From the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM)



The Eucharistic Prayer

364. The numerous Prefaces with which the Roman Missal is endowed have as their purpose to bring out more fully the motives for thanksgiving within the Eucharistic Prayer and to set out more clearly the different facets of the mystery of salvation.

365. The choice between the Eucharistic Prayers found in the Order of Mass is suitably guided by the following norms:

- a) Eucharistic Prayer I, or the Roman Canon, which may always be used, is especially suited for use on days to which a proper text for the Communicantes (In communion with those whose memory we venerate) is assigned or in Masses endowed with a proper form of the Hanc igitur (Therefore, Lord, we pray) and also in the celebrations of the Apostles and of the Saints mentioned in the Prayer itself; likewise it is especially suited for use on Sundays, unless for pastoral reasons Eucharistic Prayer III is preferred.
- b) Eucharistic Prayer II, on account of its particular features, is more appropriately used on weekdays or in special circumstances. Although it is provided with its own Preface, it may also be used with other Prefaces, especially those that sum up the mystery of salvation, for example, the Common Prefaces. When Mass is celebrated for a particular deceased person, the special formula given may be used at the proper point, namely, before the part Remember also our brothers and sisters.
- c) Eucharistic Prayer III may be said with any Preface. Its use should be preferred on Sundays and festive days. If, however, this Eucharistic Prayer is used in Masses for the Dead, the special formula for a deceased person may be used, to be included at the proper place, namely after the words: in your compassion, O merciful Father, gather to yourself all your children scattered throughout the world.
- d) Eucharistic Prayer IV has an invariable Preface and gives a fuller summary of salvation history. It may be used when a Mass has no Preface of its own and on Sundays in Ordinary Time. On account of its structure, no special formula for a deceased person may be inserted into this prayer.

De la Instrucción General del Misal Romano (IGMR)

Plegaria eucarística

364. La mayor parte de los prefacios con que ha sido enriquecido el Misal Romano miran a que los motivos de la acción de gracias brillen en la Plegaria eucarística con mayor plenitud y a que los diversos aspectos del misterio de salvación se vayan exponiendo con más claridad.

365. Es conveniente que la elección de una u otra de las Plegarias eucarísticas, que se encuentran en el Ordinario de la Misa, se rija oportunamente por estas normas:

- a) La Plegaria eucarística I, o Canon Romano, que se puede emplear siempre, se dirá más oportunamente en los días que tienen Reunidos en comunión propio o en las Misas que tienen también su propio Acepta, Señor, en tu bondad; también en las fiestas de los Apóstoles y de los santos que se mencionan en la misma Plegaria; de igual modo los domingos, a no ser que por motivos pastorales se prefiera la Plegaria eucarística III.
- b) La Plegaria eucarística II, por sus mismas características, se emplea mejor en los días ordinarios de entre semana, o en particulares circunstancias. Aunque tiene su prefacio propio, puede también usarse con prefacios distintos, sobre todo con los que presentan en forma más resumida el misterio de la salvación, por ejemplo, con los prefacios comunes. Cuando la Misa se celebra por un determinado difunto, se puede emplear una fórmula particular, que figura ya en su respectivo lugar, antes del Acuérdate también.
- c) La Plegaria eucarística III puede usarse con cualquier prefacio. Su uso se recomienda los domingos y las fiestas. Pero si esta Plegaria se emplea en las Misas por los difuntos, puede utilizarse una fórmula particular para el difunto, que debe introducirse en su respectivo lugar, es decir, después de Reúne en torno a ti, Padre misericordioso, a todos tus hijos dispersos por el mundo.
- d) La Plegaria eucarística IV tiene un prefacio fijo y da un sumario más completo de la Historia de la Salvación. Se puede emplear cuando la Misa no tiene prefacio propio, y en los domingos del Tiempo Ordinario. En esta Plegaria, por razón de su propia estructura, no se puede introducer una fórmula especial por un difunto.

<u>Confirmation</u> - Any adult who has not made their Confirmation and would like to do so and or any other sacraments after baptism.

CCC - Paragraph 6. Man—IV. Man in Paradise

- 374 The first man was not only created good, but was also established in friendship with his Creator and in harmony with himself and with the creation around him, in a state that would be surpassed only by the glory of the new creation in Christ. (54)
- 375 The Church, interpreting the symbolism of biblical language in an authentic way, in the light of the New Testament and Tradition, teaches that our first parents, Adam and Eve, were constituted in an original "state of holiness and justice." 250 This grace of original holiness was "to share in... divine life." 251 (1997)"
- 376 By the radiance of this grace all dimensions of man's life were confirmed. As long as he remained in the divine intimacy, man would not have to suffer or die.252 The inner harmony of the human person, the harmony between man and woman,253 and finally the harmony between the first couple and all creation, comprised the state called "original justice." (1008, 1502)
- 377 The "mastery" over the world that God offered man from the beginning was realized above all within man himself: mastery of self. The first man was unimpaired and ordered in his whole being because he was free from the triple concupiscence254 that subjugates him to the pleasures of the senses, covetousness for earthly goods, and self-assertion, contrary to the dictates of reason. (2514)
- 378 The sign of man's familiarity with God is that God places him in the garden.255 There he lives "to till it and keep it." Work is not yet a burden,256 but rather the collaboration of man and woman with God in perfecting the visible creation. (2415, 2427)
- 379 This entire harmony of original justice, foreseen for man in God's plan, will be lost by the sin of our first parents.
