IV. Sacred Vestments cont.

336. The sacred garment common to all ordained and instituted ministers of any rank is the alb, to be tied at the waist with a cincture unless it is made so as to fit even without such. Before the alb is put on, should this not completely cover the ordinary clothing at the neck, an amice should be used. The alb may not be exchanged for a surplice, not even over a cassock, on occasions when a chasuble or dalmatic is to be worn or when, according to the norms, only a stole is worn without a chasuble or dalmatic.

337. The vestment proper to the Priest Celebrant at Mass and during other sacred actions directly connected with Mass is the chasuble worn, unless otherwise indicated, over the alb and stole.

338. The vestment proper to the Deacon is the dalmatic, worn over the alb and stole; however, the dalmatic may be omitted out of necessity or on account of a lesser degree of solemnity.

339. In the Dioceses of the United States of America, acolytes, altar servers, readers, and other lay ministers may wear the alb or other appropriate and dignified clothing.

340. The stole is worn by the Priest around his neck and hanging down in front of his chest, while it is worn by the Deacon over his left shoulder and drawn diagonally across the chest to the right side, where it is fastened.

341. The cope is worn by the Priest in processions and during other sacred actions, in accordance with the rubrics proper to the individual rites.

IV. Las vestiduras litúrgicas cont.

336. La vestidura litúrgica común para todos los ministros ordenados e instituidos de cualquier grado es el alba, que debe ceñirse por la cintura con un cíngulo, a no ser que esté hecha de tal manera que pueda ajustarse al cuerpo sin necesidad de cíngulo. Antes de ponerse el alba, si ésta no cubre perfectamente el vestido ordinario alrededor del cuello, póngase un amito. El alba no puede cambiarse por un sobrepelliz, ni siquiera puesto sobre la sotana, cuando se ha de vestir encima la casulla o la dalmática, o cuando, según las normas, se debe utilizar sólo la estola sin casulla o dalmática.

337. La vestidura propia del sacerdote celebrante, en la Misa y en otras acciones sagradas que directamente se relacionan con ella, es la casulla, a no ser que se diga lo contrario, la cual debe ir puesta sobre el alba y la estola.

338. La vestidura propia del diácono es la dalmática, que se pone sobre el alba y la estola; la dalmática, sin embargo, puede omitirse bien por necesidad, bien cuando se trate de un grado menor de solemnidad.

339. En las diócesis de los Estados Unidos de América, los acólitos, monaguillos, lectores y otros ministros laicos pueden vestir alba u otras vestiduras dignas y apropiadas.

340. La estola la lleva el sacerdote alrededor del cuello y pendiendo ante el pecho; en cambio, el diácono la lleva cruzada, desde el hombro izquierdo, pasando sobre el pecho, hacia el lado derecho del cuerpo, donde se sujeta.

341. La capa pluvial la lleva el sacerdote en las procesiones y en algunas otras acciones sagradas, según las rúbricas de cada rito particular.

CCC - Paragraph 5. Heaven and Earth

I. The Angels

Christ "with all his angels" cont.

332 Angels have been present since creation and throughout the history of salvation, announcing this salvation from afar or near and serving the accomplishment of the divine plan: they closed the earthly paradise; protected Lot; saved Hagar and her child; stayed Abraham's hand; communicated the law by their ministry; led the People of God; announced births and callings; and assisted the prophets, just to cite a few examples.¹⁹⁴ Finally, the angel Gabriel announced the birth of the Precursor and that of Jesus himself.¹⁹⁵

333 From the Incarnation to the Ascension, the life of the Word incarnate is surrounded by the adoration and service of angels. When God "brings the firstborn into the world, he says: 'Let all God's angels worship him.'"¹⁹⁶ Their song of praise at the birth of Christ has not ceased resounding in the Church's praise: "Glory to God in the highest!"¹⁹⁷ They protect Jesus in his infancy, serve him in the desert, strengthen him in his agony in the garden, when he could have been saved by them from the hands of his enemies as Israel had been.¹⁹⁸ Again, it is the angels who "evangelize" by proclaiming the Good News of Christ's Incarnation and Resurrection.¹⁹⁹ They will be present at Christ's return, which they will announce, to serve at his judgment.²⁰⁰ (559)
