on the way home.

My grandmother died when I was nine, and for the last several years of her life she suffered from Alzheimer's disease. I have always deeply grieved the time we lost, the relationship we could have had. I have hazy fragments of memory from before her illness that lead me to believe we loved each other very much.

Being told I look like my grandmother by someone who knew her well — being identified as belonging to her in some way — was one of the more beautiful things to happen to me.

When we love someone, we want to be associated with them. We want to be recognized as theirs somehow. And if we love Christ, we should want to be known as belonging to him. We should want those who see us to know we are his.

The only way we can resemble Jesus is through love. It is his most recognizable quality, his most famous trait. This is how all will know that you are my disciples.

As Catholics, we are always talking about finding ways to live our faith boldly, unapologetically, publicly. Good — we should! But if we want people to know we are Catholic, we should love them. Bravely. Recklessly. Sacrificially.

As he loves us.

# **PRAY & REFLECT**

#### May 18th, 2025 5th Sunday of Easter John 13:31-35

I've always found it amazing that Jesus never says to his disciples the straightforward and bumper stickery words "I love you" or "I will always love you" (a la Dolly Parton's song). Why doesn't Jesus say, "I love you"?

Well, actually he does, but in particular ways. He says, "As the Father loves me, so I love you" (John 15:9) thereby rooting his love for us in the space of the Holy Trinity. This week he commands, "Love another as I have loved you" (John 13:34). He presents his love for us as a completed action which continues into the present moment. How has he loved us? By becoming one of us, one with us, and finally giving his life for us in his suffering on the cross. We weren't there when he did that, but neither were his Apostles (except one). Still, that action is his great "I love you" to us.

His love is also hedged in a command: "Love one another." So how can we practically follow it? The great St. John XXIII wrote in his diary that each day he followed this rule: "Only for today, I will do one good deed and not tell anyone about it." The hidden nature of a good deed is a sign that it is truly loving. This week, take on St. John XXIII's practical method of following Jesus' great commandment of love. It's a splendid way to say, "I love you."

We have reached the 4<sup>th</sup> period of the OCIA process, which is the Neophyte year. All those who received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist) on Easter Vigil are called neophytes in this period, until the anniversary of their initiation next Easter. All those who made the Profession of Faith and received the Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Eucharist on Easter Vigil are called newly received .The final period of regular weekly formation extends through the Easter season until May 15<sup>th</sup> on Thursday nights. This post-baptismal catechesis is called Mystagogy. It is a time for deepening the Christian experience, especially in the appreciation for the sacramental life, for spiritual growth, and for entering more fully into the life and unity of the Catholic community. The neophytes now share with Christ, and his Body in the Mary Queen parish community, the intimate communion of the Eucharist. Now they have access to all the means of sanctification. We as Mary Queen parish community pledge to help them grow and mature in the Christian life and to develop a genuine Catholic worldview. Please pray for all those who God has called us to join us as we continue on our pilgrimage to our Father in Heaven.

#### Good and Evil

#### Question:

If God is good, why is there evil in the world?

#### Answer:

The problem of evil is perplexing. If God is all-powerful and all-good, why doesn't He stop bad things from happening? He must either not be all-powerful, or perhaps He's not very good after all. Human beings have faced the possibility of evil since the very beginning of our existence. In granting us free will, God gives us the ability to make free choices. God does not force us into moral perfection. We are not forced to love Him or to love our neighbor. We must make the decision ourselves. This means, of course, that we have the ability to choose against love.

One small decision of selfishness, jealously, or pride may not seem so bad. But every decision — good or bad — is like a stone dropped into a still pond. The ripples extend much farther than the original stone. When decisions against love begin to compound, they affect families, neighborhoods, and nations. This is all the more reason for Christians to be faithful to our baptismal call to love one another as Christ has loved us!

"There's something different about you."

Think about the times in your life when this has been said to you. Maybe it was after someone complimented you on a job well done, and you realized that you were

walking through life with a little more confidence. Maybe it was after meeting someone special, as you carried the glow of that relationship wherever you went. Chances are, if someone has noticed something different about you, it's because, inwardly, you've been changed by the loving or respectful actions of another person.

Love, you see, can make us into new creations. From the love of God flows the grace to tackle any challenge, including the biggest challenge of all: loving each other well.
