

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Parishioners,

This is the fourth and final write-up on the "Teaching Mass." Allow me to continue with the Nurturing Rhythm from last week by sharing some thoughts on the Communion Rite, the Our Father, and the Sign of Peace.

We prepare to eat and drink at the Lord's table with those words taught to us by Jesus: "Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."

Keenly aware that communion is both the sign and source of our reconciliation and union with God and one another, we make a gesture of union and forgiveness with those around us by offering them a sign of peace. The priest then shows us the Body of Christ and invites us to come to the table:

"Behold the Lamb of God... Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb."

The members of the assembly now approach the altar in procession. As God fed our ancestors in the desert on their pilgrimage, so God gives us food for our journey. We approach the priest or minister who gives us the Eucharistic bread with the words, "The Body of Christ," and we respond, "Amen." We then go to the deacon or minister with the cup, who gives it to us with the words, "The Blood of Christ," to which we again profess our "Amen."

During this procession, we usually sing a hymn, which unites our voices, minds, and hearts, even as the Body and Blood of Christ unite our bodies. We then pray silently in our hearts, thanking and praising God, and asking for all that this sacrament promises. The priest unites our prayers in the Prayer After Communion, to which we respond, "Amen."

4. PROPHETIC AND MISSIONING RHYTHM

We are commissioned to go forth and dance God's dance for the world to see. By dancing this dance, we evangelize others about God's glory, grace, and blessing in our lives.

Finally, we prepare to go back into the world in which we will live for the coming week. The burdens we laid down at the door of the church for this Eucharist we now must bear again, but we do so strengthened by this Eucharist and by this community.

After the final blessing, the priest or deacon dismisses the assembly: "Go in peace." And we give our liturgical "yes" by saying, "Thanks be to God."

We leave the assembly and the church building, but we carry something with us. What happens in our lives during the week gives deeper meaning to the ritual actions we celebrated at Mass, whether it's family life or serving the poor. It is only in relation to our daily lives that the full meaning of the Mass becomes clear to us.

This is God's dance - the dance of the Kingdom. Building this Kingdom makes us dance according to His rhythm, His rules. We are called not to allow the world to change us, but, guided by His Spirit, to change the world.

Shall we dance?

PRACTICING CATHOLIC

Mini reflection: Are you anxious about many things? Then you need to be right where Mary is: at the feet of Jesus, with all your burdens.

Martha's Burdens

It's time to admit it: I've been unfair to Mary in the past. Been a little catty about her. Oooh, Mary, she's so holy. Well, do you like to eat, Mary? Who made your lunch? Yeah, that's right: it was Martha. Because you know what? It's the Marthas who get things done in the world while the Marys lounge around reading Aquinas and attending silent retreats and going to Eucharistic Adoration whenever they want.

And there you have it, folks: my bitterness on full display! I tend to identify with Martha, not with Mary, and I need to stop doing that

Because I am not Martha instead of Mary. I am both. We are all both.

Mary was a woman; she was expected to do the serving, too. She shared that burden; she wasn't abandoning it, heaping her portion on Martha. And it's so wrong to assume that Mary didn't have the same cares and anxieties as Martha — perhaps she even had more!

Here's the difference: Mary, unlike Martha (and me, I guess) knew where to go with them.

We typically see our burdens as an impediment to a relationship with Christ. I'm so busy. I'm so overwhelmed. There are so many demands on me, on my time, on my person, on my finances. Take a number, Jesus. Get in line. But we're thinking the wrong way. Burdens aren't an obstacle that stands between us and Christ. Burdens are the straightest path to His feet.

God knows about burdens, okay? Aside from being all-wise and all-knowing, He basically completed a doctorate in suffering, taking on a human form (itself kind of a burden, if you think about it) and for 33 years lived among the hardest and heaviest burdens this world has to offer.

Why did He do this? Well, part of the reason was so that we could finally understand that our burdens aren't a barrier between us and God. On the contrary, they connect us to Him.

Are you anxious about many things? Then you need to be right where Mary is: at the feet of Jesus, with all your burdens.

PRAY & REFLECT

July 20, 2025 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 10:38-42

One of my close friends is a hermit priest who lives on a desert mountain. Recently I found myself in a group conversation about him. One vehemently objected, "What does he do up there all day? Nothing! Priests are down here working, running parishes, making a difference, and he...he is doing nothing! What a waste." The words dripped with indignation and resentment. Most of the group quietly nodded in silent agreement. Were they correct?

No! To see why, consider a similar scenario in this week's Gospel. Jesus visits His friends Martha and Mary. A hardworking and exasperated Martha complains to Jesus that her sister is attending to Him rather than to urgent household tasks. Our Lord, rather than praising hospitality, explicitly celebrates the less-productive sister for doing the "one necessary thing." He praises her for she "has chosen the better part" (Luke 10:42). Mary is busy doing what matters.

Before we freak out like Martha, consider that all work–domestic, manual, professional, ministerial, contemplative–is done to help us (sooner or later) to experience the love that makes us happy. We should be thankful for those who focus on the "better part" of radical, ceaseless prayer. They invite us to remember the purpose of all work is the enjoyment of love. Contemplatives, hermits, anyone fervently committed to prayer–they invite us to cast aside our forgetful, resentful, and self-aggrandizing attitudes in exchange for hearts ready to do what is finally necessary.

