

From the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM)



The Orations

363. In any Mass the orations proper to that Mass are used, unless otherwise noted.

On Memorials of Saints, the proper Collect is said or, if this is lacking, one from an appropriate Common. As to the Prayer over the Offerings and the Prayer after Communion, unless these are proper, they may be taken either from the Common or from the weekday of the current time of year.

On the weekdays in Ordinary Time, however, besides the orations from the previous Sunday, orations from another Sunday in Ordinary Time may be used, or one of the Prayers for Various Needs provided in the Missal. However, it shall always be permissible to use from these Masses the Collect alone.

In this way a richer collection of texts is provided, by which the prayer life of the faithful is more abundantly nourished.

However, during the more important times of the year, provision has already been made for this by means of the orations proper to these times of the year that exist for each weekday in the Missal.

De la Instrucción General del Misal Romano (IGMR)

Oraciones

363. En cualquier Misa, mientras no se indique lo contrario, se dicen las oraciones propias de esa Misa.

En las memorias de los santos se dice la colecta propia o, si carece de ella, la del Común que le corresponde; en cambio las oraciones sobre las ofrendas y la oración después de la Comunión, si no existe una fórmula propia, se pueden tomar o del Común o de la feria del tiempo correspondiente.

En los días feriales del Tiempo Ordinario, además de las oraciones del domingo precedente, se pueden tomar las de cualquier otro domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, o las de alguna de las Misas para diversas necesidades que se encuentran en el Misal. Siempre está permitido tomar de esas Misas únicamente la oración colecta.

De este modo se provee una mayor abundancia de textos, con los que la oración de los fieles se nutre más abundantemente.

Con todo, en los tiempos más importantes del año, esta acomodación ya está prácticamente hecha en las oraciones que se señalan para cada día en el Misal.

<u>Confirmation</u> - Any adult who has not made their Confirmation and would like to do so and or any other sacraments after baptism.

Equality and difference willed by God cont.

370 In no way is God in man's image. He is neither man nor woman. God is pure spirit in which there is no place for the difference between the sexes. But the respective "perfections" of man and woman reflect something of the infinite perfection of God: those of a mother and those of a father and husband.241 (42, 239)

"Each for the other" — "A unity in two"

- 371 God created man and woman together and willed each for the other. The Word of God gives us to understand this through various features of the sacred text. "It is not good that the man should be alone. I will make him a helper fit for him." 242 None of the animals can be man's partner. 243 The woman God "fashions" from the man's rib and brings to him elicits on the man's part a cry of wonder, an exclamation of love and communion: "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh." 244 Man discovers woman as another "I," sharing the same humanity. (1605)
- Man and woman were made "for each other" not that God left them half-made and incomplete: he created them to be a communion of persons, in which each can be "helpmate" to the other, for they are equal as persons ("bone of my bones...") and complementary as masculine and feminine. In marriage God unites them in such a way that, by forming "one flesh,"245 they can transmit human life: "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth."246 By transmitting human life to their descendants, man and woman as spouses and parents cooperate in a unique way in the Creator's work.247 (1652, 2366)
- 373 In God's plan man and woman have the vocation of "subduing" the earth248 as stewards of God. This sovereignty is not to be an arbitrary and destructive domination. God calls man and woman, made in the image of the Creator "who loves everything that exists,"249 to share in his providence toward other creatures; hence their responsibility for the world God has entrusted to them. (307, 2415)
