

Father Gary writes

The Christmas Season has begun! Merry Christmas and every joy and blessing for the New Year, 2021. There is no doubt that 2020 has been a defining year for all of us due to the pandemic, and other major events, such as the General Election. A vaccine has arrived, but we will continue to live with the effects of the pandemic for some time to come. Hopefully, by the summer there will more normality to life, and we can intermingle and relate to one another as we did before. Some items will remain even as we emerge from the pandemic, such as hand sanitizers in church, refraining from shaking hands (we can still greet each other, and be welcoming and courteous). I doubt whether we will be offering the cup, the precious Blood of Christ, until we are safely out of the control of the pandemic, but life in the Church and in the world will return to a more normal pattern. Alleluia, I hear you say! I would certainly encourage you to have the vaccine. There are always rumors and falsehood surrounding vaccines. Our Bishops are encouraging us to have it, there is nothing immoral in doing so.

We are protecting our lives and the lives of those around us. Yes, it would be wonderful to live in a world where vaccines were unnecessary, but unfortunately our fallen human nature means they are necessary and welcome. Of course you can't force someone to have it, we have personal rights and freedoms. As teachers, we are always looking for new and creative ways to engage our students in their learning. Covid-19 has presented new and interesting challenges for teachers as we try to connect with our students in the classroom, as well as at home. Coming into this school year, I knew that I wanted to continue to provide opportunities for discussion and collaboration but knew that I would have to think outside the box to make it successful.

One of the strategies that has worked well for classroom collaboration is for the in-person students to act as virtual hosts. Since all middle school students are equipped with an iPad, they are able to act as session leaders and interact with their classmates one-on-one or in a small group setting. This has allowed the students at home to continue to discuss and verbalize what they are learning along with their peers. While group work does not look the same as it has in the past, the learning benefits have not changed.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION WE ARE FAMILY

On this day we honor the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. We all belong to families, whether born, married, or adopted into them. We all belong to the family of faith through the waters of baptism and, finally, as part of God's creation, we belong to the larger human family. Not long ago a story was reported about a woman in Manchester, England. She was retired from the telecommunications industry and lived by herself in a modest home. She regularly attended Mass in her local church, but was otherwise not involved in parish life. She had one friend, with whom she occasionally had dinner but never invited into her home. According to the friend, this lady had no birth family or family by marriage left. She spent all her days and evenings shopping. The neighbors would see her come and go but they formed no connection with her. When they finally noticed that her car had not been moved in days, they called the police. Investigating officers were horrified to find a house filled to the rafters with "stuff." It took them two days to dig through and find the lady who owned it all—she was in a bedroom where heavy boxes had fallen on her and killed her. This sad story underlines what can happen when we do not have ordinary relationships to sustain us.




Almost certainly neighbors and parishioners told themselves after the fact that they could have done something to help. We all know people whose families are deceased or who live far away. Some are outgoing and able to make a network of friends. Others, particularly the frail and elderly, are shy or fearful of bothering anyone. Isolation can have fearful consequences. Don't let it happen if you can help it.

Living Stewardship Now

If you know someone who is elderly, frail, and isolated, find ways to be a presence and a support. Drop a greeting card in the mail. Make a "How are you?" phone call. Go by with home-made goodies. Offer to run errands or drive to doctor visits or church. Take the family over and do yard work or other chores.

I'VE SEEN PEOPLE HANG ROSARIES OVER THE REAR-VIEW MIRRORS IN THEIR CARS AND A FEW OF THEM WEAR THEM AROUND THEIR NECKS. IS IT OK TO DO THAT?

The practice of hanging a rosary or a religious medal off of the rearview mirror of one's car is a fairly popular custom across many cultures. While there is no particular rule approving or condemning this practice, we should also be mindful of the respect and reverence due to religious objects and devotional items (i.e. sacramentals).

An important point to consider would be the reason why one chooses to place a rosary or religious medal in our cars. Is it a reminder of the protection and intercession of Mary and the saints? Does it encourage us to be

mindful of God's presence, even in such a mundane task as driving? Is it an outward expression of our more private devotions?



One advantage of having a rosary or religious medal in our cars is that it can also serve as a reminder to pray when we travel, asking for protection for ourselves and for other motorists or commuters. Certainly, invoking the protection and prayers of the saints is a wonderful practice for families, helping to reinforce our belief in the

communion of saints and the care and concern we owe to one another.
