


At the Resurrection of Jesus, it is the same spirit that will descend upon the disciples to manifest His love to all the world.


En la resurrección de Jesús, es el mismo espíritu que descenderá sobre los discípulos para manifestar su amor a todo el mundo.

8 (Spiritual) New Year's Resolutions for Catholics

January is here again, and it's time to make our annual New Year's resolutions. Every Catholic should add to their list a few spiritual resolutions designed to help them climb that mountain of faith! Let the freshness of a new year be your impetus to make new strides in your walk with God. There is no time like the present!

Here are some ideas.

1. Increase Your Marian Devotion

In this most prophetic of all Marian apparitions, Our Lady of Fatima made urgent pleas for mankind to reform themselves and to pray her rosary daily. She also gave other grave messages and warnings with dire consequences for the entire world. Her messages were authenticated on October 13, 1917 with an undisputed public miracle of biblical proportions, during which an estimated 70,000 people were gathered to witness what became known as the Miracle of the Sun.

2. Make more time for spiritual reading

The brilliant St. Athanasius once said,

"You will not see anyone who is striving after his advancement who is not given to spiritual reading. And as to him who neglects it, the fact will soon be observed in his (lack of) progress."

If you want to make progress in your walk with God in the new year, spiritual reading should be high on your list.

The time you spend feeding your soul is time better spent.

3. Make good stewardship a lifestyle

This boils down to one key concept in the life of the Christian: practicing good stewardship over the gifts God has given us. Good stewardship means good management of our "time, talent, and treasure" for the greater glory of God. As Jesus warned us in His parables, all of His servants will be judged on how they used the graces he gave them. Do we neglect them and spend them selfishly, or are we generous in building up God's kingdom on earth?

4. Share your Catholic faith with others

With so many people far away from God today (and more and more people noticing it), the culture is ripe for evangelism. There is a real hunger for God and his Truth.

Modern Catholics aren't usually great about sharing their faith with others, but this is something that can change with practice. You don't have to be obnoxious or overbearing about your faith—just focus on doing simple things, such as being joyful in your walk with Christ and inviting people to come to Mass with you.

5. Bring back regular penances

Living a penitential life, even outside of Advent and Lent, is the Catholic way of life. All of the Church's saints performed penances habitually, either internally or externally, great and small, for themselves and for others.

Many Catholics do not know that Fridays outside of Lent are also days of abstinence and fasting. While the Church law against eating meat on the Fridays outside of Lent was altered by the U.S. bishops—meaning, it can be substituted with some other form of penance—it was never removed entirely.

6. Go an extra day to Mass

Mass is not only the source and summit of our faith—it is also the source and summit of our very life.

This new year, think of ways you can arrange your schedule and activities so that you can make it to Mass either an extra day each week, or a few extra days a month. If you have trouble with this due to a packed schedule, pray and ask Our Lord to help you find the time.

7. Pray the rosary

No Catholic list of New Year's resolutions would be complete without a daily rosary added in. If you already pray the rosary daily, that is fantastic. Your resolution can then be to spread devotion to the rosary this year.

8. Pick a new saint buddy

Why not take on the tradition of choosing a different Catholic saint as a special patron each year? There are so many of them with unique graces to bestow.

Pray about your New Year and the goals you have for your spiritual life, your family, your relationships, your career, etc. Then choose a patron saint whose virtues you would like to emulate in New Year, and entrust your year to their special intercession. How To Bless Your Home For The New Year

It is a powerful blessing that lasts the whole year



Each year around or after the feast of the Epiphany many parishes throughout the world participate in an annual blessing of homes. It is an ancient tradition that not only places God at the entrance of your home, it places your entire family under his protection.

It is a beautiful blessing and tradition, one that brings many graces upon those who practice it in faith and is an added protection against any spiritual enemies that may be lurking around. (If you're able to do it with blessed chalk, all the better.) Start this New Year by dedicating it to God from the outset, by asking His blessing on your home and on all who live, work, or visit there.

Blessing For The Home

The blessing can be led by an elder of the home.

May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is your incarnate Word, now and forever. Amen.

God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten One to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Saviour. Amen.

Loving God, bless this household. May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness, and abiding in your will. We ask this through Christ our Saviour. Amen.

After the prayer is recited, each room of the home is sprinkled with Holy water, and if possible, incensed. Then the elder marks with chalk (inside the home, above or upon the entry doors) the decade, followed by the initials of the Magi (C,M,B), followed by the current year, with crosses between each element. **Example:** 20 + C + M + B + 22. (*Note: The initials C,M,B can also be interpreted as the Latin phrase "Christus Mansionem Benedicat"*, which means "Christ Bless this House".)



Participants will assemble at the Knights of Columbus Council 5357 Hall at 7:45AM on Saturday, Jan. 15th. The bus will leave by no later than 8:30ÅM. Coffee and pastries will be provided at the Council Hall, which is located at:
