Communion under Both Kinds cont.

284. When Communion is distributed under both kinds:

- a) the chalice is usually administered by a Deacon or, in the absence of a Deacon, by a Priest, or even by a duly instituted acolyte or another extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, or by one of the faithful who, in a case of necessity, has been entrusted with this duty for a single occasion;
- b) whatever may remain of the Blood of Christ is consumed at the altar by the Priest or the Deacon or the duly instituted acolyte who ministered the chalice. The same then purifies, wipes, and arranges the sacred vessels in the usual way.

Any of the faithful who wish to receive Holy Communion under the species of bread alone should be given Communion in this form.

285. For Communion under both kinds the following should be prepared:

- a) If Communion from the chalice is done by drinking directly from the chalice, a chalice of a sufficiently large size or several chalices are prepared. However, care should be taken lest beyond what is needed of the Blood of Christ remains to be consumed at the end of the celebration.
- b) If Communion from the chalice is done by intinction, the hosts should be neither too thin nor too small, but rather a little thicker than usual, so that after being intincted partly into the Blood of Christ they can still be easily distributed.

Comunión bajo las dos especies 284. Cuando la Comunión se distribuye bajo las dos especies:

a) del cáliz se ocupa ordinariamente el diácono o, en su ausencia, el presbítero; o incluso un acólito legítimamente instituido u otro ministro extraordinario de la sagrada Comunión; o un fiel, al cual, en caso de necesidad, se le encomienda ese oficio para esa determinada ocasión; b) lo que eventualmente pueda quedar de la Sangre de Cristo es consumido junto al altar por el sacerdote o por el diácono o por el acólito debidamente instituido, que se ocupó del cáliz, y luego purifica los vasos sagrados, los seca y arregla, como de costumbre.

285. Para distribuir la Comunión bajo las dos especies prepárense:

- a) si la Comunión se hace bebiendo directamente del cáliz, un cáliz de tamaño suficiente, o varios cálices, pero siempre de tal manera que no quede una excesiva cantidad de la Sangre de Cristo para tomar al final de la celebración;
- b) si la Comunión bajo las dos especies se va a dar por intinción, téngase cuidado que las hos- tias no sean ni demasiado delgadas ni demasiado pequeñas, sino un poco más gruesas de lo acostumbrado, para que, mojadas parcialmente con la Sangre de Cristo, se puedan distribuir cómodamente.

Prayer

During Lent, we are asked to devote ourselves to seeking the Lord in prayer and reading Scripture, to service by giving alms, and to practice self-control through fasting. Dive into God's word in

Scripture this Lent or pray the rosary with your family.

Fasting

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

270 God is the Father Almighty, whose fatherhood and power shed light on one another: God reveals his fatherly omnipotence by the way he takes care of our needs; by the filial adoption that he gives us ("I will be a father to you, and you shall be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty."):109 finally by his infinite mercy, for he displays his power at its height by freely forgiving sins. (2777, 1441)

271 God's almighty power is in no way arbitrary: "In God, power, essence, will, intellect, wisdom, and justice are all identical. Nothing therefore can be in God's power which could not be in his just will or his wise intellect." 110

The mystery of God's apparent powerlessness

272 Faith in God the Father Almighty can be put to the test by the experience of evil and suffering. God can sometimes seem to be absent and incapable of stopping evil. But in the most mysterious way God the Father has revealed his almighty power in the voluntary humiliation and Resurrection of his Son, by which he conquered evil. Christ crucified is thus "the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men."111 It is in Christ's Resurrection and exaltation that the Father has shown forth "the immeasurable greatness of his power in us who believe."112 (309, 412, 609, 648)

273 Only faith can embrace the mysterious ways of God's almighty power. This faith glories in its weaknesses in order to draw to itself Christ's power.113 The Virgin Mary is the supreme model of this faith, for she believed that "nothing will be impossible with God," and was able to magnify the Lord: "For he who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name."114 (148)

274 "Nothing is more apt to confirm our faith and hope than holding it fixed in our minds that nothing is impossible with God. Once our reason has grasped the idea of God's almighty power, it will easily and without any hesitation admit everything that [the Creed] will afterwards propose for us to believe—even if they be great and marvellous things, far above the ordinary laws of nature."115 (1814, 1817)
