FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Parishioners,

During the month of September, we will joyfully commemorate the Feast of Our Lady of La Salette, a powerful reminder of Mary's call to conversion, reconciliation, and hope. Her tears and words continue to speak to our world today, calling us to reflect on our lives, to renew our commitment to prayer, and to live with greater faithfulness and love. Our celebration will include nine days of a novena culminating in the celebration of the Eucharist at all weekend Masses on September 20-21 to honor the Blessed Virgin at La Salette. The International Rosary will be prayed in various languages as usual, and we hope to include exposition, adoration, and benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The candlelight procession that was held last year was breathtaking. All are welcome at an International Luncheon in the Parish Hall immediately following the 11:30 AM Mass on Sunday, September 21. I am so glad to invite you to participate in one or more of the feast day events at our church, which will soon be announced.

As you know, the story of La Salette begins with the apparition of our Blessed Mother on September 19, 1846. The Blessed Mother appeared to two shepherd children, Maximin and Melanie, ages 15 and 11. They had no education, had never gone to school, had no money, and were very poor. They worked day and night taking care of the sheep and cattle on the mountain of La Salette and in neighboring places. Mary, at La Salette, brought the good news of God's generous love and care for those two shepherd children and for the entire world. Among the many La Salette ministries, I would like to share with you one work we do for the children of this world who are less fortunate and less privileged.

Today there are almost 1,000 La Salette missionaries working in 30 countries, especially in the missions of Madagascar, Angola, Tanzania, Mozambique, Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, the Philippines, India, Myanmar, and Haiti. Next week, I would like to share with you some of my experiences and encounters during my visits with the La Salette missionaries around the world.

Let us take this opportunity to draw closer to Mary, the Reconciler of Sinners, and through her, deepen our relationship with Christ. May her message inspire us to be witnesses of peace, healing, and unity in our families and our communities.



Daily Prayer Versus Mass?

Question: I have a friend who says she doesn't need to attend Mass because she prays to God every day. What are your thoughts on this justification?

Answer: If the only reason for going to church were to talk to God, your friend might be right. Prayer is not something limited to a physical place or even a holy place. If the sole purpose of the Church were prayer, it would be a narrow purpose indeed. The Church is a community of believers, formed by "one Lord, one faith, one Baptism." It is an outward sign of our faith in God instituted by Christ, and the purpose of the Church is to give us grace, that is, a share in God's life.

Coming to Mass is not really for God's sake, but for ours. If we believe that Jesus is truly present in the holy Eucharist, then we will want to be in his presence. We will want to be fed by him. Our daily prayer and good works are strengthened by our authentic encounter with our Lord. For Catholics, it is at Mass that we celebrate the source and summit of our faith. If this is true, why would we ever stay away?

Fixing the Scales

Most people don't intend on being selfish. The reality of selfishness usually lies in the grey shades of our decisionmaking. We would never go out of our

way to kick a homeless person begging by the highway exit. We would never steal money from our parish collection plate.

But would we drive past the homeless person without even extending a thought or a prayer toward his need? Would we justify stinginess in time, talent, and treasure because of our own comfort? We all have been guilty of transgressions such as these in the past. We will fall again in the future.

Most of the evil in this world can be traced back to a feeling of entitlement that lurks deep within each of us — a frantic concern for our own good that we find difficult to shake. The same instinct that compelled Eve to reach for the fruit that would give her the knowledge of good and evil still compels people to focus on what they are owed, on what they have "earned," on what they have "coming to them." We are so tempted to fix the scales. We are so tempted to keep score.

We would do well to remember that our God is not a God who keeps score. He is not a God who acts entitled or who tacks on extra dues, taking as much as He can get. He is a God who seats the lowly with princes. He is a God who seeks avenues for reconciliation and mercy.

PRAY & REFLECT

September 14, 2025 The Exaltation of the Holy Cross John 3:13-17

One of my favorite movies is the 1991 comedy What About Bob? Bill Murray plays a troubled, paranoid hypochondriac named Bob Wiley who innocently but annoyingly hounds Dr. Leo Marvin, played by Richard Dreyfuss. Bob is paralyzed by his fear of, well, everything, and is convinced the psychologist can heal him. But Dr. Marvin's failed attempts to heal Bob end up driving the doctor to attempt to murder Bob. He fails. The surprise is that, having faced death head on, Bob is suddenly healed. He attributes his healing to Dr Marvin for break-through "death therapy." In facing the cause of his deepest illness and dysfunction, Bob is healed.

Underneath this light-hearted comedy is a dead-serious resonance with this week's feast: the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Christ is lifted up on the cross to force us to face the truth of sin and death. In that reckoning we find healing. Like Moses' snake on a pole, the cross says: this is what is causing your sickness – rebellion, disobedience, sin. Look at it! Don't run from it. Now seeing it exposed, we see life. We see our physician mercifully healing us. In this sense, we are all like Bob Wiley. The "death therapy" of the cross is our only hope for healing.

