Eucharist - The REAL Presence of Christ!

The mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique. It raises the Eucharist above all the sacraments as "the perfection of the spiritual life and the end to which all the sacraments tend."201 In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist "the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained."202 "This presence is called 'real'—...because it is presence in the fullest sense: that is to say, it is a substantial presence by which Christ, God and man, makes himself wholly and entirely present."203

III. Sacred Vessels

327. Among the requisites for the celebration of Mass, the sacred vessels are held in special honor, and among these especially the chalice and paten, in which the bread and wine are offered and consecrated and from which they are consumed.

328. Sacred vessels should be made from precious metal. If they are made from metal that rusts or from a metal less precious than gold, they should generally be gilded on the inside.

329. In the Dioceses of the United States of America, sacred vessels may also be made from other solid materials which in the common estimation in each region are considered precious or noble, for example, ebony or other harder woods, provided that such materials are suitable for sacred use. In this case, preference is always to be given to materials that do not easily break or deteriorate. This applies to all vessels that are intended to hold the hosts, such as the paten, the ciborium, the pyx, the monstrance, and others of this kind.

330. As regards chalices and other vessels that are intended to serve as receptacles for the Blood of the Lord, they are to have a bowl of material that does not absorb liquids. The base, on the other hand, may be made of other solid and worthy materials.

331. For the Consecration of hosts, a large paten may fittingly be used, on which is placed the bread both for the Priest and the Deacon and also for the other ministers and for the faithful.

III. Los vasos sagrados

327. Entre las cosas que se requieren para la celebración de la Misa merecen especial honor los vasos sagrados, y entre éstos, el cáliz y la patena, en los que el pan y el vino se ofrecen, consagran y se toman.

328. Los vasos sagrados deben confeccionarse con metal noble. Si están hechos de materiales que puedan oxidarse o de materiales menos nobles que el oro, generalmente deben llevar la parte interior dorada.

329. En las diócesis de los Estados Unidos de América, los vasos sagrados pueden confeccionarse también de otros materiales sólidos, que se consideren nobles según la valoración común en cada región, por ejemplo, de ébano o de otras maderas más duras, con tal que sean adecuados para el uso sagrado. En este caso, se deben preferir siempre los materiales que no se rompan fácilmente ni se corrompan. Esto vale para todos los vasos destinados para contener hostias, como la patena, el copón, la píxide, la custodia u ostensorio y otros semejantes.

330. Los cálices y demás vasos que se destinan para contener la Sangre del Señor, tengan la copa de un material que no absorba los líquidos. El pie, en cambio, puede hacerse de otros materiales sólidos y dignos.

331. Para consagrar las hostias puede utilizarse convenientemente una patena grande, en donde se coloque el pan tanto para el sacerdote y el diácono, como para los otros ministros y los fieles.

CCC - IV. The Divine Works and the Trinitarian Missions

Paragraph 5. Heaven and Earth

325 The Apostles' Creed professes that God is "Creator of heaven and earth." The Nicene Creed makes it explicit that this profession includes "all that is, seen and unseen."

326 The Scriptural expression "heaven and earth" means all that exists, creation in its entirety. It also indicates the bond, deep within creation, that both unites heaven and earth and distinguishes the one from the other: "the earth" is the world of men, while "heaven" or "the heavens" can designate both the firmament and God's own "place" — "our Father in heaven" and consequently the "heaven" too which is eschatological glory. Finally, "heaven" refers to the saints and the "place" of the spiritual creatures, the angels, who surround God.186 (290, 1023, 2794)

327 The profession of faith of the Fourth Lateran Council (1215) affirms that God "from the beginning of time made at once (simul) out of nothing both orders of creatures, the spiritual and the corporeal, that is, the angelic and the earthly, and then (deinde) the human creature, who as it were shares in both orders, being composed of spirit and body."187 (296)

I. The Angels

The existence of angels—a truth of faith

328 The existence of the spiritual, non-corporeal beings that Sacred Scripture usually calls "angels" is a truth of faith. The witness of Scripture is as clear as the unanimity of Tradition. (150)
