




MONTHLY OVERVIEW



MEMORIAL DAY

REMEMBER AND HONOR

When we think of Memorial Day we often think of three-day weekends, barbecues, family gatherings and mattress sales. But in fact, Memorial Day is supposed to be a solemn occasion. It is a federal U.S. holiday observed to honor and mourn military personnel who have died in the performance of duties while serving in the U.S. Armed Forces.

There are many misconceptions about this holiday and how we should or should not behave or “celebrate.” We should not wish people a “Happy” Memorial Day. It is not a joyous occasion. Nor should we thank our current troops on Memorial Day or ignore the significance of the day. A proper way to observe Memorial Day would be to attend a ceremony such as those at Patriot Plaza in Sarasota National Cemetery, administered by the U.S. Department of Veteran’s Affairs. if you don't fully understand the doctrine of the Holy Trinity, don't beat yourself up. You are hardly alone in having a difficult time grasping the concept of one God existing in three Persons—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. But as Christians, this is precisely what we believe—that these three are one God, having the same nature, distinct yet acting in unity and deserving of equal praise and worship.

So why do we believe this idea that our God is one in essence yet three in Personhood, especially when the word Trinity does not appear anywhere in the Bible? The word may not be there but the concept certainly is. We can find examples of this throughout the Bible, in both the Old and New Testament. Let us recall Jesus' baptism as told in Matthew 3:13-17 where we hear the voice of the Father, the Son is baptized, and the Spirit descended like a dove. The concept itself was clearly accepted by the writers of the Bible, as they referred to the Trinity in many different ways, perhaps without even fully understanding it. But then, we know that this mystery will not be revealed to us in this life.

“God in His deepest mystery is not a solitude, but a family, since He has in Himself fatherhood, sonship, and the essence of the family, which is love.”
- Saint Pope John Paul II

The fact is that God is simply beyond all human comprehension. Theologians have studied this concept of the Trinity for centuries and still it is difficult to digest. However, if you are interested in learning more about the Holy Trinity, there are several free resources at Formed.org (our parish has a paid subscription so you can take advantage of their amazing content), and numerous books have been written on the subject. It truly is an interesting subject to delve into even knowing that we will not find a complete answer to our questions in this lifetime. The Trinity is perhaps the deepest mystery of our faith.

Anointing of the Sick—The Misunderstood Sacrament

One of the unfortunate realities in the Church today is that so few people understand the meaning and value of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, largely because so many people still mistakenly think of this sacrament as “Last Rites” or “Extreme Unction.”

In his life of ministry, Jesus healed the sick. In this sacrament, the Church

Continues the healing mission of Jesus and, in hope, prays that God will grant healing to the person who is suffering. But even if there is no physical healing, the sacrament offers spiritual healing through the Holy Spirit's gifts of peace and courage. And so, anyone who is living with serious illness (including emotional or psychological illness) and


The elderly are encouraged to celebrate this sacrament when it is needed.

The ritual for Anointing of the Sick does also include special prayers and blessings for those who are facing death, including viaticum (communion given to the dying, trusting the Lord Jesus will be their companion along the way, as they make their final journey).



God Doesn't Take a Break

An acquaintance who works in church ministry once told me a story about one of the students she had in Faith Formation. This student informed my friend that his family doesn't come to Mass in summer. "God takes a break in summer, and so do we," he said.



There's a lot to unpack here. First, it's tragic to think of anyone voluntarily missing out on the Eucharist for so long. It's also a real problem in the church today that a lot of our folks don't understand the beauty of the Sunday obligation. But if I had to dissect this situation and pinpoint the thing I find most troubling, it's the idea of God taking a break.

I hope it's starting to look like summer where you are. We've still got a few weeks left before it's official, but the school year should be winding up for most kids, the birds should be chirping a little louder, and hopefully your lawn is starting to green up nicely. You're

probably daydreaming about the annual cabin getaway weekend or water-skiing on the Fourth of July.

All in all, summer is going to be a nice break, even if—like typical Americans—our break is full of productive work.

Thank God—literally—that He doesn't take a break, even if we do. Can we try to remember that, even in the midst of our many wonderful distractions? Let's enjoy this summer. Let's live it to the full. But let's see it for the gift that it is—and remember the thanks we owe the Giver.


SCAM ALERT!!

Those who are on our Flocknote email distribution list should have received an email this past Tuesday night from Fr. Michael alerting them to a scam that has hit our parish. Several parishioners received text messages from someone posing as Fr. Michael. We can assure you that this was not Fr. Michael. The individual was requesting the purchase of gift cards to provide to cancer patients in the hospital. Please know that neither Fr. Michael nor anyone from the parish office would ever ask for you to purchase anything on

our behalf. This scam is not new. It has been happening at several parishes in the area and the police are unable to trace these texts back to a specific person. So please, do not send anything and do not provide personal information to anyone claiming to be from our parish unless you verify their identity. If you receive a questionable text asking for money or gift cards, delete it. If you aren't certain whether you have received a legitimate text, feel free to contact the parish office for verification. Thank you and stay safe.

Why are Catholic and Protestant Bibles different?

Since the earliest days of the Church, Christians used a Greek translation of the Old Testament known as the Septuagint. This collection of the texts of the Hebrew Scriptures included 46 books. At the time of the Protestant Reformation in the 1500s, the Protestant reformers began to create their own translations of the Bible (into local languages) and some began to question why the Jewish Scriptures would have included texts that were written in Greek, because, they assumed, the only valid Jewish Scriptures would have been written in Hebrew. And so, they decided to remove seven books from the Old Testament: Baruch, Sirach, 1 and 2 Maccabees, Tobit, Judith and Wisdom (as well as portions of the Books of Daniel and Esther). This means that the Protestant Old Testament only includes 39 books, while Catholic Bibles continue to include those original 46 books. Both Catholic and Protestant Bibles include 27 books and letters in the New Testament.


