For only what is required for the celebration of the Mass may be placed on the altar table: namely, from the beginning of the celebration until the proclamation of the Gospel, the Book of the Gospels; then from the Presentation of the Gifts until the purification of the vessels, the chalice with the paten, a ciborium, if necessary, and, finally, the corporal, the purificator, the pall, and the Missal. In addition, arranged discreetly, there should be whatever may be needed to amplify the Priest's voice. 307. The candlesticks required for the different liturgical services for reasons of reverence or the festive character of the celebration (cf. no. 117) should be appropriately placed either on the altar or around it, according to the design of the altar and the sanctuary, so that the whole may be harmonious and the faithful may not be impeded from a clear view of what takes place at the altar or what is placed upon it.

Likewise, either on the altar or near it, there is to be a cross, with the figure of Christ crucified upon it, a cross clearly visible to the assembled people. It is desirable that such a cross should remain near the altar even outside of liturgical celebrations, so as to call to mind for the faithful the saving Passion of the Lord.

<u>El altar y su ornato</u>

306. Sobre la mesa del altar se puede colocar solamente aquello que se requiere para la celebración de la Misa, es decir, el Evangeliario desde el inicio de la celebración hasta la proclamación del Evangelio; y desde la presentación de los dones hasta la purificación de los vasos, el cáliz, con la patena, el copón si es necesario; y también el corporal, el purificador, la palia y el misal.

Colóquese, además, de manera discreta lo que pueda ser necesario para la amplificación de la voz del sacerdote.

307. Los candeleros, que en cada acción litúrgica se requieren como signo de veneración o de celebración festiva (cfr. n. 117), colóquense en la forma más conveniente, o sobre el altar o alrededor de él, teniendo en cuenta la estructura del altar y del presbiterio, de modo que todo forme una armónica unidad y no impida a los fieles ver fácilmente lo que sobre el altar se hace o se coloca.

308. También sobre el altar o cerca de él ha de haber una cruz, con la imagen de Cristo crucificado, que sea muy visible para el pueblo congregado. Conviene que esta cruz permanezca junto al altar también fuera de las celebraciones litúrgicas, a fin de traer a la mente de los fieles la pasión salvadora del Señor.


