My Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ,

Pray that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

The holidays are a time to celebrate with family and friends, but its significance has gone deeper for me as I welcomed the New Year of 2022. Following the Feast of the Holy Family, I tested positive for Covid-19. Observing the protocols, I had to physically distance myself from those at work as well as home.

For the first time in my 31 years of priesthood, I was unable to celebrate Mass with those whom I am called to serve. Even after ten days of quarantine, I still have to keep in mind those whose health may be compromised if I am around. There are days when I believed all was well, only to experience fatigue right after. 'Tis a time of deep faith and trust as I reflect more on the meaning of St. John's words: "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us" (John 1:14).

This evening, I came across a sermon by Bishop Barron on "Priests, Prophets, and Kings" and its significance to the recent Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. How thankful I am for our parish community as we continue to fulfill our mission as baptized members of Christ's "priestly people" (cf. 1 Peter 2:9), despite the challenges and setbacks of the ongoing pandemic.

I wish to extend my heartfelt thanks to Fr. Ken, our dedicated staff, volunteers, and parishioners who are continually at work in the vineyard of the Lord, bringing forth the fruits of the Kingdom of God for all.

The Sacrament of Baptism has indeed initiated us into a life of intimacy with Christ through prayer, worship, spiritual formation, discipleship and service. It has often been said, a family that prays together stays together and keeps Christ present in their midst (cf. Matthew 18:20). Let us continue to pray and worship together as one family (priestly mission), teach our children to proclaim Christ through words and actions (prophetic mission), and be good stewards of the gifts that the Holy Spirit has bestowed upon us (kingly mission).

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.



Saint Blaise

We know more about the devotion to Saint Blaise by Christians around the world than we know about the saint himself. His feast is observed as a holy day in some Eastern Churches. In 1222, the Council of Oxford prohibited servile labor in England on Blaise's feast day. The Germans and Slavs hold him in special honor, and for decades many United States Catholics have sought the annual Saint Blaise blessing for their throats.



We know that Bishop Blaise was martyred in his episcopal city of Sebastea, Armenia, in 316. The legendary Acts of St. Blaise were written 400 years later. According to them Blaise was a good bishop, working hard to encourage the spiritual and physical health of his people. Although the Edict of Toleration (311), granting freedom of worship in the Roman Empire, was already five years old, persecution still raged in Armenia. Blaise was apparently forced to flee to the back country. There he lived as a hermit in solitude and prayer, but he made friends with the wild animals. One day a group of hunters seeking wild animals for the amphitheater stumbled upon Blaise's cave. They were first surprised and then frightened. The bishop was kneeling in prayer surrounded by patiently waiting wolves, lions and bears.

The legend has it that as the hunters hauled Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command the child was able to cough up the

Agricolaus, governor of Cappadocia, tried to persuade Blaise to sacrifice to pagan idols. The first time Blaise refused, he was beaten. The next time he was suspended from a tree and his flesh torn with iron combs or rakes. Finally, he was beheaded.

Four centuries give ample opportunity for fiction to creep in with fact. Who can be sure how accurate Blaise's biographer was? But biographical details are not essential. Blaise is seen as one more example of the power those have who give themselves entirely to Jesus. As Jesus told his apostles at the Last Supper, "If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you" (John 15:7). With faith we can follow the lead of the Church in asking for Blaise's protection.

The Feast of the Presentation



The various names, meanings, and traditions overlapping in today's Feast churn like the crystals in a kaleidoscope, revealing one image and then another with every slight rotation of the tube. The Presentation of the Lord in the Temple is, rotate, also the *Purification of* Mary. But, rotate, it's also

known as the Meeting of the Lord in the Christian East. And, rotate, it's also the Feast of Candlemas, marking forty days after Christmas, the end of that liturgical season. The multiple names and meanings of today's Feast have given birth to surprisingly broad and varied cultural expressions. The biblical account of the Presentation is the source for the "two turtle doves" in the carol "The Twelve Days of Christmas," for the sword piercing Mary's Immaculate Heart in Catholic iconography, for the Fourth Joyful Mystery of the rosary, and for the Canticle prayed by all the world's priests and nuns every single night of their lives. The Presentation is even the remote source of the frivolous American folkloric tradition of Groundhog Day.

Behind all of these names and meanings are, however, a few fundamental theological facts worth reflecting upon. The Lord Jesus Christ, forty days after His birth, in keeping with the biblical significance of the number forty and with Jewish custom, was presented in the temple in Jerusalem by His parents, Mary and Joseph. Saint Luke's Gospel recounts the story. After the Presentation, Jesus was to enter the temple again as a boy and later as an adult. He would even refer to His own body as a temple which He would raise up in three days. Jesus's life was a continual self-gift to God the Father from the very beginning to the very end. His parents did not carry their infant Son to a holy mountain, a sacred spring, or a magical forest. It was in His temple that the God of Israel was most present, so they brought their son to God Himself, not just to a reflection of Him in nature. (Excerpt from "My Catholic Life")

Did You Know...

Christ is the light of the nations, hence the blessing and procession of candles on this day. Many Catholics practice the tradition of keeping out the Nativity creche or other Christmas decorations until this feast. A Candlelight Procession usually marks this feast.



Things You Can Do:

- Ask a priest to bless the candles that you will use on your home altar this year.
- Have a family Candlemas procession.
- Read Luke 2:22-35 (about the presentation), including the Canticle of Simeon.
- Meditate on the constant fiat of Our Lady of Sorrows, who embraced the will of God even as Simeon predicted that a sword would pierce her heart.


