FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Parishioners,

Allow me to share with you some anecdotes and experiences from my life as a shepherd, and my encounters with La Salette missionaries and shepherds around the world.

Our missionaries in Angola are not only pastors, but at times they also take on the roles of doctors, nurses, non-government representatives, and teachers - often without professional training. In the middle of the night, pastors may receive emergency calls from remote villages asking for help transporting a patient to the nearest hospital, which could be 50 miles away. In many cases, only the pastor has a truck in the entire village. His truck then becomes the much-needed ambulance. Each day, they set aside part of their time to work on the farm to put food on the table. At times, the missionaries even shed their blood for their people. There have also been cases in which missionaries (priests, nuns), catechists, and other laypeople were assassinated simply because they were Christians. I returned from my visit to Angola filled with amazement and inspiration at the deep faith of the Angolan people.

We turn now to Myanmar, formerly known as Burma. Since the military took control of the country through a coup on February 1, 2021, daily protests have erupted in most cities and towns. Thousands of people, including children, have been killed since then, and brutality continues with soldiers shooting at peaceful protesters. It is heartbreaking to see the lives of innocent children brutally and needlessly snatched away from their parents. Some children have witnessed unspeakable violence and horror, even watching their siblings die. One of our own La Salette missionaries has been imprisoned since the start of this military coup.

In Haiti, we know the sorrowful situation that followed the 2010 earthquake. It struck unexpectedly and changed the lives of Haitians forever. According to statistics, 1.8 million people were left homeless, and 316,000 died in that disaster. Our missionaries have ministered there for many years, and it is heartbreaking to hear the stories of the people they serve. I was privileged to visit Haiti for a week. As I flew back home from Port-au-Prince, I thought of the many people I had met who lived in poverty, some even without homes. With the civil unrest continuing today, our missionaries remain totally committed to serving God's people, even in the face of danger and war.

We also have La Salette missionaries serving in Ukraine. Eleven Polish missionaries currently serve in six parishes across Ukraine. Since the outbreak of war, thousands of people, including children, have been killed, and millions have become refugees or displaced persons. In the face of war and fear, our missionaries remain committed to serving the people God has entrusted to them, offering spiritual protection. Their ministries have become focused almost entirely on accepting and caring for refugees and children. They open the doors of the church to welcome refugees and share bread with them. They are shepherds in the truest sense of the word—shepherds who know their sheep. A good pastor knows the people—their names, their voices, their hopes, their dreams, and their stories.

Please pray for the La Salette missionaries serving around the world, and for the people they serve.

The Friday Fast: History, Vatican II, and Our Call to Penance

Question: I thought Catholics only had to abstain from meat on Fridays in Lent. What does the Church actually teach about

Fridays during the rest of the year?

Answer: From the earliest days of the Church, Christians have treated Friday as a sacred day of remembrance. Why? Because Friday is the day Our Lord gave His life for us on the Cross. From the first century onward, Christians set aside Fridays as days of fasting, prayer, and abstinence.

Early Practice: The Didache (a 1st-century Christian manual) instructed believers to fast on Wednesdays and Fridays. Church Fathers such as Tertullian and Clement of Alexandria wrote about Friday fasting, and by the 4th century, this practice was widespread. Abstaining from meat, a festive food in the ancient world, became a standard way of marking Friday as a day of penance.

By the Middle Ages, Friday abstinence was universal and binding for all Catholics, and it was codified in Church law. The 1917 Code of Canon Law required abstinence from meat on all Fridays of the year, unless a solemnity occurred.

What the Church Teaches Today: The current Code of Canon Law (1983) continues to uphold Friday as a day of penance:

Canon 1250: "The penitential days and times in the universal Church are every Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent."

Canon 1251: "Abstinence from meat, or from some other food as determined by the Episcopal Conference, is to be observed on all Fridays, unless a solemnity should fall on a Friday."

In other words, every Friday remains a day of penance for Catholics.