The OCIA: A Journey of Faith

Since Jesus invited His first followers to "Come, follow me," the image of a journey has been used to describe Christian discipleship. For each of us, faith is a journey marked by moments of conversion along the way... we move from unbelief to initial faith, from sin to repentance, from painful isolation to the joyful experience of a loving community, from fear to love.

Faith, conversion, repentance, celebration, and community five basic elements that are present in the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA, formerly called RCIA). The OCIA provides a setting where the journey of faith and moments of conversion can be celebrated within the local Church community. The purpose of the OCIA is literally "the making of Christians," for as Tertullian wrote in the 4th century, "Christians are made, not born."

A LETTER FROM FATHER THOMAS

Schedule Update for High School and Middle School Faith Formation and Youth OCIA!

At the end of the school year, I invited Tim Colbert, the Director of the Archdiocesan Catechesis and Evangelization Office, and his team to help us evaluate our youth religious education program. Based on the recommendations they made, we are broadening our Youth Program to embrace the fullness of a

comprehensive youth ministry. I am grateful for our youth directors, Trey Brock and Sarah Kennepohl, as well as many catechists and parents, for their leadership, commitment, love, and support of our youth.

In the next school year, to better serve the needs of our growing parish, High School Faith Formation will now be held on Sundays after the 4:30 PM Mass. Confirmation Year 1 and 2, as well as The Deep, will meet for Faith Formation from 5:45-7:00 PM. This slight shift in schedule for high schoolers will allow us to go through our lessons after having worshipped together at Mass. Last year, High School Faith Formation was before the 4:30 PM Mass. This change in time will also allow some of our catechists who serve at the 4:30 PM Mass, as well as some of the teens who are in the choir, band, or other ministries, to arrive early as needed.

With High School Faith Formation being moved to 5:45 PM on Sundays, Jr. High Faith Formation will now be on alternating Wednesdays from 5:45–7:00 PM. Our Jr. High Coordinator, Sarah Kennepohl, will use this change in schedule as an opportunity to engage more closely with the Wednesday evening Mass as part of the curriculum. This midweek shift offers a dedicated atmosphere, fewer scheduling conflicts with extracurriculars, and a refreshed energy that helps students engage more deeply with their faith journey.

Youth OCIA will be moved to Thursday nights from 5:30-6:30 PM. This change allows us to have more space on Sundays, as well as tailor more specialized catechesis for our Candidates, Catechumens, and First Communicants.

This new schedule not only supports a more focused learning environment but also strengthens our parish community across all age groups. We are excited about what is ahead and hope these changes make it easier for families to participate and stay spiritually connected.







Mary Magdalene

Question:

July 22 is the feast of Mary Magdalene. I've heard a lot of stories about her, but who was she really?

Answer:

Mary Magdalene has been the subject of speculation and scholarship over the last 2,000 years. Mary Magdalene makes her first named appearance in Luke 8:2. She is one of several women following Jesus. Luke specifically mentions that Mary had previously been delivered from demonic possession. Whatever her life looked like before she met Jesus, it wasn't good! Because of this association with being a repentant sinner, Mary Magdalene has been associated with other similar stories in the Gospel, such as the woman caught in adultery or the woman who bathes Jesus' feet with her tears.

Mary Magdalene shows up again by name at the end of the Gospels, when she stands with the Blessed Virgin Mary at the foot of the Cross. Mary is also present in the garden of the Resurrection. She is one of the women who goes to bring spices to Jesus' tomb, where they find the stone rolled away. Mary stays in the garden weeping, believing His body has been stolen. Jesus approaches her and calls her by name, and she becomes the first witness to the Resurrection! While many of the details of Mary Magdalene's life have been lost to time, she is an example of powerful conversion, deep faith, and intimate love for Christ.

Be Ready for God to "Stop By"

In my experience, most people can be divided into two groups: those who are old enough to remember when you kept food on hand for company, and those who aren't.

For those of you in the latter group, let me explain. Before text messaging and social media made us all unconditionally, mercilessly reachable, people would do this thing called "stopping by." They would be passing by a friend's house, maybe on the way home from work or shopping, and they would just ... stop. With no warning. No notice whatsoever. "I was just in the neighborhood," they would say. I remember my mother and I would do this on many a Saturday. It wasn't an everyday occurrence, but it was common enough that you had to be ready.

"Crazy," you might exclaim. "People just appeared on your doorstep? How did you cope with the uncertainty?" Well, most of us had moms who kept a little something on hand to eat or drink that was extra nice, just in case anyone stopped by. That way, we were always ready.

Today's readings are about a lot of things: prayer, hope, redemptive suffering. They're about what it means to be a Christian, and not just what it means to do Christian things.

Most of all, though, they're about readiness. If God showed up at your door, would you be ready for Him? Would you be ready for what He gives you, or what He takes away? Would you be ready for Him to interrupt the plans you have for yourself? To disrupt the idea you carry in your mind of what a servant or a steward is supposed to be?

Read your Bible. Say your rosary. Go to Mass. Get to Confession. Talk to God — every day, not just when you think you need Him. That way, you are always ready.
