

### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

### My Dear Parishioners,

We are celebrating the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is a basic doctrine of faith in Christianity—understandable not with our heads, but with our hearts. It teaches us that there are three distinct Persons in one God, sharing the same Divine Nature, coequal and co-eternal. Our minds cannot grasp this doctrine, which teaches that 1 + 1 + 1 = 1, not 3. But we believe in this mystery because Jesus, who is God, taught it clearly, the Evangelists recorded it, the Fathers of the Church tried to explain it, and the Councils of Nicaea and Constantinople defined it as a dogma of the Christian faith. A dogma is an official teaching of the Catholic Church, which Christians are called to believe and follow. All prayers in the Church begin in the name of the Holy Trinity and end glorifying the Trinity. All the sacraments are administered—we are baptized, confirmed, anointed, our sins are forgiven, our marriages are blessed, and our bishops, priests, and deacons are ordained—in the name of the Holy Trinity.

The Holy Trinity, whose feast we celebrate today, is beyond the reach of time and the grasp of human reasoning. "Two is company; three is a crowd" is a popular expression. The Gospel would have it otherwise. There, the figure three symbolizes completeness and reappears at all the key moments of the Christ story. His life itself constantly reflected the Trinity. Three figures make up the nativity scene in Bethlehem—the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Their first visitors were the three wise men. Later, in the desert, preparing to begin his public life, Jesus was tempted three times by the devil. A good story has a beginning, a middle, and an end. Christ was a storyteller par excellence, and the number three features prominently in his parables: the Prodigal Son is about a father and his two sons; the Good Samaritan tells of three passers-by—the priest, the Levite, and the Samaritan; the Sower sowed his seed in three different types of soil, yielding three different levels of harvest.

At the end of his life, as at the beginning, the number three appears again: during his Passion, Peter denied him three times; on the road to Calvary, he fell three times; and the crucifixion scene has three figures—Christ between two thieves. Before his Resurrection, he spent three days in the tomb

In the seventeenth chapter of the Gospel of John, Jesus prays for his disciples—and he prays for us. He asks the Father to protect the disciples. He tells them that they are in the world, but not of the world. He asks God to consecrate them in truth. And he says, "Your word is truth." We are living in the Truth. The world needs people of truth—the truth of God. Our lives should reflect the Trinity. We should always be creative like the Father, compassionate like the Son, and dispose of our talents in the service of others like the Holy Spirit.

When I was studying theology in the seminary, we had many classes on the topic of the Holy Trinity. But none of them gave us a full understanding of the concept of the Trinity—because it is, and always will be, a mystery. The Gospel concludes with Jesus saying to his disciples—and to us:

"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

**Mini Reflection**: Why do we love mysteries so much? Because God is a mystery. And that's never as clear as it is today, on the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity, the mystery that boondoggles us all. Four relations. Three persons. One God.

### The Best Kind of Mystery

"Do you have a mystery for me to solve?"

If I've heard it once, I've heard it a hundred times. My daughter is obsessed with mysteries. It's not enough for her to read about them in the pages of every Nancy Drew book she can get her hands on. She wants more than that. She wants a real-life mystery. A puzzle that resists being solved. A question that eludes an answer. Something that isn't easy to wrap her head around.

And not surprisingly, she's not satisfied with the "mysteries" I can offer her. The Mystery of Mom's Missing Hair Tie (spoiler alert: it was in my purse). The Mystery of the Missing Lunch Ham (oops, Mom finished it).

Simple answers are so boring. "Will I ever have a real mystery?" she moans.

I get it. We're all this way, really. We are drawn to the mysterious, to the inscrutable. It's because we know that the answers to the really big questions are ones that can't be explained in a neat and tidy way. We know that the reality of life and love and the human condition is something we can't quite fit our heads around. We know that there is so much in this world, in this universe, that we can't...understand. So, in a way, mysteries are the only things that really make sense to us.

Why do we love mysteries so much? Because God is a mystery. And that's never as clear as it is today, on the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity, the mystery that boondoggles us all. Four relations. Three persons. One God.

Don't ask me to explain it. I could, but I don't have the word space, and frankly, it might not even make sense then. It's a mystery, you see. A real one. The best kind.