What Vatican II Actually Changed: Here is where the confusion begins. After Vatican II, national bishops' conferences were given authority to adapt the discipline. The U.S. bishops, in their 1966 Pastoral Statement on Penance and Abstinence, stated that:

- All Fridays remain days of penance.
- Abstinence from meat remains the "default" practice and is obligatory on all Fridays of Lent.
- On Fridays outside of Lent, Catholics may substitute another form of penance (prayer, charity, acts of selfdenial).

Sadly, many Catholics came away with the mistaken impression that Friday penance was "abolished." In reality, only the form was relaxed; the obligation remains.

What This Means for Us: On Fridays in Lent: Catholics must abstain from meat.

On Fridays outside of Lent: Catholics must still do penance. If you eat meat, you must choose another form of penance: prayer, fasting, acts of charity, or another sacrifice.

The bishops explained: "Friday should be in each week something of what Lent is in the entire year. For this reason we urge all to prepare for that weekly Easter that comes with each Sunday by freely making of every Friday a day of self-denial and mortification in prayerful remembrance of the passion of Jesus Christ." (Pastoral Statement on Penance and Abstinence, U.S. Bishops, 1966)

Conclusion: The Church has not abolished Friday penance. Instead, she has entrusted us with a more mature responsibility: to choose how we will unite ourselves with Christ's Passion each Friday. Abstaining from meat is still strongly recommended, but if we choose not to, we are still bound to offer another form of penance.

Far from being a lost custom, Friday penance remains a living tradition that connects us with the earliest Christians and unites us to Christ crucified.

PRAY & REFLECT

September 21, 2025 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 16:10-13

Before I was a priest, I was a lazy worker for a retail Apple store. Hearing a rumor that my boss was going to fire me, I secretly sold iPhones for half-price, gave away dozens of free iPads, and donated several brand-new laptops to managers in other stores in the mall. After a week, my boss called me into his office. He knew what I was up to. He said I had cost the store thousands of dollars. "Really great work, John," he said. "I am going to recommend you to be my assistant manager and double your pay." I was amazed.

And so are you. Which is understandable because it never happened. How could it? My tall tale is a retelling of Jesus' brow-furrowing parable we hear this week. A lazy, dishonest steward defrauds his boss and then the "master commended the dishonest servant for acting prudently" (Luke 16:8). What is the Lord saying to us?

Most of us treat our spiritual lives like a lazy teenager at an Apple store. We really don't care. We go through the motions. Then, if we are lucky, something happens that shakes us to spiritual action; to employ whatever time, money, and resources we have to build around us a strong network of love. Every saint did that. Our Lord is so good he wants us to use his stuff to forgive debts and to bless others. He wants us to ensure our future. So do it!



warmly welcome.







Opening of Intentions

Mass Intentions for 2026 will be accepted beginning Monday, October 6 at 9:00 a.m. Please submit all requests in person at the Parish Office during regular business hours. Forms are available at the receptionist's desk.

Submitting Requests

- All requests must be written on the official Mass Intention form and must be clearly legible.
- Please list both a preferred date and an alternate date for each request. If no alternate date is provided and the preferred date is unavailable, an alternate will be assigned.
- Keep a personal copy of your requests. You will
 only be contacted if one of your dates cannot be
 scheduled. If there are no conflicts, you will not
 receive a confirmation call or email.

Offering & Payment

- The suggested stipend is \$5 per Mass, whether scheduled or unscheduled.
- Payment may be made by cash or check (payable to Mary Queen Catholic Church).
- Please note: PushPay may not be used for Mass Intention offerings.

Family Limits

- Each family may request up to 12 scheduled Mass Intentions per year.
- No more than 3 Intentions per family may be scheduled for any single Saturday/Sunday Mass time. Remaining requests should be scheduled for weekday or other Masses.

Unscheduled Intentions

Once your family has reached the 12 scheduled Mass Intentions limit, you may request unscheduled Mass Intentions:

- These are not published in the bulletin and are not announced at Mass.
- Requests must be made in person at the Parish Office during business hours.
- Payment for unscheduled Intentions may be made by cash or check.
