

Eucharistic Adoration at St. Peter the Rock!

March 7th is the first Friday of the month.

First Friday of the month extended Eucharistic Adoration begins at 9:00am to 8:00am Saturday morning.

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Mass and Reconciliation on the First Saturday March 1st is the first Saturday of the month.

Please join us the first Saturday of the month at 8:00am for Mass. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will follow Mass at 8:40 am. In reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary include the following elements, performed with the intention of reparation for blasphemies against the Immaculate Heart,

for at least five consecutive months:

- Confession (shortly before or after the First Saturday so long as the person receives Holy Communion in a state of grace);
- Holy Communion received on the First Saturday of each month:
- the Holy Rosary, five decades recited sometime during the day: and
- 4) meditating for 15 minutes on the Mysteries of the Rosary

Communion under Both Kinds

281. Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds. For in this form the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is more clearly evident and clearer expression is given to the divine will by which the new and eternal Covenant is ratified in the Blood of the Lord, as also the connection between the Eucharistic banquet and the eschatological banquet in the Kingdom of the Father.[104]

282. Sacred pastors should take care to ensure that the faithful who participate in the rite or are present at it, are made aware by the most suitable means possible of the Catholic teaching on the form of Holy Communion as laid down by the Ecumenical Council of Trent. Above all, they should instruct the Christian faithful that the Catholic faith teaches that Christ, whole and entire, and the true Sacrament, is received even under only one species, and hence that as regards the resulting fruits, those who receive under only one species are not deprived of any grace that is necessary for salvation.[105]

Furthermore, they should teach that the Church, in her administration of the Sacraments, has the power to lay down or alter whatever provisions, apart from the substance of the Sacraments, that she judges to be more readily conducive to reverence for the Sacraments and the good of the recipients, in view of changing conditions, times, and places.[106] However, at the same time the faithful should be instructed to participate more readily in this sacred rite, by which the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is made more fully evident.

De la Instrucción General del Misal Romano (IGMR)

Comunión bajo las dos especies

281. La sagrada Comunión tiene una expresión más plena por razón del signo cuando se hace bajo las dos especies, ya que en esa forma es donde más perfectamente se manifiesta el signo del banquete eucarístico, y se expresa más claramente la voluntad divina con que se ratifica en la Sangre del Señor la Alianza nueva y eterna, y se ve mejor la relación entre el banquete eucarístico y el banquete escatológico en el reino del Padre[105].

282. Procuren los sagrados pastores recordar a los fieles que participan en el rito o intervienen en él, y del modo que más adecuado resulte, la doctrina católica sobre esta forma de la sagrada Comunión, según el Concilio Ecuménico Tridentino. Adviertan, en primer lugar, a los fieles que la fe católica enseña que, aun bajo una sola de las dos especies, cualquiera que sea, está Cristo entero, y que se recibe un verdadero Sacramento, y que, por consiguiente, por lo que toca a los frutos de la Comunión, no se priva de ninguna de las gracias necesarias a la salvación al que sólo recibe una sola especie [106].

Enseñen, además, que la Iglesia tiene poder, en lo que toca a la administración de los Sacramentos, de determinar o cambiar, dejando siempre intacta su sustancia, lo que considera más oportuno para ayudar a los fieles en su veneración y en la utilidad de quien los recibe, según las variedad de circunstancias, tiempos y lugares[107]. Y adviértanles al mismo tiempo que se interesen en participar con el mayor empeño en el sagrado rito, en la forma en que más plenamente brilla el signo del banquete eucarístico.

CCC - IV. The Divine Works and the Trinitarian Missions

The ultimate end of the whole divine economy is the entry of God's creatures into the perfect unity of the Blessed Trinity.100 But even now we are called to be a dwelling for the Most Holy Trinity: "If a man loves me," says the Lord, "he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him, and make our home with him":101 (1050, 1721, 1997, 2565)

O my God, Trinity whom I adore, help me forget myself entirely so to establish myself in you, unmovable and peaceful as if my soul were already in eternity. May nothing be able to trouble my peace or make me leave you, O my unchanging God, but may each minute bring me more deeply into your mystery! Grant my soul peace. Make it your heaven, your beloved dwelling and the place of your rest. May I never abandon you there, but may I be there, whole and entire, completely vigilant in my faith, entirely adoring, and wholly given over to your creative action.102"

IN BRIEF

- The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and of Christian life. God alone can make it known to us by revealing himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- The Incarnation of God's Son reveals that God is the eternal Father and that the Son is consubstantial with the Father, which means that, in the Father and with the Father, the Son is one and the same God.
- The mission of the Holy Spirit, sent by the Father in the name of the Son (Jn 14:26) and by the Son "from the Father" (Jn 15:26), reveals that, with them, the Spirit is one and the same God. "With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified" (Nicene Creed).
- "The Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father as the first principle and, by the eternal gift of this to the Son, from the communion of both the Father and the Son" (St. Augustine, De Trin. 15, 26, 47: PL 42:1095).

39. How did more and more people learn about the Resurrection?

According to the oldest text of the Bible about the Resurrection, Jesus "appeared to Cephas, then to the Twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles" (1 Cor 15:5-7).

The -> evangelists reported several encounters with the resurrected Jesus: in the garden, by the lake, on the way to Emmaus, in the upper room of a house. The encounters with the risen Christ must have been staggering. Many came to believe that Jesus is the Son of God.
