FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Parishioners,

In every community, there are members who, due to age, illness, or circumstance, are unable to join the wider congregation in worship and fellowship. These treasured members of our faith family, often known as the homebound, remind us daily of the sacred responsibility we share as followers of Christ: to reach out, to comfort, and to be present for one another.

Today, I wish to write about the profound ministry of visiting the homebound—why it matters, how it touches lives, and how we may all become instruments of God's love in this gentle but vital way. First, I would like to thank our **Eucharistic Ministers to the Sick and Homebound**, who generously offer their time to bring Holy Communion every Sunday morning after the 7:30 Mass to many members of our parish who are unable to go to church. Their exemplary ministry brings comfort and reminds them that they are not forgotten.

On the second, third, and fourth Fridays of every month, **Fr. Jim** goes to three different nursing homes to offer Mass for the Catholic residents. *Friendship Haven*, *Village on the Park*, and *Morada* are within our parish boundaries. Fr. Jim is assisted by many volunteers from our parish who give their time generously to set up and help with music during the Mass. There are times when Fr. Jim anoints or hears confessions while there. I am grateful that Fr. Jim has taken on this beautiful ministry, which he loves to do.

The call to visit and care for those who are isolated is woven throughout Scripture. In Matthew 25:36, Jesus says, *"I was sick, and you visited me."* This passage is more than a command; it is an invitation to recognize Christ in the faces of those who wait patiently in the quiet corners of our community. From the earliest days of the Church, believers gathered not only in temples but in homes, bringing support, encouragement, and prayer to all—especially the most vulnerable.

One of the greatest gifts we can offer those who are homebound is the gift of **presence**. In a world that moves quickly, where technology sometimes replaces true connection, a personal visit says, *You are not forgotten. You are cherished.* It is not the eloquence of our prayers nor the length of our stay that matters most, but our willingness to pause, listen, and share in another's life, however briefly.

In God's family, no one is ever truly alone. Let us be the hands and feet of Christ, carrying light into the homes and hearts of all God's children. The ministry of visiting the sick and bringing Holy Communion is not just a duty; it is a **privilege**—a grace-filled encounter with Christ Himself in the suffering members of His Body. It is a beautiful witness to the truth that in every stage of life, especially in moments of illness or vulnerability, God is near and His Church is present.

May every visit, great or small, be a testament to the enduring love that binds us together as one body, one spirit, and one eternal fellowship in Christ.

PRAY & REFLECT

Mini reflection: Whatever is interrupting communication between your heart and the One who crafted it, it can be overcome. There is no door thick enough, no night dark enough, no sleep strong enough.

Ask and You Shall Receive

It's easy to look at today's Gospel reading and come away with a view of God as disinterested and irritated, reluctant to give us what we need unless we bang down his door, hound him to the furthest reaches of heaven, wrench him from his reverie and force him to answer just so we'll finally go away.

Well, that's not what Jesus means by the parable of the friend at midnight — but it's also not surprising that we would think that it is. The whole point of this Gospel is that communication between God and man has been broken. It's not as easy as it once was, as it should be, as it could be.

In this parable, there exists many barriers between the supplicant and his friend. The time of day is not ideal. The door is locked. Their dispositions are opposite — one is in the middle of a REM cycle and the other is deeply agitated. They appear to be two people who are not primed to communicate well. Everything is working against them.

The same could well be said of God and the human race. Here we are in a fallen world, surrounded by sin and pain and sickness and death to the extent that it infiltrates not just our bodies but our souls, our minds, our attitudes.

We are the friend caught unprepared in the dead of night. We don't always know how to talk to God (That door is thick! Will he hear us if we knock?). We don't always know if we should (It's all my fault that I ran out of loaves, after all). We don't even know if we want to (It's nighttime! He might be angry!).

Everything is working against us.

It doesn't matter, Jesus tells us. Whatever is interrupting communication between your heart and the One who crafted it, the One who desires its full and irrevocable attention, it can be overcome. There is no door thick enough, no night dark enough, no sleep strong enough.

So knock.

Luke 11:1-13

Once I went to a hospice facility to celebrate Last Rites for an elderly dying man. His family had told me that he had been uncommunicative for days. At the conclusion of the ritual, we began to recite the Our Father prayer. To everyone's surprise, his lips moved, clearly mouthing the words to the Lord's prayer. Stripped of most of his faculties, the man could still pray those precious God-given petitions. A lifetime of prayer had planted the words even deeper than his failing consciousness.

Do we want the Lord's prayer to be as deeply embedded in us? If we want to be people of hope, we should. Recall that our Lord immediately follows the prayer by saying: "Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you" (Luke 11:9). We only ask, search and knock because we hope that the request is not in vain. Everything we could possibly hope for is contained in the prayer. Praying the Our Father deepens our hope.