This week I invite you to "exalt the cross." If you don't have one in your house, get one. Use it for prayer. Gaze on it frequently. It teaches us to not be afraid. It heals us.

ABOUT TODAY'S FEAST ...

"On 13 September 335, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher (also called the Church of the Resurrection) was dedicated. The following day, the cross that Empress Helena had discovered on 14 September 320, was venerated in a solemn ceremony. In 614, the Persian King, Chosroes II, waged war on the Romans. After conquering Jerusalem, he confiscated many treasures, among which was the Cross of Jesus. The Byzantine emperor Heraclius initiated peace negotiations, but was rejected. He then waged war and won near Nineveh, asking for the restitution of the Cross, which then returned to Jerusalem. Today, the cruelty of the Cross is not what is exalted, but the Love that God manifested to humanity by accepting death on the Cross: Who, though in the form of God, emptied himself, taking the form of a slave. This is the glory of the Cross of Jesus!' (Pope Francis)"

Guidelines for 2026 Mass Intentions Opening of Intentions

Mass Intentions for 2026 will be accepted beginning Monday, October 6 at 9:00 a.m. Please submit all requests in person at the Parish Office during regular business hours. Forms are available at the receptionist's desk.

Submitting Requests

- All requests must be written on the official Mass Intention form and must be clearly legible.
- Please list both a preferred date and an alternate date for each request. If no alternate date is provided and the preferred date is unavailable, an alternate will be assigned.
- Keep a personal copy of your requests. You will only be contacted if one of your dates cannot be scheduled. If there are no conflicts, you will not receive a confirmation call or email.

Offering & Payment

- The suggested stipend is \$5 per Mass, whether scheduled or unscheduled.
- Payment may be made by cash or check (payable to Mary Queen Catholic Church).
- Please note: PushPay may not be used for Mass Intention offerings.

Family Limits

- Each family may request up to 12 scheduled Mass Intentions per year.
- No more than 3 Intentions per family may be scheduled for any single Saturday/Sunday Mass time. Remaining requests should be scheduled for weekday or other Masses.

Unscheduled Intentions

Once your family has reached the 12 scheduled Mass Intentions limit, you may request unscheduled Mass Intentions:

- These are not published in the bulletin and are not announced at Mass.
- Requests must be made in person at the Parish Office during business hours.
- Payment for unscheduled Intentions may be made by cash or check.

THE APPARITION OF OUR LADY OF LA SALETTE

ON SEPTEMBER 19, 1846, IN THE SMALL MOUNTAIN VILLAGE OF LA SALETTE IN THE FRENCH ALPS, THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY APPEARED TO TWO YOUNG SHEPHERD CHILDREN, MAXIMIN GIRAUD (AGE 15) AND MÉLANIE CALVAT (AGE 11). THE CHILDREN WERE POOR, UNEDUCATED, AND HAD NO SPECIAL STATUS, YET MARY CHOSE THEM TO RECEIVE A MESSAGE FOR THE WHOLE WORLD.

MARY WAS WEEPING AS SHE APPEARED, SEATED ON A STONE WITH HER FACE IN HER HANDS. SHE THEN STOOD AND SPOKE TENDERLY WITH THE CHILDREN. HER TEARS AND WORDS WERE A CALL TO CONVERSION AND RECONCILIATION, REMINDING THE FAITHFUL OF THE SERIOUSNESS OF SIN BUT ALSO OF GOD'S ABUNDANT MERCY. SHE URGED THE CHILDREN TO CALL PEOPLE BACK TO HONORING THE LORD'S DAY, TO LIVE LIVES OF PRAYER, AND TO TURN AWAY FROM INDIFFERENCE AND NEGLECT OF GOD. HER MESSAGE WAS NOT ONE OF DESPAIR BUT OF HOPE-POINTING TO THE TRANSFORMING POWER OF REPENTANCE. PRAYER. FAITHFULNESS TO CHRIST.

THE APPARITION AT LA SALETTE WAS APPROVED BY THE CHURCH IN 1851, AND ITS MESSAGE OF RECONCILIATION BECAME THE HEART OF THE MISSION OF THE LA SALETTE FATHERS, BROTHERS, AND SISTERS, WHO SERVE AROUND THE WORLD TO THIS DAY. THEIR CHARISM IS ROOTED IN MARY'S WORDS AT LA SALETTE: TO BE MINISTERS OF RECONCILIATION AND AMBASSADORS OF GOD'S MERCY.

FOR US AS A PARISH, THE FEAST OF OUR LADY OF LA SALETTE IS A SPECIAL CELEBRATION, SINCE WE ARE A LA SALETTE MISSION PARISH. AS WE HONOR HER FEAST EACH YEAR, WE ARE INVITED TO REFLECT ON MARY'S TEARS AND MESSAGE—HOW THEY STILL SPEAK TO OUR WORLD TODAY—AND TO OPEN OUR HEARTS ANEW TO CHRIST, THE SOURCE OF TRUE PEACE, HEALING, AND UNITY.




