

Chapter VII: The Choice of the Mass and Its Parts

352. The pastoral effectiveness of a celebration will be greatly increased if the texts of the readings, the prayers, and the liturgical chants correspond as aptly as possible to the needs, the preparation, and the culture of the participants. This will be achieved by appropriate use of the many possibilities of choice described below.

Hence in arranging the celebration of Mass, the Priest should be attentive rather to the common spiritual good of the People of God than to his own inclinations. He should also remember that choices of this kind are to be made in harmony with those who exercise some part in the celebration, including the faithful, as regards the parts that more directly pertain to them.

Since, indeed, many possibilities are provided for choosing the different parts of the Mass, it is necessary for the Deacon, the readers, the psalmist, the cantor, the commentator, and the choir to know properly before the celebration the texts that concern each and that are to be used, and it is necessary that nothing be in any sense improvised. For harmonious ordering and carrying out of the rites will greatly help in disposing the faithful for participation in the Eucharist.

I. The Choice of Mass

353. On Solemnities the Priest is obliged to follow the Calendar of the church where he is celebrating.

354. On Sundays, on the weekdays during Advent, Christmas Time, Lent, and Easter Time, on Feasts, and on Obligatory Memorials:

- a) If Mass is celebrated with the people, the Priest should follow the Calendar of the church where he is celebrating;
- b) If Mass is celebrated with the participation of one minister only, the Priest may choose either the Calendar of the church or his proper Calendar.

Capítulo VII: Elección de la Misa y sus partes

352. La eficacia pastoral de la celebración aumentará, sin duda, si los textos de las lecturas, de las oraciones y de los cantos responden adecuadamente, dentro de lo que cabe, a las necesidades y a la preparación espiritual y modo de ser de quienes participan en el culto. Esto se obtendrá adecuadamente utilizando oportunamente la amplia libertad de elección que en seguida se describe.

El sacerdote, por consiguiente, al preparar la Misa, mirará más al bien espiritual común del pueblo de Dios que a sus preferencias personales. Tenga además presente que una elección de este tipo estará bien hacerla de común acuerdo con los que habrán de desempeñar alguna función en la celebración, sin excluir a los mismos fieles en la parte que a ellos más directamente corresponde.

Y puesto que las combinaciones elegibles son tan diversas, es menester que antes de la celebración el diácono, los lectores, el salmista, el cantor, el comentarista y el coro, cada uno por su parte, sepa claramente qué textos le corresponden, y nada se deje a la improvisación. En efecto, la armónica sucesión y ejecución de los ritos contribuye en gran manera a disponer el espíritu de los fieles a la participación eucarística.

I. Elección de la Misa

353. En las solemnidades el sacerdote está obligado a seguir el calendario de la iglesia en que celebra.

354. En los domingos, en las ferias de Adviento, Navidad, Cuaresma y Pascua, en las fiestas y memorias obligatorias: a) si la Misa se celebra con participación del pueblo, el sacerdote debe seguir el calendario de la iglesia en que celebra;

b) si la Misa se celebra sólo con un ministro, el sacerdote puede elegir o el calendario de la iglesia o su calendario propio.

CCC - Paragraph 5. Heaven and Earth

- Creation was fashioned with a view to the sabbath and therefore for the worship and adoration of God. Worship is inscribed in the order of creation.215 As the rule of St. Benedict says, nothing should take precedence over "the work of God," that is, solemn worship.216 This indicates the right order of human concerns. (1145-1152)
- The sabbath is at the heart of Israel's law. To keep the commandments is to correspond to the wisdom and the will of God as expressed in his work of creation. (2172)
- The eighth day. But for us a new day has dawned: the day of Christ's Resurrection. The seventh day completes the first creation. The eighth day begins the new creation. Thus, the work of creation culminates in the greater work of redemption. The first creation finds its meaning and its summit in the new creation in Christ, the splendor of which surpasses that of the first creation.217 (2174, 1046)

IN BRIEF

- Angels are spiritual creatures who glorify God without ceasing and who serve his saving plans for other creatures: "The angels work together for the benefit of us all" (St. Thomas Aguinas, STh I, 114, 3, ad 3).
- 351 The angels surround Christ their Lord. They serve him especially in the accomplishment of his saving mission to men.
- The Church venerates the angels who help her on her earthly pilgrimage and protect every human being.
- God willed the diversity of his creatures and their own particular goodness, their interdependence, and their order. He destined all material creatures for the good of the human race. Man, and through him all creation, is destined for the glory of God.
- Respect for laws inscribed in creation and the relations which derive from the nature of things is a principle of wisdom and a foundation for morality.