We should consciously pour all our hopes into the Lord's prayer; we should allow it to be an expression of hope, not simply rote words. Then, over time, it builds up our hope in God. It sinks deep into our souls and bodies. How blessed we are when these words of hope are on our lips, even when everything else seems to fail.

The OCIA: A Journey of Faith

Since Jesus invited His first followers to "Come, follow me," the image of a journey has been used to describe Christian discipleship. For each of us, faith is a journey marked by moments of conversion along the way... we move from unbelief to initial faith, from sin to repentance, from painful isolation to the joyful experience of a loving community, from fear to love.

Faith, conversion, repentance, celebration, and community - five basic elements that are present in the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA, formerly called RCIA). The OCIA provides a setting where the journey of faith and moments of conversion can be celebrated within the local Church community. The purpose of the OCIA is literally "the making of Christians," for as Tertullian wrote in the 4th century, "Christians are made, not born."

You are cordially invited to inquire about the Catholic Christian faith by attending the **Evangelization Sessions**, beginning Thursday, September 4th.

This invitation is extended to:

- Anyone who has never been baptized and/or has expressed an interest in becoming Catholic

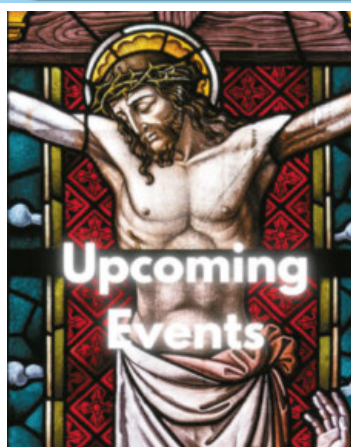

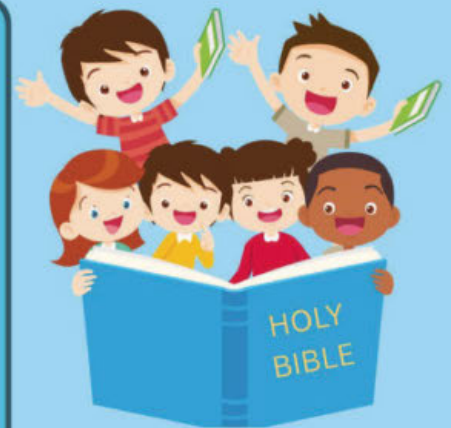

Weddings

Question: This time of year, I attend a lot of weddings. Why do Catholic weddings need to take place in a church?

Answer:

Technically, there is a clause in Church law that could allow for weddings to take place outside of a church, in a suitable space under special circumstances, but it requires the rare permission of the bishop. But the meaning of marriage goes very, very deep, and the Church has a vested interest in protecting that meaning. As Catholics, we don't see a wedding as an event that needs a pleasing backdrop.

Marriage is a sacrament, both an occasion of joyful promise and symbolic solemnity. It is a spiritual event. The loving bond of marriage symbolizes the mystical union between Christ and his Church. The man and woman profess lifelong vows of fidelity, and they receive supernatural grace from God to keep their promises. Receiving the sacrament of Marriage in a church has broader symbolic meaning for the couple as well. Marriage isn't simply two people in isolation from the world around them. Marriage is the joining of families and the beginning of a new, holy mission in the life of the couple. Weddings are sacred occasions, and it's fitting that they occur in sacred spaces.

When I Called, You Answered

Some of us have that friend about whom we are constantly discovering new things. Maybe we've known this person for ten or even twenty years, and one day at lunch we'll find out they're a direct descendant of a dead president or they once met a major celebrity.

"You never asked," they'll say with a shrug.

As annoying as this can be, it makes perfect sense, doesn't it? We never asked. There is something strangely sacred about the act of asking for something. It requires humility. It requires grace. It requires us to be awake, to be aware, to be vulnerable.

Too often we fall into a pattern of entitlement, even when it comes to information. We go through life thinking that a great cosmic conveyor belt of what we want is going to roll on past us, and we'll barely even have to extend our arms. We read our Bible and we hear all these amazing promises from the Father who loves us, and we get sort of complacent. He's got this, we think, and we shut our eyes to take a snooze on the road trip of life, confident that someone else is going to look out for stop signs and wrong turns.

It's true: God's got this. He is going to take care of us. But He wants us to be in relationship with Him. He wants us to be an active, receptive participant in our own salvation. See his patience with Abraham's entreaties on behalf of the righteous of Sodom: He wants to answer, not simply to tell.

He wants us to stay awake for the drive.
