FATHER MICHAEL'S RAMBLINGS

ay the grace and peace of our loving God be in each of your hearts and lives. Praying that on this Pentecost Sunday, the Holy Spirit will fill us with the love and presence of God.

We are approaching the end of the Easter Season. Pentecost Sunday spells the end of our Easter journey and the beginning of Ordinary Time on our liturgical calendar. Our liturgical color changes from purple to green.

As many of you are aware, the Diocese of Venice recently lifted the requirement to wear face coverings and to distance while attending Mass. Some of us were surprised by the unexpected announcement. I received the following email from one of our parishioners – who is a physician.

On May 13, the Center for Disease Control and Prevention updated guidance for vaccinated individuals with regards to face masks and social distancing. Under that new guidance, those who are fully vaccinated are no longer required to wear masks or physically distance except where required by law. In accordance with the new CDC guidance and effective immediately, masks and distancing will no longer be required at Mass in the Diocese of Venice. Masks remain encouraged and certainly permitted, particularly for those who are not yet vaccinated. Masks will no longer be required for Parish group activities or other Parish gatherings.

The CDC stated that fully vaccinated individuals have the option not to wear masks in most settings. However, unvaccinated individuals STILL need to observe safety protocols such as face covering, social distancing, etc in most settings. Of course, all of this relies on the honesty of those who are truly vaccinated and those who are not...

I'm sure there are many other parishioners who have the same concern as I do for clarification on safety measures when attending Masses. We are STILL in a pandemic where the variant strains, which are more contagious, are circulating. We have not reached herd immunity. The unvaccinated ones are still at risk...

While we are happy that things appear to be improving across our nation, we must still remain attentive. As the above letter indicates, unvaccinated individuals still need to observe safety protocols such as face covering and distancing. But all of this relies on the honesty and integrity of those who are truly vaccinated and those who are not.

In our effort to keep everyone safe, our Extra-ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will continue wearing face masks while distributing Holy Communion. They will also sanitize their hands before and after distributing Holy Communion.

These are stressful and difficult times for all of us. Please, let us help each other to get through this pandemic in safety.

Wishing everyone a blessed Pentecost Sunday.

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings in the Risen Lord! As Holy Mother Church approaches the Solemnity of Pentecost, it is my prayer that you, the Faithful of the Diocese of Venice, may be filled with the graces of the Holy Spirit.

With this letter, I wish to address the face covering and distancing policy at Mass and Parish gatherings in the Diocese of Venice. As you are aware, on May 13, 2021, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention provided updated guidance for vaccinated individuals with regards to face masks and distancing. Under the new guidance, those who are fully vaccinated are no longer required to wear masks or physically distance except where required by law.

In accordance with the new CDC guidance and effective immediately, masks and distancing will no longer be required at Mass in the Diocese of Venice. Masks remain encouraged and certainly permitted, particularly for those who are not yet vaccinated. Masks will no longer be required for Parish group activities or other Parish gatherings.

For those who have children in a Catholic School or Parish religious education program, and due to only recent age eligibility for vaccines for some of these age groups, the CDC has said that masking is a key strategy to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in schools. Thus, for the remainder of this academic year, masks will continue to be required. This will be reviewed with the close of the school year.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we all try to live in the context of the Pandemic and to be evermore mindful of our brothers and sisters around us who may be vulnerable, for whatever reason.

This opportunity is taken to extend to you the assurances of my continued consideration, as well as my prayers for you and your family.




