FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Parishioners,

On June 22nd, we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. Corpus Christi is Latin for "the Body of Christ." At its core, the solemnity is a celebration of the tradition and belief in the Eucharist as the Real Presence of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Our worship of Jesus in His Body and Blood calls us to offer to God our Father a pledge of undivided love and an offering of ourselves to the service of others.

Very often after Mass, when I stand at the narthex by the door to greet parishioners, I hear people saying, "Father, that was a beautiful Mass." I also hear from people of other parishes who come and tell me about how beautiful their Mass was in their own churches. This makes me pause and think for a moment: What do you mean when you say that it was a beautiful Mass? Is it the beautiful music? Or is it the great homily by the priest? Are you referring to the beautifully decorated church and the altar? Are you referring to the handsome and beautiful altar servers—or is it the priest who is handsome, young, and energetic? Or is it the beautiful flowers and the smell of the incense? What really makes you say that the Mass is good?

My next question would be: Is there a Mass that is not good—not rich, low, and not high? The truth is that all Masses are good and beautiful. The beauty, greatness, goodness, height, and depth of the Mass do not come from human beings. There is no difference whether the Mass is celebrated at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome or in a small chapel in a remote village. Whenever, wherever, and by whomever the Mass is celebrated, all of them hold equal value, goodness, greatness, and beauty because the Mass is the action of God. The Mass is the Word of God. Therefore, wherever God is present, there is a great celebration of a good Mass.

We Catholics believe in the Real Presence of God in the Eucharist. We don't come to church just to hear the beautiful music or to listen to an eloquent homily from the priest, but to experience the action of God. That is why the priest repeats what the Lord said at the Last Supper: "This is my body. This is my blood." I have heard many young people say that the Mass is boring. They don't understand much, and there is nothing to take home after the Mass. I am 62 years old and have been a priest for 31 years, and I humbly admit that I don't understand everything. But I can say this with confidence: I feel blessed, loved, and cared for. When your faith is strong, the Mass will be the most beautiful part of your day. So, my advice would be: keep on coming, keep on participating, and keep on receiving Jesus. There is no need to fully understand-just have faith. At the end of the day, all you want is to be like Jesus.

The Second Vatican Council chose the term "People of God" to renew emphasis upon the vital role of the laity in the life and mission of the Church. Each baptized Catholic has responsibility for building up the Kingdom of God, as each is called to the priestly, prophetic, and kingly functions of Jesus Christ. Parish pastoral councils undertake a vital task of co-responsibility with the pastor to foster the spiritual growth of our faith community. Our archdiocese requires every parish to have this council.

The Mary Queen Pastoral Council is a consultative body whose primary responsibility is to provide counsel to Fr. Thomas on matters related to pastoral plans and policies. Our council consists of 10-12 members. New members are discerned onto the council annually with each member serving 3 years. This year, that discernment process will take place on Saturday, September 20, 2025. A call for nominations will be issued in August.

Mary Queen is indeed a community, inspired by faith and love, that lives, worships, teaches, welcomes, and supports one another in imitation of Christ. Our continued spiritual growth lies in part on parishioners willing to serve on the council. On Saturday, July 19, 2025, from 9-11 AM, an information meeting will be held. As the Day Was Drawing to a Close

It isn't uncommon for me to get to the noon hour only to realize that I haven't yet eaten anything that day.

It drives my husband crazy. He was raised by a bunch of Italian women, so he can't help but think three meals ahead. And don't get me wrong, I love food — I literally dream of donuts. But some days, I'm just so busy and I keep putting it off until I realize how weak I feel, how light-headed. And I think to myself: Stupid, you've done it again.

This is what comes to mind today, on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, as I read the Gospel account of the miracle of the loaves and fishes.

I think of hunger, distraction and the poor planning of those who pride themselves on being capable.

"As the day was drawing to a close," it is written — that's when the disciples finally realized that 5,000 hangry people is not an ideal situation.

I wonder, did Jesus roll his eyes when they came to him, and think, "Finally"? At any point he could have pulled out a fish and said a blessing. But he waited for them to ask. He waited for them to realize how badly they needed it.

