



As I write in this message on every Easter Sunday: this is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad. **Christ is risen, He is Risen indeed**, and Alleluia is our song of praise and thanksgiving! Last year, because we were in the midst of lockdown, we were unable to come together as a community of faith to celebrate Christ's victory over death. Many thousands joined us online, but that is not the same as being together in person to celebrate the most important day in the Church's year. By dying Christ destroyed death, and by rising Christ restored life. Just as Christ emerged from the darkness of the tomb, we are beginning to emerge from the darkness of the pandemic. As I have stated on a number of occasions, the last few months have tested our faith and resolve, and rearranged our priorities. We have recognized the importance of family and friends, and of our family of faith, the Church. We need the love and support of each other, to hold each other together in challenging times. We change when our habits change, and for many the habit of physically going to Mass has been broken for obvious reasons. This is understandable when we are in the midst of a pandemic and maintaining a distance from crowds of people. But now that the vaccine is being widely administered, this is a good time to return in person to Mass, to celebrate our faith in the Risen Christ, to pray around the Eucharistic Table (Altar) with our brothers and sisters, and to receive the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. We need to be fed and nourished by Jesus! Our Bishop, Gregory Parkes, is encouraging everyone to return to the practice of going physically to Mass and will be restoring the obligation (except for the most vulnerable) within a month or so. During the last year many have lost loved ones to the virus, and we hold them all in prayer. I have sat with a number of families unable to touch and hug those closest and dearest to them as they prepared to die. We are physical people. Jesus physically rose from the dead, he was not a ghost! How blessed we are, even if our hearts are broken with grief and pain, to know the promise of this day, that death is not the end, that Jesus is the Resurrection and the Life, and in him we can always place our hope. God will never let us down, Jesus, is the proof.

I hope you are able to spend some quality time with your families and friends and to celebrate this great day. We celebrated a grace filled Lent, and I would like to thank you all for your continued love, commitment and generosity to your parish family. You have risen (pardon the pun) to every challenge. Our parish has been a beacon of hope in so many practical ways. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our parish and school staff, who have worked so tirelessly to keep Christ's mission alive and to provide a great education to our children. Our Faith Formation Department continues to inspire our families, children and young people with the joy of the Gospel. Our music lifts our hearts and minds in praise and thanksgiving to our God. No matter what the challenges have been and are, there is still much to thank God for. Happy fifty days of joy! Jesus is Risen!

What a year it has been so far in Fourth Grade! As we navigate the journey of learning amidst Covid-19, we are striving to do our very best and to have fun as we learn. Our daily journey of understanding starts with Religion, where we have been focusing not only on the Liturgical Seasons, but also on the 10 Commandments. We have been breaking down each Commandment and discussing the different ways God shows us love and how we can show others love through that Commandment. We have also finished our altar server training and are now serving at weekend Masses, school Masses, and at Lenten morning Masses.

We have made amazing progress in our Mathematical journey! After working through place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division, as well as factors and multiples, we have arrived at the studying of fractions. There is so much in store for our class as fractions are a very important part of our math journey this year. We will be spending quite some time making sure we master it!

In Social Studies, we are finishing up our journey through early Florida history (the 1800s) and are about to move into more modern Florida history. The students have been fascinated by our state's unique history. Even though we cannot go on our annual St. Augustine trip, that does not mean that we won't still have a St. Augustine experience. It's just going to look a little different!

Journeying into ELA brings us to Florida novels and writing. Writing is a huge part of Fourth Grade, and we are working hard to make sure we are becoming skilled and thoughtful writers. By the end of the year, we will be writing full essays! Currently we are bringing our Florida history skills into our reading as we read and analyze the novel *The Talking Earth* by Jean Craighead George. As we move into the third trimester, we will be reading a second book centering on the Florida Keys during the Great Depression. It has been wonderful for the students to connect what we have been learning in Social Studies to our Reading class!

Our daily journey ends with Science, where we are learning about force and motion. This lends itself to many unique experiences and real-life examples in our everyday lives that help to bring the subject matter alive for the students.

This school year has not been an ordinary one, but the Fourth-Grade class is thriving and is as curious as ever. I have no doubt that this amazing group of students will persevere through to the end of the school year!

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION ON EASTER EVE

Place 1 cup of pecans in a zippered plastic bag and let children break them into pieces with a wooden spoon. Explain that Jesus was arrested and was beaten by Roman soldiers. Let each child smell the vinegar and pour 1 teaspoon into a mixing bowl. Explain that Jesus was thirsty on the cross and was given vinegar to drink. Add 3 egg whites, representing life, to the vinegar. Explain that Jesus gave his life to give us life. Sprinkle salt into each child's hand. Let them taste it and put a pinch into the bowl. Explain that this represents the salty tears shed by Jesus' disciples, and the bitterness of our own sins. Add 1 cup of sugar. Explain that the sweetest part of the story is that Jesus died because he loves us. He wants us to know this and how to belong to him. Beat with a mixer on high speed until stiff peaks are formed. Explain that the color white represents our purity when God forgives our sins. Fold in the nuts. Drop by teaspoons onto a cookie sheet covered in waxed paper. Explain that each mound represents the rocky tomb where Jesus' body was laid. Put the cookie sheet in a 300° F oven, close the door and turn the oven *off!* Give each child a piece of tape and seal the



oven door. Explain that Jesus' tomb was sealed. Go to bed! Explain that they may feel sad leaving the cookies in the oven overnight, just as Jesus' disciples were miserable when the tomb was sealed. On Easter day, open the oven and give everyone a cookie. Notice the cracked surface and take a bite. The cookies are hollow! On the first Easter Jesus' followers were amazed to find the tomb open and empty! Jesus is alive!

Also, these gifts help you avoid the Medicare high income surcharge and can help reduce your income taxes on your social security benefits. Distributions must be made *directly* from your IRA account to Our Lady of Lourdes or the Diocese of St. Petersburg for the benefit of Our Lady of Lourdes. Catholic leaders around the world, including Pope Francis, urge that it is our moral and ethical responsibility as Catholics to be vaccinated

From Pope Francis' Interview with Canale 5 (Italy), January 2021

I believe that ethically, everyone should take the vaccine. It is an ethical choice because you are gambling with your health, with your life, but you are also gambling with the lives of others.

From the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops Statement, December 2020

Receiving the COVID-19 vaccine ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community. We should keep in mind that some people cannot themselves be vaccinated; they must rely on the rest of the community's becoming immune through vaccination so that the disease does not travel through the community and infect them. In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good.

From Archbishop of Dublin's Christmas Day Sermon, 2020

As many of us around the world dare to hope that with COVID-19 vaccines beginning to be rolled out that we may be a step closer to finding our way of this pandemic, and putting it behind us, we must never forget that, in the distribution of the vaccine, there are substantial justice issues of which we must not lose sight of. We have a moral responsibility, as scripture reinforces, to seize this new sense of neighborliness and understanding of the realities and suffering others are experiencing as a result of this crisis, and grasp the opportunity to each play our part in building a new and fairer society as one global family.

From the President of the Episcopal Conference of Latin America (CELAM)'s New Years Message, Dec 2020

We must attend and take care of the lives of thousands of our brothers and sisters, strengthening the health system to successfully face the coronavirus pandemic and find a solution to the economic crisis that has impoverished thousands of families [...] There is no doubt that the hope of access to the vaccine for all is an urgent need and a requirement of all sectors of society [...] To get better out of this crisis we must do it together, in solidarity.

From the President of the New Zealand Catholic Bishops Conference's Statement, January 2021

Vaccines work, and they protect against a wide range of illnesses. Because of vaccines, once-universal diseases ... have been wiped out, saving countless lives. To protect everyone against a disease, it is vital that most people in a country be vaccinated. [...] Everyone, including Catholics, has a moral responsibility to protect themselves and others by getting a Covid-19 vaccine as soon as they become eligible for it under the Government's planned vaccine program.

From the Pastoral Letter of the Filipino Bishops Conference, January 2021

After nearly a year of the pandemic - both in terms of lives lost and the devastated economic impact - we must thank God because scientists have developed vaccines to immunize people against Covid [...] everyone should be aware of their obligation to protect themselves and others from infection and...against the further spread of the virus.

From the Mexican Bishops Conference statement, February 2021

It is necessary to consider the purpose and ethical relevance of personal collaboration in the vaccination campaign. Vaccines are preparations intended to generate immunity against a disease by stimulating the production of antibodies. In today's world, the use of vaccines clinically accepted by the international scientific community helps to protect personal health and that of our neighbors, helps to care for creation; it is an action that safeguards the true common good and promotes the true culture of life, based on unrestricted respect for the dignity of every human person and the justice derived from it. [...] We Catholics must not contribute in any way to disinformation because the lives of people, especially the most vulnerable, are at risk. We invite all the Catholic faithful, and all brothers and sisters of good will, to commit ourselves to prevention as part of our daily lives, in order to avoid unnecessary suffering and loss of life.

From the Joint Statement of Caritas Europea and the Commission of the Bishop's Conferences of the European Union February 2021

Commitment to solidarity must be the decisive criterion in this historic moment. It is urgent to implement mass vaccination campaigns quickly. We urge the European Union to promote widescale vaccination not only for Europe's own safety and protection, but also for global public health as a public good, benefiting people living in poorer nations as much as they benefit people living in countries with the resources to create and produce the vaccines. Ensuring vaccine access for all - that they are available and affordable - is a global moral urgency.

The Catholic Church is entirely responsible for the composition of the Bible, which books are included, as well as the breakup of the chapters and verses. Protestants have removed some books of the Bible because some of the verses were inconsistent with their theology. Martin Luther was a prime offender in this regard, removing Tobit, Judith, 1 and 2 Maccabees, Wisdom, Sirach and Baruch. He also made an effort to remove James and Revelations, but this was rejected by his followers and those two books were kept. Catholics are often accused of "adding" the books, but despite this common belief, it is false. Older, pre-Protestant, Catholic translations of the Bible include them.






