



Question: What Happens if Someone Drops a Consecrated Host?

Answer: Despite our best efforts, and this is as true in our liturgical celebrations as in all of

life, accidents happen. Occasionally at Mass, a host may be dropped or some of the Precious Blood could even be spilled from the chalice, despite the best efforts of the priests, deacons, and extraordinary ministers of holy Communion assisting at the liturgy.

So, when a host is dropped or the Precious Blood is spilled, we can take guidance from the U.S. Bishops' statement Norms for the Distribution for Holy Communion Under Both Kinds:" All ministers of Holy Communion should show the greatest reverence for the Most Holy Eucharist by their demeanor, their attire, and the manner in which they handle the consecrated bread or wine. Should there be any mishap — as when, for example, the consecrated wine is spilled from the chalice — then the affected "area... should be washed with water, and this water should be then poured into the sacrarium."

According to no. 280 of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, the general rule is that a dropped host is picked up by the minister distributing Communion and reverently consumed. The minster should be careful to make sure that no other particles from the host remain on the ground. As we see in the instruction from the bishops, the Precious Blood would be absorbed (customarily with a purificator) and the area attentively and reverently washed with water which would then be disposed of properly.

Reach Out in Love

We are all called to be accountable to one another. As brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ, we have a responsibility to reach out

in love when we see someone lost and to offer support when the need is the greatest. In that same regard, we must never stand between a loved one and him. Our goal when it comes to those we love is to lead them toward heaven and eternal life with the source of all love, Jesus Christ.

This is the "why" of our stewardship. Our generosity and our giving of very selves back to God need to bear witness to the transforming power of Jesus. It is easy to fall into the trap of loving someone so much that we place them before God. We make our human relationships the main thing and ultimately make decisions that keep our loved ones away from that which they need the most. If we truly love another, we will offer them the example of how we love God even more than them.

We live in a world where romantic and parental love are seen as the highest forms of affection. Stories are often told in books and on the screen of how nothing will keep someone from his or her beloved. Although we are called to love one another, we must never be trapped into the portrayal of love that comes from the world. We are gifts from God to one another, and like all other gifts given to us, we are accountable to God for that which He has given. If you can give a loved one back to God completely, then you are worthy of their love in the first place.

PRAY & REFLECT

September 7, 2025 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 14:25-33

One hot Arizona summer afternoon my car ran out of gas. I phoned the parish office and begged for help. My secretary came and helped me fill the gas tank. She chided me, "If you can't manage getting your car from A to B, how can we expect you to guide the parish where it needs to go?" Point taken, Julie. I vowed to always make sure I have plenty of gas in my car.

The Lord Jesus chides us in this week's Gospel, too. He uses the two images of a man building a tower and a king marching soldiers into war to make this single point: acquire what is needed to follow him or look ridiculous. We rightly mock the builder who lacks money for his tower and the king with a short-handed army. But our mocking boomerangs back on us. How do we expect to follow Jesus to the end with insufficient detachment from our possessions and divided hearts?

The good news is, there is still time. Jesus is building a great tower to heaven—his own body. So we renounce all and give ourselves to him as his precious stones. Jesus is waging a battle against our enemy. So we forsake all and swear allegiance and march under his banner. In this way, we will finish what has begun in our discipleship. Or better put, our Lord will have the stones and soldiers required to see his great work through.







Prayers of Praise, Petition, and Contemplation

Prayer does not change God; rather, prayer changes the one who prays. The Lord calls us to commune with Him throughout every moment of every day. He patiently and longingly awaits our acceptance of His infinite love and mercy.

Prayers of Praise & Thanksgiving

Psalm 100:4-5

"Enter His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise; give thanks to Him and praise His name. For the Lord is good and His love endures forever; His faithfulness continues through all generations."

Approaching God with praise and gratitude shifts our mindset to His glory and reminds us of His faithfulness before we focus on our petitions, needs, or troubles. When we intentionally thank God for His almighty and unfailing goodness first, we recognize Him as the source of all blessings; we acknowledge our utter dependence on Him; and we—either consciously or subconsciously—align our hearts to His will.

As believers, we must guard against allowing our human circumstances to determine our gratitude.

1 Thessalonians 5:18

"Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

The practice of gratitude toward God spreads into other areas of our lives; a truly grateful heart ignites joy and zeal in those we encounter.

Prayers of Petition

Prayers of petition can include prayers for our own needs as well as prayers for the needs and requests of others.

Philippians 4:6

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."

Our heavenly Father already knows our needs and the desires of our hearts. We are to pray with confidence that He will answer those desires in His time and according to His will. God desires only that which is good for us and that which draws us nearer to Him; hence, the warning not to be anxious.

In the parable of the widow and the unjust judge in Luke 18:1, our Lord exhorts us to persevere in prayer and not to be discouraged. When we pray, we loosen our worldly bondage and cling more tightly, more thirstily, to heavenly nourishment.

Contemplative Prayer

Psalm 46:10

"Be still, and know that I am God."

Psalm 62:1

"For God alone my soul waits in silence; from Him comes my salvation."

Contemplative prayer is a practice that focuses on simply being present with God, rather than on specific words, thoughts, or petitions. It cultivates inner stillness and contentment while gazing upon God or imagining oneself physically engulfed in His arms. Developing a habit of contemplative prayer opens one's heart and mind to God in a transformative way.

When beginning a practice of contemplative prayer, one should first ask God to empty the heart and mind of distractions in order to be as fully present as possible with Him while meditating. Such reflective prayer also teaches patience while we wait for God to answer other prayers. A practical way to begin meditation is to be still and silent for two minutes by the clock. Once that two-minute habit of silence and stillness is developed, a longer and deeper period of contemplation will likely follow.

Ecclesiastes 4:6

"Better is a handful of quietness than two hands full of toil and a striving after wind."

Regardless of how you pray or which practices you use, the most significant part is your demeanor toward God. In other words, if you desire communion with God and seek Him, He does not make reaching Him too difficult. You can simply begin speaking with Him from your heart. Eventually, our Lord will guide you to a richer, fuller prayer life. The key is to begin as best you can.


