Mass and Reconciliation on the First Saturday

Please join us the first Saturday of the month at 8:00am for Mass. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will follow Mass at 8:40 am. In reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary include the following elements, performed with the intention of reparation for blasphemies against the Immaculate Heart,

for at least five consecutive months:

- Confession (shortly before or after the First Saturday so long as the person receives Holy Communion in a state of grace);
- Holy Communion received on the First Saturday of each month:
- the Holy Rosary, five decades recited sometime during the day: and
- 4) meditating for 15 minutes on the Mysteries of the Rosary

IV. Sacred Vestments cont.

347. Ritual Masses are celebrated in their proper color, in white, or in a festive color; Masses for Various Needs, on the other hand, are celebrated in the color proper to the day or the time of year or in violet if they have a penitential character, for example, nos. 31, 33, or 38; Votive Masses are celebrated in the color suited to the Mass itself or even in the color proper to the day or the time of the year.

V. Other Things Intended for Church Use

- 348. Besides the sacred vessels and the sacred vestments, for which some particular material is prescribed, other furnishings that either are intended for direct liturgical use[139] or are in any other way admitted into a church should be worthy and in keeping with their particular intended purpose.
- 349. Special care must be taken to ensure that the liturgical books, particularly the Book of the Gospels and the Lectionary, which are intended for the proclamation of the Word of God and hence receive special veneration, are to be in a liturgical action truly signs and symbols of higher realities and hence should be truly worthy, dignified, and beautiful.
- 350. Furthermore, every care is to be taken with respect to those things directly associated with the altar and the celebration of the Eucharist, for example, the altar cross and the cross carried in procession.
- 351. Every effort should be made, even in minor matters, to observe appropriately the requirements of art and to ensure that a noble simplicity is combined with elegance.

IV. Las vestiduras litúrgicas cont.

347. En las Misas rituales se emplea el color propio, o blanco o festivo; en las Misas para diversas necesidades, el color propio del día o del tiempo, o el color morado, si expresan índole penitencial (por ejemplo las Misas 31, 33, 38); y en las Misas votivas, el color conveniente a la Misa celebrada o el color propio del día o del tiempo.

V. Otras cosas destinadas al uso de la iglesia

- 348. Además de los vasos sagrados y de las vestiduras litúrgicas, para los que se determina un material concreto, todas las otras cosas que se destinan o al mismo uso litúrgico [140] o de alguna otra manera a la iglesia, sean dignas y aptas según la propia finalidad de cada una.
- 349. Se debe procurar de manera particular que los libros litúrgicos, sobre todo el Evangeliario y el Leccionario, que se destinan a la proclamación de la Palabra de Dios y por eso gozan de una particular veneración, sean en la acción litúrgica realmente signos y símbolos de las realidades sobrenaturales y por lo tanto verdaderamente dignos, decorosos y bellos. 350. Además, se deben cuidar con esmero los objetos relacionados directamente con el altar y con la celebración eucarística, como por ejemplo, la cruz del altar y la cruz que se lleva en la procesión.
- 351. Hágase un serio esfuerzo para que, aun en cosas de menor importancia, se tengan en cuenta las exigencias del arte y queden integradas la noble sencillez y la limpieza.

343 Man is the summit of the Creator's work, as the inspired account expresses by clearly distinguishing the creation of man from that of the other creatures.211 (355)

344 There is a solidarity among all creatures arising from the fact that all have the same Creator and are all ordered to his glory: (293, 1939, 2416, 1218)

May you be praised, O Lord, in all your creatures, especially brother sun, by whom you give us light for the day; he is beautiful, radiating great splendor, and offering us a symbol of you, the Most High.... May you be praised, my Lord, for sister water, who is very useful and humble, precious and chaste.... 345 The sabbath—the end of the work of the six days. The sacred text says that "on the seventh day God finished his work which he had done," that the "heavens and the earth were finished," and that God "rested" on this day and sanctified and blessed it.213 These inspired words are rich in profitable instruction: (2168)

In creation God laid a foundation and established laws that remain firm, on which the believer can rely with confidence, for they are the sign and pledge of the unshakeable faithfulness of God's covenant.214 For his part man must remain faithful to this foundation and respect the laws which the Creator has written into it.
