March For Life

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." - Jn 2:1-3

My Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ,

For the past several Sundays, we celebrated several manifestations of God to humanity (theophany). At Epiphany, God revealed himself to the Gentiles; at Baptism – God's Trinitarian nature and Jesus' identity as the Son of God; and in the miracle at Cana – Jesus' divinity and omnipotence. Through these epiphanies, God draws us closer to himself through his beloved Son. Furthermore, our readings this Sunday point us to God's love and fidelity, especially in times of outward desolation and abandonment.


In the First Reading, Isaiah uses spousal language to describe God's love for his people. Isaiah foretells God's salvation of Jerusalem after the return of the Babylonian exiles and sees it as a wedding between God and Jerusalem. Jesus' first public miracle of providing wine for the wedding feast in Cana signifies the fulfillment of this prophecy. In the Second Reading, St. Paul tells us that Jesus pours out the new wine through the gifts of the Holy Spirit, given to his bride, the Church.

In our Gospel, John describes the first of seven "signs" by which Jesus reveals his divinity. Jesus and Mary were invited to a wedding feast in Cana. When the wine ran short, Mary knew Jesus can do the impossible. Her faith drew her to Jesus, and Jesus cannot refuse her request. Mary the Mother of God, and our mother, is a powerful intercessor before God. Let us listen to Mary's final instruction as recorded in the New Testament: "Do whatever he tells you." Mary will always bring us to Jesus.

In the miracle at Cana, we are invited to fill the lives of those around us with the new wine of love and mercy. Let us be sensitive and responsive to the needs of others. Let us also remember the daily miracles of God's providence in our lives, especially the miracle of the Real Presence of the Lord in the Eucharist, where God transforms our gifts of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of his Son.

May the Lord transform our desolation into celebration. May we invite Jesus and Mary into our lives and in all our undertakings. And may Mary always intercede for our families.

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

Durante los últimos domingos, celebramos varias manifestaciones de Dios a la humanidad (teofanía). En la Epifanía, Dios se reveló a los gentiles; en el bautismo - la naturaleza trinitaria de Dios y la identidad de Jesús como el Hijo de Dios; y en el milagro de Caná, la divinidad y omnipotencia de Jesús. A través de estas epifanías, Dios nos acerca a sí mismo a través de su Hijo amado. Ade-

más, nuestras lecturas de este domingo nos señalan el amor y la fidelidad de Dios, especialmente en tiempos de desolación y abandono exterior.


En la primera lectura, Isaías usa el lenguaje conyugal para describir el amor de Dios por su pueblo. Isaías predice la salvación de Jerusalén por parte de Dios después del regreso de los exiliados babilónicos y lo ve como una boda entre Dios y Jerusalén. El primer milagro público de Jesús de proporcionar vino para las bodas de Caná significa el cumplimiento de esta profecía. En la segunda lectura, San Pablo nos dice que Jesús derrama el vino nuevo a través de los dones del Espíritu Santo, dados a su esposa, la Iglesia.

En nuestro Evangelio, Juan describe la primera de las siete "señales" por las que Jesús revela su divinidad. Jesús y María fueron invitados a una fiesta de bodas en Caná. Cuando se acabó el vino, María supo que Jesús podía hacer lo imposible. Su fe la atrajo a Jesús, y Jesús no puede rechazar su pedido. María, la Madre de Dios, y madre nuestra, es una poderosa intercesora ante Dios. Escuchemos la última instrucción de María registrada en el Nuevo Testamento: "Haz lo que él te diga". María siempre nos llevará a Jesús.

En el milagro de Caná, se nos invita a llenar la vida de quienes nos rodean con el vino nuevo del amor y la misericordia. Seamos sensibles y respondamos a las necesidades de los demás. Recordemos también los milagros diarios de la providencia de Dios en nuestras vidas, especialmente el milagro de la Presencia Real del Señor en la Eucaristía, donde Dios transforma nuestros dones de pan y vino en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de su Hijo.

Que el Señor transforme nuestra desolación en celebración. Invitemos a Jesús y María a nuestra vida y a todas nuestras empresas. Y que María interceda siempre por nuestras familias.

#### **Saint Charles of Sezze**



October 19, 1613 - January 6, 1670

Charles thought that God was calling him to be a missionary in India, but he never got there. God had something better for this 17th-century successor to Brother Juniper.

Born in Sezze, southeast of Rome, Charles was inspired by the lives of Salvator Horta and Paschal Baylon to become a Franciscan; he did that in 1635. Charles tells us in his autobiography, "Our Lord put in my heart a determination to become a lay brother with a great desire to be poor and to beg alms for his love."

Charles served as cook, porter, sacristan, gardener and beggar at various friaries in Italy. In some ways, he was "an accident waiting to happen." He once started a huge fire in the kitchen when the oil in which he was frying onions burst into flames.

One story shows how thoroughly Charles adopted the spirit of Saint Francis. The superior ordered Charles—then porter—to give food only to traveling friars who came to the door. Charles obeyed this direction; simultaneously the alms to the friars decreased. Charles convinced the superior the two facts were related. When the friars resumed giving goods to all who asked at the door, alms to the friars increased also.

At the direction of his confessor, Charles wrote his autobiography, The Grandeurs of the Mercies of God. He also wrote several other spiritual books. He made good use of his various spiritual directors throughout the years; they helped him discern which of Charles' ideas or ambitions were from God. Charles himself was sought out for spiritual advice. The dying Pope Clement IX called Charles to his bedside for a blessing.

Charles had a firm sense of God's providence. Father Severino Gori has said, "By word and example he recalled in all the need of pursuing only that which is eternal" (Leonard Perotti, St. Charles of Sezze: An Autobiography, page 215).

He died at San Francesco a Ripa in Rome and was buried there. Pope John XXIII canonized him in 1959.