Sometimes we forget that we need the Eucharist. It's not just a nice thing to have, a sweet act of devotion, a sacramental item that bolsters our faith. The Eucharist is none of those things. The Eucharist is the food without which we will die. The Eucharist is something we must seek out. Remember: the day is drawing to a close.

PRAY & REFLECT

June 22nd, 2025 The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Luke 9:11-17

A Catholic friend of mine occasionally says, "The Eucharist is not a noun. It's a verb." In so saying, he is making the point that the Eucharist isn't simply Jesus' bodily presence given to us in holy Communion. It also manifests the dynamic pattern by which Christ actively loves and saves us. He teaches us to cooperate with that pattern. This Eucharist actually embodies four verbs: Jesus takes, blesses, breaks, and gives. Let's consider each one.

He takes: Do we acknowledge that we are totally in God's hands? Do we receive everything in our lives as a gift, and act responsibly with it?

He blesses: Do we actively reflect that Jesus makes us holy in our baptism? Do we embrace our bodies and souls as temples of God, worthy of love, peace, and joy?

He breaks: Do we run from failure and disappointment, from getting old or being ignored? Are we too worried about getting hurt or sick? Do we embrace our sufferings with confidence?

He gives: Are we willing to make our lives a gift for others? Are we confident that we will always have enough love to give to others, that God will always provide enough for us? Do we rejoice in giving away what we have to others, expecting nothing in return? This is the dynamic life the Eucharist empowers us to live.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (formerly *RCIA*) is the normative process by which adults are gradually introduced to the Catholic faith and sacramental life. Rooted in Sacred Scripture, guided by the Catechism of the Catholic Church, and sustained by prayer and the support of the Christian community, this journey mirrors the ancient catechumenal formation of the early Church (cf. RCIA, nos. 1–5).

This process is intended for:

Unbaptized adults, who seek to receive the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist.

Baptized non-Catholic Christians, who desire to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church through a profession of faith, Confirmation, and the Eucharist.

Baptized Catholics, who have not yet completed their sacraments of initiation (Confirmation and/or First Holy Communion).

Sign Before the Gospel

Question: I have been going to Mass for years and have always wondered: why do we make the three signs of the cross before the Gospel?

Answer: Certainly, many people go to Mass or other devotions, doing and saying things out of habit or reverence and not really understanding the reasons behind some of these things. But everything we do has a meaning or purpose that helps us to worship better, proclaim our beliefs, or focus the attention of the people on something that has a greater importance or significance. A review of the meaning of various gestures and practices can help us have a deeper appreciation for what we do.

There is a little prayer that goes with the three crosses before the Gospel: "May the words of the Holy Gospel be on my mind, on my lips and in my heart." In standing to hear the Gospel, we acknowledge that Jesus is present, and the words of the Gospel are addressed to us. All of the gestures and special postures we adopt before the Gospel are intended to help us prepare for hearing the Word as well as act on it. The incense, the Alleluia, the deacon or priest, and the special dialogue and announcement that introduces the Gospel help us focus our attention on the Good News we are about to hear. The three signs of the cross show our desire and good intention to hear and live the Gospel.

Everyday Stewardship

Sacred Vessels

Have you ever paid attention to the Sunday. See the care with which the priest handles the

chalice and the paten, pouring water into them to cleanse any loose particles of the Body and Blood of Christ. Observe the loving reverence he uses in wiping them dry with a special purificator. It's a ritual unto itself, and a powerful moment for reflection.

These vessels begin as earthly objects. They are made by human hands. There is nothing special about them — not until they go about the work for which they have been created. Until they contain the Body and Blood of Christ, they are only ordinary objects. But after they have carried within them the Eucharist, they are never the same. They will always be special and deserving of special care.

That's why partaking of the Eucharist is, for us, an evangelical undertaking. It is both a transformation and a declaration. When we accept this tremendous gift, we are proclaiming what we believe, and we are accepting the grace to follow through on that commitment.

When we are receiving the Eucharist, it is not possible for us to be passive. We become the vessel. We carry Christ into the world with us.

But do we act like it? Do we treat ourselves - our bodies, our souls — with the same respect as the priest cleansing the chalice? Do we treat one another with the reverence we would reserve for a sacred object? When we look at another person with anger or irritation or envy, do we acknowledge the change that we have willingly undergone by receiving Christ's Body and Blood into ourselves?
