Mass and Reconciliation on the First Saturday

Please join us the first Saturday of the month at 8:00am for Mass. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will follow Mass at 8:40 am. In reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary include the following elements, performed with the intention of reparation for blasphemies against the Immaculate Heart,

for at least five consecutive months:

- Confession (shortly before or after the First Saturday so long as the person receives Holy Communion in a state of grace);
- Holy Communion received on the First Saturday of each month;
- the Holy Rosary, five decades recited sometime during the day; and
- 4) meditating for 15 minutes on the Mysteries of the Rosary

III. Sacred Vessels cont.

- 332. As regards the form of the sacred vessels, it is for the artist to fashion them in a manner that is more particularly in keeping with the customs of each region, provided the individual vessels are suitable for their intended liturgical use and are clearly distinguishable from vessels intended for everyday use.
- 333. As for the blessing of sacred vessels, the rites prescribed in the liturgical books should be followed.[135]
- 334. The practice should be kept of building in the sacristy a sacrarium into which is poured the water from the washing of sacred vessels and linens (cf. no. 280).

IV. Sacred Vestments

335. In the Church, which is the Body of Christ, not all members have the same function. This diversity of offices is shown outwardly in the celebration of the Eucharist by the diversity of sacred vestments, which must therefore be a sign of the function proper to each minister. Moreover, these same sacred vestments should also contribute to the decoration of the sacred action itself. The vestments worn by Priests and Deacons, as well as the attire worn by lay ministers, are blessed before being put into liturgical use according to the rite described in the Roman Ritual.[136]

III. Los vasos sagrados cont.

- 332. Por lo que toca a la forma de los vasos sagrados, corresponde al artista confeccionarlos, según el modelo que mejor corresponda a las costumbres de cada región, con tal de que cada vaso sea adecuado para el uso litúrgico a que se destina y se distinga claramente de los vasos destinados al uso cotidiano.
- 333. Respecto a la bendición de los vasos sagrados, obsérvense los ritos prescritos en los libros litúrgicos[136].
- 334. The practice should be kept of building in the sacristy a sacrarium into which is poured the water from the washing of sacred vessels and linens (cf. no. 280).
- 334. Consérvese la costumbre de construir en la sacristía un "sacro", en el cual se vierta el agua con la que se lavan los vasos sagrados y los lienzos (cfr. n. 280).

IV. Las vestiduras litúrgicas

335. En la Iglesia, que es el Cuerpo de Cristo, no todos los miembros desempeñan un mismo oficio. Esta diversidad de funciones se manifiesta exteriormente en la celebración de la Eucaristía por la diversidad de las vestiduras, que, por consiguiente, deben constituir un distintivo propio del oficio que desempeña cada ministro. Por otro lado, estas vestiduras deben contribuir al decoro de la misma acción sagrada. Las vestiduras utilizadas por los sacerdotes y diáconos, como también las de los ministros laicos deben bendecirse oportunamente, antes de que sean destinadas al uso litúrgico según el rito descrito en el Ritual Romano[137].

CCC - IV. The Divine Works and the Trinitarian Missions

I. The Angels cont. Who are they?

- 329 St. Augustine says: "'Angel' is the name of their office, not of their nature. If you seek the name of their nature, it is 'spirit'; if you seek the name of their office, it is 'angel': from what they are, 'spirit,' from what they do, 'angel." 188 With their whole beings the angels are servants and messengers of God. Because they "always behold the face of my Father who is in heaven" they are the "mighty ones who do his word, hearkening to the voice of his word." 189
- 330 As purely spiritual creatures angels have intelligence and will: they are personal and immortal creatures, surpassing in perfection all visible creatures, as the splendor of their glory bears witness.190

Christ "with all his angels"

Christ is the center of the angelic world. They are his angels: "When the Son of man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him...."191 They belong to him because they were created through and for him: "for in him all things were created in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or authorities—all things were created through him and for him."192 They belong to him still more because he has made them messengers of his saving plan: "Are they not all ministering spirits sent forth to serve, for the sake of those who are to obtain salvation?"193 (291)