## PRAY & REFLECT

June 15th, 2025 The Most Holy Trinity John 16:12-15

I am amazed at how my four siblings teach their many kids in age-appropriate ways. For example, now that my nephew Brandon is 24 years of age, they give him insights and freedoms that would have been positively confounding or even dangerous when he was a toddler. Imagine if they had taught him at age four how to drive a car, use a credit card online, or handle power tools. But eventually, they did, and he is a high functioning young man, I'm proud to say. They are good teachers.

This week we learn that Jesus teaches us in a similar way. He says to his Apostles, "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now" (John 16:12). How disappointing for them. But imagine at that moment, before his resurrection and ascension, if the Lord had started telling them about synods and sacraments, popes and parishes, martyrs and monasteries, rosaries and relics, catechisms and crucifixes? They would have been absolutely overwhelmed, confused, and discouraged. He tells them what they need to know, when it is time for them to know it.

So he does for us. Jesus has unceasingly taught the Church as she matures through the centuries, just as he teaches you and me through our lives in ways we can understand. Our task should be to learn what he is teaching us now, knowing that (although revelation per se is complete in him and his Apostles), he never ceases to teach us as we spiritually mature. Be confident: he knows what you are ready to learn now.



### Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (formerly *RCIA*) is the normative process by which adults are gradually introduced to the Catholic faith and sacramental life. Rooted in Sacred Scripture, guided by the Catechism of the Catholic Church, and sustained by prayer and the support of the Christian community, this journey mirrors the ancient catechumenal formation of the early Church (cf. RCIA, nos. 1–5).


This process is intended for:

**Unbaptized adults**, who seek to receive the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist.

**Baptized non-Catholic Christians**, who desire to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church through a profession of faith, Confirmation, and the Eucharist.

**Baptized Catholics**, who have not yet completed their sacraments of initiation (Confirmation and/or First Holy Communion).


Bring a reusable water bottle labeled with your camper's name.

DAY ONE: All parents please plan to remain for 15 minutes!





### **Sunday Mass**



Answer: The practice of hanging a rosary or a religious medal off of the rearview mirror of one's car is a fairly popular custom across many cultures. While there is no particular rule approving or condemning this practice, we should also be mindful of the respect and reverence due to religious objects and devotional items (i.e. sacramentals).

An important point to consider would be the reason why one chooses to place a rosary or religious medal in our cars. Is it a reminder of the protection and intercession of Mary and the saints? Does it encourage us to be mindful of God's presence, even in such a mundane task as driving? Is it an outward expression of our more private devotions?

One advantage of having a rosary or religious medal in our cars is that it can also serve as a reminder to pray when we travel, asking for protection for ourselves and for other motorists or commuters. Certainly, invoking the protection and prayers of the saints is a wonderful practice for families, helping to reinforce our belief in the communion of saints and the care and concern we owe to one another.

# Everyday Stewardship Up to the Job

Have you ever had a job for which you didn't feel qualified? I think we all have, whether it was a paying gig or not. A lot of us parents often feel in awe of the magnitude of that role and lose sleep

worrying that we made the wrong decision in one situation or a bad call in another. Some of us feel intimidated by what our communities need from us, on the parish level or in our personal relationships. Or maybe we are simply dreading a task that seems too big, too overwhelming — that necessary basement cleanout, or the weekly organization of family schedules.

When we don't feel qualified, we don't want to do the work. We get stuck in our own fear. That's the birthplace of procrastination, self-doubt and bitterness. When we look inward at our own abilities, we can only see all the traits that aren't there. The intelligence, the dexterity, the ambition — whatever it is we lack, we get stuck on it.

I've got good news and bad news. I'll start with the bad news: none of us are qualified for the call of discipleship. We simply aren't. We don't have the love or grace or strength to get the job done.

Now I'll give you the good news: God knows this, and He doesn't care. Stewardship does not insist that we possess every good quality — no, as a way of life, stewardship recognizes that we lack so many qualities. But it shows us where to find the love and grace and strength we need. Stewardship does not demand that we know every answer; it merely reminds us who to ask when we don't.
