Father Gary writes

Just before Christmas, Pope Francis announced a year dedicated to St. Joseph (in celebration of the 150th Anniversary of Joseph being declared Patron of the Church). An excellent article was written by Father James Martin SJ and published in 'America' magazine titled: **'St. Joseph is the patron saint we need in this pandemic'**: "Joseph's example and patronage come at the perfect time. At a time when a global pandemic has forced millions to live hidden away, isolated and alone, we can see Joseph as a model for the hidden life. We know, too, that Joseph died before Jesus' public ministry; Mary's husband was undoubtedly familiar with suffering. So we can see him as our patron, too, praying for us as he understands our struggles with illness. Like many saints whose lineage can be traced back to the earliest days of the church, very little is known of St. Joseph, besides what we learn from the few lines written about him in the Gospels. He was of King David's line and engaged to a young woman from Nazareth. Mary was found, quite unexpectedly, to be pregnant. But Joseph, "being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace," as the Gospel of Matthew tells it, planned to dissolve his betrothal quietly. Even before Jesus was born, then, Joseph's tender compassion and forgiving heart were on full display. But God had other plans. God used a dream to reveal his redemptive plans for the carpenter from Nazareth: "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit."

There are a few stories about the boy Jesus – he is lost on a journey and found teaching in the temple – and then we reach the hidden part of our Savior's life. All the Gospel of Luke says about those eighteen years is this: "And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favor." Those years were Joseph's time. Joseph would have passed on to Jesus the values required to become a good carpenter. You need patience (waiting till the wood is dry and ready), good judgment (for ensuring that your plumb line is straight), persistence (for sanding until the tabletop is smooth) and honesty (for charging people a fair price). It is not difficult to imagine that the virtues Jesus learned from his teacher – patience, judgment, persistence and honesty – served him well in his later ministry. The hiddenness of Joseph's life can also speak to those overwhelmed by the pandemic, who wonder if God is with them, if God sees them. Joseph's life says to all of us, "God sees." His hidden life is intimately shared by millions of people making their way through the pandemic: the health care worker on the frontlines who sacrifices are hidden even from her family. The single parent who cannot confide to anyone her intense worry about her children. The adult child of an aging parent living in a nursing home, terrified about the spread of illness among elderly residents. The Covid patient dying alone, wondering what is happening. So many hidden lives. So many unseen acts of love in this pandemic. So many secret prayers raised to heaven. St. Joseph, patron of the hidden life, of this pandemic, pray for us, this year and forever. Amen."

Pray for Our Priests





Language Arts in the Catholic school setting provides so many rich opportunities to combine a middle school student's developing sense of self and maturing faith with language arts skills. Reading, writing, grammar, and presentation skills can all be infused with elements of the Catholic faith to improve not only effective communication skills, but a growing personal faith in God.

In the first trimester, our middle school students enjoyed several different genres of young adult fiction books by Catholic authors that not only told an adventurous story, but built and encouraged a personal relationship with Christ. They developed writing skills through formal written essays and journal entries, reflecting on the homilies of student liturgies.

In one recent example, the 6th grade students created PowerPoint presentations based on the action verb part of speech using the OLL Core Values. This project helped students deepen their understanding of grammar, relate it to their faith, and showcase their impressive technology skill set.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION YOU WILL SEE

Jesus' cousin, John the Baptist, baptized people with water but told his followers that someone was coming who would baptize with the Holy Spirit. Today's Gospel reading does not record any conversation between John and Jesus, but emphasizes that as John watches Jesus go by, he announces that this man is indeed the promised one, the Lamb of God. Andrew and another man set out to follow Jesus, who turns and asks what they are looking for. Their answer is a strange one: they want to know where he lives. Jesus simply replies, "Come, and you will see." We are told they stay with him for the whole day. The next day, Andrew finds his brother, Simon, and tells him he has met the Messiah—the Anointed One—and takes Simon to meet Jesus. Like John, Jesus looks hard at Simon, taking the measure of the man, and in the light of what he perceives in him changes his name to Cephas—or as we more commonly know it, Peter ("the rock"). The two encounters seem very ordinary, yet they are life-changing. Jesus is not proclaiming a message, preaching to a crowd, or performing great miracles. Instead, he is simply walking past John, and when Andrew and his friend introduce themselves, offers them hospitality and companionship. When Jesus meets Peter, he does not ask probing questions about his family and his background or make



solemn pronouncements. He just looks at the man, makes an assessment of his character, and accepts him as a friend. The simplicity of Jesus' manner demonstrates his willingness to receive people "as they are" but also to call forth their potential. He does not offer lengthy explanations of who he is, but takes people to his home and lets them see for themselves.



“I Heard God Laugh” Study Guide: My Spiritual Journey

The purpose of this study guide is to help you delve further into *I Heard God Laugh* by exploring your personal prayer journal, your reaction to Matthew Kelly’s insights, and your own attempts to apply what you’ve learned to your life.

Prayer

Soul, Set the worries of this world aside and allow yourself to soar like a bird on the wind. Listen to the whispers of your Creator calling you gently to you, inviting you to remember that just as the body needs food, so too your soul needs to be nourished. Amen.

Discussion Questions

1. Who is someone you’ve gone to for advice in the past? Did their advice help you? Do you go to God with these concerns, asking for advice and guidance? Why or why not? Do you want to?
2. When did your spiritual journey begin? Was it at a conference, an event, through a mentor, a family friend? Is there a moment when you encountered God, Jesus, or the Holy Spirit in a powerful way? Think about it as a transformation in one’s life that redefines your mission or purpose.
3. When was the last time, if ever, that you asked the question: God, what do you think I should do?
4. Matthew’s high school motto was *Luceat Lux Vestra* or “Let your light shine.” Do you have a motto for your life? If so, what is it and how did you develop it?
5. Matthew says that when God invites us to trust in Him, he promises that everything will work out in the end, but he doesn’t promise that everything will work out the way we want it to. Is there a time you have seen that happen in your life? It has been said that God answers prayers in 3 ways: yes; not yet; I have something better for you. How do you interpret that idea?


Tampa Bay March for Life January 23 at 9:30-11:15am

I GET ANNOYED WITH MYSELF WHEN I AM DISTRACTED WHILE I PRAY. IS IT A SIN? HOW CAN I BE MORE ATTENTIVE?

The mind is a marvelous and complex thing, producing amazing thoughts, images, wisdom and inspiration. Yet at times it is like a two-year-old: it does not follow directions, does what it wants and loves to tell us "no!" This is probably the oldest and most common problem in the spiritual life-dealing with distraction. It comes in all forms: good intentions forgotten, wandering thoughts at Mass, daydreaming, etc. A little poem says it all: When the soul begins to pray, the brain always wants to play!

There are many ways to handle distractions. If we are distracted by thoughts about our families or friends, we should pray for them. If we lose our focus, we need just "re-collect" ourselves. If some worry or concern just won't leave our mind, then we deal with it and come back to prayer or make it part of our prayer. And when words just won't come, the only prayer we might offer is our presence, our suffering, and our desire to be close to the Lord. Most importantly, we need to be patient with ourselves. These things are not sinful, but reminders of our human frailty. Our weaknesses and good efforts are all acceptable to God, who reads the love in our hearts and the good intentions of our minds.


