

#### From the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM)



#### Communion under Both Kinds cont.

286. If Communion of the Blood of Christ is carried out by communicants' drinking from the chalice, each communicant, after receiving the Body of Christ, moves to the minister of the chalice and stands facing him. The minister says, The Blood of Christ, the communicant replies, Amen, and the minister hands over the chalice, which the communicant raises to his or her mouth. Each communicant drinks a little from the chalice, hands it back to the minister, and then withdraws; the minister wipes the rim of the chalice with the purificator.

287. If Communion from the chalice is carried out by intinction, each communicant, holding a Communion-plate under the mouth, approaches the Priest who holds a vessel with the sacred particles, with a minister standing at his side and holding the chalice. The Priest takes a host, intincts it partly in the chalice and, showing it, says, The Body and Blood of Christ. The communicant replies, Amen, receives the Sacrament in the mouth from the Priest, and then withdraws.

#### De la Instrucción General del Misal Romano (IGMR)

#### Comunión bajo las dos especies

286. Si la Comunión de la Sangre se realiza bebiendo del cáliz, el que comulga, después que recibió el Cuerpo de Cristo, pasa ante el ministro del cáliz y espera de pie. El ministro dice: La Sangre de Cristo; y el que comulga responde: Amén. El ministro le da el cáliz y el que comulga lo lleva con sus manos a la boca. El que comulga bebe un poco del cáliz, lo restituye al ministro y se retira; el ministro limpia el borde del cáliz con un purificador.

287. Si la Comunión del cáliz se realiza por intinción, el que comulga, teniendo el platillo debajo del mentón, se acerca al sacerdote, que tiene el recipiente con las sagradas partículas y a cuyo lado está el ministro que tiene el cáliz. El sacerdote toma una hostia, la moja parcialmente en el cáliz y, mostrándola, dice: El Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo; el que comulga responde: Amén, recibe en la boca el Sacramento de manos del sacerdote y después se retira.

#### CCC - IV. The Divine Works and the Trinitarian Missions

#### **IN BRIEF**

275 With Job, the just man, we confess: "I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted" (Job 42:2).

276 Faithful to the witness of Scripture, the Church often addresses its prayer to the "almighty and eternal God" ("omnipotens sempiterne Deus..."), believing firmly that "nothing will be impossible with God" (Gen 18:14; Lk 1:37; Mt 19:26).

277 God shows forth his almighty power by converting us from our sins and restoring us to his friendship by grace. "God, you show your almighty power above all in your mercy and forgiveness..." (Roman Missal, 26th Sunday, Opening Prayer).

278 If we do not believe that God's love is almighty, how can we believe that the Father could create us, the Son redeem us, and the Holy Spirit sanctify us?"

#### Paragraph 4. The Creator

279 "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth."116 Holy Scripture begins with these solemn words. The profession of faith takes them up when it confesses that God the Father almighty is "Creator of heaven and earth" (Apostles' Creed), "of all that is, seen and unseen" (Nicene Creed). We shall speak first of the Creator, then of creation, and finally of the fall into sin from which Jesus Christ, the Son of God, came to raise us up again.

280 Creation is the foundation of "all God's saving plans," the "beginning of the history of salvation"117 that culminates in Christ. Conversely, the mystery of Christ casts conclusive light on the mystery of creation and reveals the end for which "in the beginning God created the heavens and the earth": from the beginning, God envisaged the glory of the new creation in Christ.118 (288, 1043)

281 And so the readings of the Easter Vigil, the celebration of the new creation in Christ, begin with the creation account; likewise in the Byzantine liturgy, the account of creation always constitutes the first reading at the vigils of the great feasts of the Lord. According to ancient witnesses the instruction of catechumens for Baptism followed the same itinerary.119 (1095)
