

# From the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM)



# I. The Bread and Wine for Celebrating the Eucharist cont.

324. If after the Consecration or as he receives Communion, the Priest notices that not wine but only water was poured into the chalice, he pours the water into some container, pours wine with water into the chalice and consecrates it, saying the part of narrative relating to the Consecration of the chalice, without being obliged to consecrate the bread again.

# **II. Sacred Furnishings in General**

325. As in the case of the building of churches, so also regarding all sacred furnishings, the Church admits the manner of art of each individual region and accepts those adaptations that are in keeping with the culture and traditions of the individual nations, provided that all are suited to the purpose for which the sacred furnishings are intended.[134]

In this matter as well, that noble simplicity should be ensured which is the best accompaniment of genuine art.

326. In choosing materials for sacred furnishings, besides those which are traditional, others are admissible that, according to the mentality of our own age, are considered to be noble and are durable, and well suited for sacred use. In the Dioceses of the United States of America these materials may include wood, stone, or metal which are solid and appropriate to the purpose for which they are employed.

# I. Pan y vino para la celebración de la Eucaristía

324. Si después de la consagración o en el momento de comulgar el sacerdote cae en la cuenta de que no se había puesto vino en el cáliz, sino agua, dejando ésta en un vaso, pondrá de nuevo vino y agua en el cáliz, y lo consagrará, diciendo la parte de la consagración que corresponde a la consagración del cáliz, sin que deba repetir la consagración del pan.

# II. Utensilios sagrados en general

325. Como para la edificación de las iglesias, así también para todo su mobiliario y ajuar, la Iglesia acepta el estilo artístico de cada región y admite todas las adaptaciones que vayan con el modo de ser y tradiciones de cada pueblo, con tal que todo responda de una manera adecuada al uso sagrado para el que se destinan[135].

También en este campo búsquese con cuidado la noble sencillez que tanto conviene al arte auténtico.

326. En la selección de materiales para los utensilios sagrados, se pueden admitir no sólo los materiales tradicionales, sino también otros que, según la mentalidad de nuestro tiempo, se consideran nobles, son duraderos y se acomodan bien al uso sagrado. En las diócesis de los Estados Unidos de América estos materiales deben ser de madera, piedra, o metal que sean sólidos y apropiados al propósito para el cual son empleados.

# **CCC - IV. The Divine Works and the Trinitarian Missions**

#### IN BRIEF

- 315 In the creation of the world and of man, God gave the first and universal witness to his almighty love and his wisdom, the first proclamation of the "plan of his loving goodness," which finds its goal in the new creation in Christ.
- 316 Though the work of creation is attributed to the Father in particular, it is equally a truth of faith that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit together are the one, indivisible principle of creation.
- 317 God alone created the universe freely, directly, and without any help.
- 318 No creature has the infinite power necessary to "create" in the proper sense of the word, that is, to produce and give being to that which had in no way possessed it (to call into existence "out of nothing") (cf. DS 3624).
- 319 God created the world to show forth and communicate his glory. That his creatures should share in his truth, goodness, and beauty—this is the glory for which God created them.
- 320 God created the universe and keeps it in existence by his Word, the Son "upholding the universe by his word of power" (Heb 1:3) and by his Creator Spirit, the giver of life.
- Divine providence consists of the dispositions by which God guides all his creatures with wisdom and love to their ultimate end.
- 322 Christ invites us to filial trust in the providence of our heavenly Father (cf. Mt 6:26-34), and St. Peter the apostle repeats: "Cast all your anxieties on him, for he cares about you" (1 Pet 5:7; cf. Ps 55:23).
- 323 Divine providence works also through the actions of creatures. To human beings God grants the ability to cooperate freely with his plans.
- 324 The fact that God permits physical and even moral evil is a mystery that God illuminates by his Son Jesus Christ who died and rose to vanquish evil. Faith gives us the certainty that God would not permit an evil if he did not cause a good to come from that very evil, by ways that we shall fully know only in eternal life.

#### **Summer Heat & Our Dress for Mass**

As the summer temperatures climb, please remember that your attire for Mass should be modest, dignified and respectful of the Lord's presence.

Shorts are not allowed in St. Peter's Basilica, and so we should therefore follow the Church's lead for appropriate attire in the Lord's presence in the church and for Mass.

At St. Peter's women's dress length is to the knee and shoulders covered. Men are to wear pants and a short sleeve shirt.

Therefore everyone attending Mass should have their knees and shoulders covered.
