#### From the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM)



#### IV. Sacred Vestments cont.

346. As regards the color of sacred vestments, traditional usage should be observed, namely:

- a) The color white is used in the Offices and Masses during Easter Time and Christmas Time; on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity; and furthermore on celebrations of the Lord other than of his Passion, celebrations of the Blessed Virgin Mary, of the Holy Angels, and of Saints who were not Martyrs; on the Solemnities of All Saints (November 1) and of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist (June 24); and on the Feasts of St. John the Evangelist (December 27), of the Chair of St. Peter (February 22), and of the Conversion of St. Paul (January 25).
- b) The color red is used on Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion and on Friday of Holy Week (Good Friday), on Pentecost Sunday, on celebrations of the Lord's Passion, on the "birthday" feast days of Apostles and Evangelists, and on celebrations of Martyr Saints.
- c) The color green is used in the Offices and Masses of Ordinary Time.
- d) The color violet or purple is used in Advent and Lent. It may also be worn in Offices and Masses for the Dead.
- e) Besides the color violet, the colors white or black may be used at funeral services and at other Offices and Masses for the Dead in the Dioceses of the United States of America.
- f) The color rose may be used, where it is the practice, on Gaudete Sunday (Third Sunday of Advent) and on Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent).
- g) On more solemn days, festive, that is, more precious, sacred vestments may be used even if not of the color of the day.
- h) The colors gold or silver may be worn on more solemn occasions in the Dioceses of the United States of America.

#### IV. Las vestiduras litúrgicas cont.

346. Por lo que toca al color de las vestiduras, obsérvese el uso tradicional, es decir:

- a) El blanco se emplea en los Oficios y Misas del Tiempo Pascual y de la Navidad del Señor; además en las celebraciones del Señor que no sean de su Pasión, en las de la Santísima Virgen, de los santos ángeles, de los santos no mártires, en la fiesta de Todos los Santos (1 de noviembre) y de S. Juan Bautista (24 de junio), en las fiestas de S. Juan Evangelista (27 de diciembre), de la Cátedra de S. Pedro (22 de febrero) y de la Conversión de S. Pablo (25 de enero).
- b) El rojo se emplea el domingo de la Pasión y el Viernes Santo, y en el domingo de Pentecostés, en las celebraciones de la Pasión del Señor, en las fiestas natalicias de los Apóstoles y Evangelistas y en las celebraciones de los santos mártires.
- c) El verde se emplea en los Oficios y Misas del llamado "Tiempo Ordinario".
- d) El morado se emplea en el Tiempo de Adviento y de Cuaresma. Puede también usarse en los Oficios y Misas de difuntos.
- e) En los funerales y otros Oficios y Misas de difuntos, además del color morado, se puede usar el color blanco o el negro, en las diócesis de los Estados Unidos de América.
- f) El rosa puede emplearse, donde se acostumbra, en los domingos Gaudete (III de Adviento) y Laetare (IV de Cuaresma).
- g) En los días más solemnes pueden emplearse vestiduras litúrgicas festivas o más nobles, aunque no correspondan al color del día.
- h) Los colores festivos (oro o plata) se pueden utilizar en ocasiones de mayor solemnidad en las diócesis de los Estados Unidos de América.

#### CCC - Paragraph 5. Heaven and Earth

338 Nothing exists that does not owe its existence to God the Creator. The world began when God's word drew it out of nothingness; all existent beings, all of nature, and all human history are rooted in this primordial event, the very genesis by which the world was constituted and time begun.207 (297)

239 Each creature possesses its own particular goodness and perfection. For each one of the works of the "six days" it is said: "And God saw that it was good." "By the very nature of creation, material being is endowed with its own stability, truth, and excellence, its own order and laws." 208 Each of the various creatures, willed in its own being, reflects in its own way a ray of God's infinite wisdom and goodness. Man must therefore respect the particular goodness of every creature, to avoid any disordered use of things which would be in contempt of the Creator and would bring disastrous consequences for human beings and their environment. (2501, 299, 266)

340 God wills the interdependence of creatures. The sun and the moon, the cedar and the little flower, the eagle and the sparrow: the spectacle of their countless diversities and inequalities tells us that no creature is self-sufficient. Creatures exist only in dependence on each other, to complete each other, in the service of each other. (1937) 341 The beauty of the universe: The order and harmony of the created world results from the diversity of beings and from the relationships which exist among them. Man discovers them progressively as the laws of nature. They call forth the admiration of scholars. The beauty of creation reflects the infinite beauty of the Creator and ought to inspire the respect and submission of man's intellect and will. (283, 2500)

342 The hierarchy of creatures is expressed by the order of the "six days," from the less perfect to the more perfect. God loves all his creatures 209 and takes care of each one, even the sparrow. Nevertheless, Jesus said: "You are of more value than many sparrows," or again: "Of how much more value is a man than a sheep!" 210 (310)
